Drug Trade Board Says Chemical Changes in Medicine Man Into Modern Pharmacist.

The Drug Trade of Public Information, Madison Avenue, New York, points out why alcohol is necessary in making medicine. The great advances made in the manufacture of medicines from vegetable drugs in palatable and concentrated form have been due more to alcohol—scientifically known as ethyl alcohol and ethyl hydroxide than to any other chemical, it is asserted.

"Alcohol not only extracts the valuable ingredients from the cells of the drug, but also preserves the resulting medicinal preparations for an indefinite period," the statement says. "Water extracts, in addition to being weak in their action, spoil in a few days. Other solvents, such as vinegar and wines, were used in the earlier days of experimentation but they not only failed to extract the active material but also failed to preserve."

that we do not need such a nurse, we need one or two and perhaps more and we need them badly. We only have to look in the Vital Statistics of the town and see the great number of young babies who appear in this world and disappear after a few weeks or a few months to get the certitude that there is something wrong somewhere. Every mother feels that it is not the wish of God that her young baby be taken away from her and put in the ground at the age where the innocent creature begins to smile and stretch his little arms towards the one who gave him life.

Mothers, it is not God's desire that you should suffer in vain and that the reward of your devotion to your country should be two or three small white crosses in a corner of a graveyard. Oh no, your children are given to you to stay with you, to grow under your eyes, to help you when they are grown up to take your places when you get old and to close your eyes when it is time for you to follow the great law of nature and lay down for the endless sleep.

We often hear people say when a child dies: "This is God's will, the poor child makes one more angel in heaven." This is a blasphemy, it is not God's will but often it is the parent's neglect that causes the child's death.

I admit that in some cases the child will lose the fight in spite of all, in spite of proper care and feeding, but in the majority of cases these feeble creatures are deprived of the greatest possible gift, which is life, on account of some defects in the management of their diet and hygiene in the early life.

Parents can not always be blamed or kept responsible for what happens, Organization No. 2 at 12 v. 17 G. for the reason that they do the best they can, they do according to the best way they were told. The responsibility lays on the community which did not teach them the sciences of motherhood. There should be schools where mothers will learn how to feed their babies how to take care of them, how to prevent many diseases and there are none but the Red Cross nurse will try to remedy it.

Those who are educated and have time to read will take in the books the knowledge necessary to enable them to fulfill properly their duties of mother. Those who can hardly read or have no time to do so, are generally guided by the neighbors who have received their hygienic education from their mothers and grand mothers and God knows how hard it is for a small child to pass through the ill-treatment involuntarily given to its stomach and entire body and still live and become strong.

The Red Cross nurse is here to tell you what you should do to give your babies all the possible chances to grow, to grow strong and be in fighting condition to support the attacks of our numerous enemies called microbes or germs of disease.

In order to work properly the present nurse and those who will follow her, require help and support, she cannot work with success and authority if she is left alone, she must have some influential body to support and assist in every way and this meeting is called to elect, would say to select, those who are more willing to do good to their neighbors and fellow citizens.

I hope that this organization will be a success and that every Red Cross member present and future will make it a duty to work in sympathies with the nurse.

This is a non sectarian organization and I hope religion will be left home and have nothing to do with the Red Cross affairs; or you may adopt a new religion, the religion of saving the lives of dozens of babies who die of preventable diseases every year, adopt the religion of bringing consolation in the homes that are desolated, of bringing hope to those who despair, adopt the religion of bringing sunshine and light where darkness reigns and health where death is king.

In devoting yourselves to the Red Cross works or in helping the nurse to conduct as it should be you will save many lives, and more fortunate than the great men who had stone monuments erected in their memory, you will see around you numerous living monuments under the form of rosy happy children.

Remember that children have a God given right to live, and to deprive them of it is a crime. Remember also that nothing brings more satisfaction than being able to say to yourself when the day is over, that you made some one's day just ended, that a sick one is suffering less, that a child is feeling more comfortable and sleeps better, that someone is blessing you for the good you did to them.

MONTREAL BANDITS

MADE RICH HAUL

Montreal, March 13.—Debutants, nearly all negotiable, to the value of \$20,000 and \$300 in cash was the loot of clever robbers who broke into the premises of the Bernier Hardware Company's store 126 St. Lawrence Boulevard, this city, on Saturday night. They made a hole in the brick wall separating the premises from the next door store and blew up the safe with nitroglycerine. There was so well done that no one heard a sound and nothing in the office of the store was otherwise disturbed. Discovery of the robbery was not made until the furnace man arrived at 8:30 yesterday.

The safe, which was valued at \$1,000, was damaged beyond repair.

GASPE CASE AT QUEBEC

Important Judgement Given Settling Matter of High Water Mark Ownership.

Judgment was rendered a few days ago by the Court of Appeal, Quebec, composed of five judges, in the case of Baker vs. Couture, which was in appeal from a judgment of the Superior Court of the District of Gaspé, which will have considerable bearing upon the rights of riparian owners on the Gaspé coast.

A few years ago one Couture commenced to build a fish house opposite a property owned by Baker at Grand River. Baker claimed that where Couture built was on his. Couture claimed that where he had constructed was below high water mark. Baker replied that even if it were below high water mark, it belonged to him because this piece of land was inside of Grand River and not out in the Bay, claiming that the rights of riparian owners outside of the river is different from the rights of riparian owners on the sea.

The Superior Court at Perce maintained Baker's contention and ordered Couture to give up possession of the property. An appeal was then taken by Couture to the Court of Review of Quebec, and the Court of Review unanimously reversed the judgment of the Superior Court, deciding that where Couture had built was below high water mark, and that the lot was not in the river but out in the Bay and that Couture had the right to build there.

An appeal was taken by Baker.

FARMERS' BRANCH STORES HARD HIT

Must Provide \$90,000 for the Head Office Under Reorganization Plan.

(Fredericton Gleaner.)

More than twenty of the thirty-two branches of the Maritime United Farmers' Co-operative, Limited, will be faced by choosing between the alternatives of closing up their stores or providing considerable additional capital to carry on as a result of the reorganization plan which was adopted at the annual meeting of the shareholders here recently, according to information obtained from an official of the organization.

Not \$70,000, as was reported at the time, but a total of \$90,000 must be contributed by the branches to square up head office accounts, which is provided for by the plan, and the exact number of branch stores which will be thereby crippled financially so that they will have to either close up or secure new capital is said to be twenty-two. Local shareholders have not yet received the promised copies of the company's financial statement ordered printed and distributed by resolution passed at the annual meeting, but the official who gave the Gleaner the information as to the results of the reorganization plan is in possession of all the facts and inside information.

It is also learned that no time is to be lost in proceeding against shareholders who have failed to pay the second 50 per cent of their stock subscriptions or who still have any amount of their subscriptions outstanding. From this source, it is said, the management expect to be able to get in something like \$80,000, and it is said that the only subscribers who will be able to escape payment will be those who have failed to make any payments whatever and therefore had no actual distribution of stock made to them. The creditors, it is further said, are to continue to receive a percentage payment upon their claims against the company, as during recent months, until the reorganization has been completed and matters cleaned up.
