MAD SHE A POWER?

And Was This the Reason Sophia Was Killed?

JUST SEVENTEEN MINUTES

During Which the Murder Must Have Been Committed.

SEEN STANDING IN THE SHOP AT 4.40.

And at 9.57 Her Father Gave the Alarm.

There was a Babo Asteo upstairs in the House when the Tragedy was Enacted—A Rammer of Another Police Officer—No Trace of the Hammer—Further Evidence as to the Mole's Presence—A Fall Which Affected His Reason.

HE brick residence which stands slightly askew on the York and Vaughan roads in Fairbank village never looked more sombre than it did at daybreak yesterday 30 hours after the slaying of a woman.

It was in this store that Edward Handcock and his wife had stood for the past few days watching, not for customers, but for signs of the coming storm.

Even the village itself seems different. Go where you might the past few days you meet faces that had a queer, inquiring look; go to the shops and you hear a nervous chatter that was something apalling in the cruel death of Sophie Handcock.

That a young girl respected and admired by everybody who knew her should be murdered in a cold, deliberate manner was sufficiently horrible an affair to appeal to the stoutest heart.

Everybody is striving to add the officers of the law in order that, in spite of the hurried nature of the work of justice may fall the more surely on the wretches implicated in the infernal plot.

Sophie Was Not Alone in the House. Detective Greer again visited Fairbank yesterday and obtained some valuable additional testimony. It has already been supposed, and the statement of old man Handcock corroborated this supposition, that when Sophie was murdered she was alone in the house.

Her father, Edward Handcock, a well-to-do merchant, lives in the house. He is now in the habit of remaining with Sophie over night, and the alarm was given when he found her dead in one of the rooms upstairs.

Detective Greer will endeavor during the next few days to unravel the two links which are missing in the chain of the discovery of the father's hammer with which the crime was committed and the fact whether Sophie was engaged to be married to one of the young men who were seen in the house.

CLARKE WALLACE DENIES IT.

HE NEVER USED THE EXPRESSION CHARGED TO HIM

With Respect to a Roman Catholic Mayor for Toronto—Johnston of Ballykibbeg Also Requests Mr. Wallace to Deny the Mail's Charge That He Expressed His Willingness to Kick the Queen's Crown in the Bay.

OTTAWA, July 28.—Clarke Wallace made a personal explanation in the House this afternoon regarding a statement attributed to him by the Mail and quoted by Mr. Devlin to the effect that he bore the Queen's crown when a Roman Catholic would never make such a statement and that, referring to Mayor Clarke, he had stated that his conduct as mayor he was not ashamed of an Orange Mayor. He also corrected a statement attributed by Mr. Devlin to Mr. Johnston of Ballykibbeg that he had expressed his willingness to kick the Queen's crown in the Bay.

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AUSTRIAN CUSTOMS FRAUDS.

Numerous Arrests Made and One Official Committed Suicide.

VIENNA, July 28.—A series of wholesale customs frauds have been discovered by the Government secret service officials in the duchy of Bukovina, which borders on Hungary and Rumania. The conspiracy discovered implicates some of the highest officials of the duchy. Numbers of people have already been arrested in connection with the affair and further arrests are contemplated.

It is understood that the frauds untraced are chiefly connected with the smuggling of opium and brandy across the Austrian frontier.
