ance, it diminishes the regard due to the sanctity of mind. It is a punishment of no less value. In times of tumult and civil dissension—and we know not how soon such scenes may occur—it is liable to be perverted to the destruction not only of innocent, but of valuable lives, to gratify political revenge, to serve the purposes of depraved ambition, and, lastly, it often produces impunity of crime from the natural horror which is felt when the passions are not excited, to become instrumental to the violent death of a fellow creature, and thus it defeats the end of *abolition*, which is—not the infliction of personal evil, but—the *repression of crime*.

Experimental proofs of the inefficacy of capital punishments might be adduced to a great extent, would the limits of these remarks permit. Our own times afford a practical testimony against them. The criminal records prove, for instance, that ere has been

upon the subject, having as you well know employed myself among the Coal Mines - for the last four years.

The length of the Grand Lake to the mouth of the Jemseg to Newcastle, is about 12 miles.—Coals have never been discovered beyond seven miles from the head of the Lake to 14 miles from the entrance by the Jemseg and all the creeks and estuaries above Cox's point, coals exist; but there are situations, where the locality of the water for shipment and the bed of coal, render them very valuable for commencing works.—There have been many complaints made of Grand Lake Coal—but fair specimens have not been produced. The seams of coal that have been worked for many years past, generally speaking, have not been more than 12 or 14 feet from the surface. This nearness thereto has caused the surface water to decompose the solidity of the coal, so that the highly bituminous and sulphureous matter, when applied to a large body undergoing from the pit, will cause it to shatter into powder and, if oxidized from
