CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS

ONTARIO.

The demand for lumber is keeping up well. One of the largest manufacturers in the Ottawa valley reports that shipments so far this season have been fifty per cent. greater than for the corresponding period of 1900. Local trade has not been altogether satisfactory, owing to the strike of carpenters; but this, it is thought, is now nearing an end, and building is now likely to be quite brisk for the balance of the season. The better grades of white pine have been much inquired for and are firm in price, most of the mills being completely sold out of these grades. The mills in the Georgian Bay district are busy with shipments to Michigan and the eastern states, and are doing a very satisfactory home trade. The new cut that has been placed upon the market has had no material effect as yet upon prices, and it is doubtful whether any recession of consequence will take place this year, as the unsold stock seems to be in strong hands. The large manufacturers seem to be a unit as to the desirability of keeping up prices. In hardwoods the situation is different, and there is not the unanimity which characterizes the pine trade. In the absence of

an improvement in the demand, manufacturers have become a little discouraged, and some are willing to reduce their asking price in order to effect sales. Basswood leads, with the thinner grades of maple following. There has been an active demand for hemlock and pine and cedar shingles. The supply of pine shingles is light and the quantity manufactured this season is not likely to be as large as usual.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

Notwithstanding the depression in the British lumber market, shipments from the St. Lawrence continue quite heavy, partly on consignment. It is much to be desired that shippers on this side reduce their shipments as much as possible, thus giving the British market an opportunity to recover. Manufacturers of spruce deals in the eastern provinces report very few sales of British specifications, and it is probable that a large proportion of this season's cut will be carried over until next spring. This will have the effect of restricting the operations in the woods during the coming winter, a condition much to be desired. Clapboards and spruce lumber generally meeting with a moderate demand for shipment to the United States. The white cedar shingle market is easier and irregular. Sales of extras have been made at \$2.95 on Boston rate of freight, while some of the smaller manufacturers are making quotations as low as \$2.85. It is probable, however, that white cedar shingles will stiffen in price in sympathy with the higher prices ruling for red cedars.

UNITED STATES.

Further features of strength in the lumber market of the United States have developed. The expected action of the Mississippi and Wisconsin Valley Lumber Associations was taken last week, when advances in the price of certain grades were made, to take effect July 5th. Ten and 12 inch No. 1 and 2 boards were advanced 50 cents a thousand, piece stuff and timber 50 cents, and finishing lumber \$1. The resolution in favor of these advances was passed unanimously. The statement of shipments of lumber from Minneapolis shows that the first six months of this year there was an increase of ten per cent. over the same period in 1900, and that they are close to the record year of 1899. The market in the Lake Superior district is unusually strong, and seems likely to continue so throughout the season. Building operations in the leading cities are on the increase, and the demand for doors and mill work is almost unprecedented for this season of the year. The lower grades of pine,

known as No. 4 and 5 boards, do not exhibit as much strength as the higher grades and piece stuff, which are in short supply generally, and particularly in the eastern states. The Albany price list this week shows an advance of about two dollars per thousand on uppers, selects, and fine common. At Buffalo and Tonawanda prices are reported to be firm, and in a position to be easily advanced as soon as prices are marked up at the western mills. The spruce situation has not changed, excepting that log drives thought to be hung up have come out, and most of the mills are likely to have a full supply for the season. The association price list is being maintained. Holders of hardwood lumber are anxious to dispose of their stocks, and as the demand is quiet, the market exhibits a slight degree of weakness. Quite heavy shipments of basswood and maple have been made from Tonawanda, where there is a feeling that a change for the better has taken place in the hardwood trade. This view, however, is not borne out by reports from other points, and a quiet trade for the next month or six weeks at least is looked for. Shingles of every variety are firm, with light offerings.

GREAT BRITAIN.

The British market as yet shows no sign of improvement; indeed fears are expressed that the decline in prices has not yet reached the lowest limit. A "scare" seems to have taken possession of everybody, and the prevailing uncertainty as to what direction prices may take has naturally induced a feeling of extreme caution on the part of buyers. The stocks on hand are considerable and the demand light. Shipments from this side should therefore be curtailed as far as possible, thus relieving the depression in the British market, by allowing time for stocks now on hand to pass into consumption, and prices to stiffen. A combination of west of England timber firms to restrict competition in buying is being talked of. As yet the decline in values has not affected credits in Great Britain. It is hoped that importers will be able to hold out until the recovery of the market which will probably take place at the latest next spring.

The spruce market is reported to be in a wavering condition, but prices for flooring are well maintained. There is said to be a revival of demand from Germany, which, if sufficiently strong, will attract shipments which would otherwise go to Great Britain and thereby assist in restoring values in the latter market.

STOCKS AND PRICES

No. 1 white pine lath is bringing \$3.25 in Chicago, and mixed \$2.75.

Receipts of lumber at the Torowanda for June of this year were 75,086,118 feet, which exceeds the corresponding month of last year by 30,000,000 feet.

In the Saginaw valley 18 inch XXXX pine shingles are held at \$3.50 and \$3.60; clear butts at \$2.50 and \$2.60; 16-inch pine, \$3 for XXXX, and clear butts at \$1.75.

At Buffalo first-class elm staves and 6-foot coiled hoops are selling at \$7.50 to \$7.75, and basswood heading at 5 1/2 and 6 cents. A limited quantity is being received from Canada.

At a meeting in Vancouver on June 27th, of the United States and British Columbia firms, comprising the Pacific Coast Lumber Association, an agreement is said to have been reached that there should be a uniform price for lumber and shingles in the eastern states markets.

FOREIGN MARKETS.

Messrs. S. P. Musson & Co., of Barbadoes, in their trade circular of June 22nd, say regarding lumber: The only arrivals to note in this line are, the "Herbert Rice" from Meteghan, with 148,000 ft. spruce, which was placed at \$16.87 shipping, \$12.87 2nd quality. Next receipts will, we fear, have to accept lower prices, season being over. In White Pine, the "Harry Troop" has arrived from Jordan River with 218,000 ft. This is one of the cargoes referred to in our last as sold to arrive at \$24 and \$19 for first and second quality respectively. Pitch Pine—Nothing new to report. Shingles—We can only confirm our last advices, and mention that two or three cargoes are reported on the way. Staves—Nothing to advise.

Shooks—The S. S. "Navigator" brought 600 bbls. for importers account. Hoops—Lotting rates unchanged—season over.

The announcement is made that if the Bristol Docks Bill, now before the British Parliament, is approved, a large enterprise looking to the development of trade between Bristol, Canada, Jamaica and the United States will be established.

Messrs. Foy, Morgan & Co. will sell by auction at Hull, Eng., on the 16th inst., a parcel of Canadian doors.

THE BOSTON MARKET.

There is a very good demand for spruce lumber, and the market is fully as firm as, previously noted. The only weak spot is on matched spruce boards, which are somewhat weaker owing to an oversupply. Prices are firmly held at: Ten and 12 in. dimensions, \$18 to 19.50; 9-in. and under, \$17 to 18; 10 and 12 inch random lengths, 10 feet and up, \$17.50 to 18.50; 2x3, 2x4, 2x5, 2x6, 2x7 and 3x4, 10 feet and up, \$15 to 16; all other randoms, 9-in. and under, 10 feet and up, \$15.50 to 17; 5-in. and up, merchantable boards, \$15 to 17; matched boards, \$16 to 17; out spruce boards, \$12.50; bundle furring, \$14.

Hemlock remains firm and unchanged: Pennsylvania, No. 1, \$16 to 17, No. 2, \$14 to 15; eastern Pennsylvania boards, \$15 to 16; random, \$13 to \$14.

The situation in western pine is unchanged, shippers being very firm. Here the market is quiet, with prices firm: Uppers, 1 in., \$58 to 62; 1 1/2 to 2 in., \$63 to 64; 3 and 4 in., \$68 to 72; selects, 1 to 4 in., \$52 to 64; fine common, 1 to 3 in., \$45 to 60; sheathings, \$38 to 54; barn boards, \$25 to 30; coffin boards, \$23 to 25.

Shingles are easy. The demand is rather limited: Extra, \$2.80 to 2.90; clear, \$2.60 to 2.65; second clear, \$2 to 2.30; sap, \$2.10 to 2.25; extra No. 1, \$1.65 to \$1.75; British Columbia, 16-in., five butts to 2 in., \$3.15 to \$3.35.

Clapboards continue firm and scarce. Quotations are fully sustained: Extra spruce, \$30 to 32; clear, \$28 to 30; second clear, \$26 to 28; extra No. 1, \$18 to 20; pine, extra, \$36 to 38; clear, \$36 to 37; second clear, \$28 to 30.

Laths are in steady demand, with prices lower: 1 1/2 inch, \$2.80 to \$2.85; 1 1/4 inch, \$2.60 to \$2.70.

SHIPPING MATTERS.

The steamer Ella Sayer is loading deals at St. Thomas, Que., for Glasgow.

The steamer Frederick King has been chartered to load deals at St. John, N.B., for w. c. of England, at 41s 3d.

Bark Carrie L. Smith has been chartered to load lumber in the Bay of Fundy, including Bridgewater, for Buenos Ayres, at \$10, if Rosario, \$11.

Among recent imports at Bristol was a cargo of spruce from Québec, the bulk of which was for Fry, the well-known cocoa firm, with a small parcel of ends for Taylor & Low Bros.

Miramichi lumber shipments to June 15th totalled 41,428,156 feet, against 27,610,109 feet to the same date last year. F. E. Neale is the largest shipper, being credited to date with 19,543,900 s. f. He has chartered for about 15,000,000 more.

St. John, N.B., advices report that schooner Mabel Hall is loading laths for Philadelphia at 65 cents; steamer Bernard is on her way to Liverpool with a cargo of deals, and the barque Ashlow is loading for Buenos Ayres; steamer Pawnee has been chartered to load deals for Liverpool, at 40s.

The following charters are reported: Bathurst to Glasgow and Greenock, steamer, 1,000 stds., 46s 3d, July; Campbellton to Bowling, steamer, 750 stds., 47s 6d, July; Miramichi to Garston, Jonatau, sailer, 52s 6d, all boards; Miramichi to Las Palmas, a vessel, 61s reg., \$6.75; Riviere du Loup to Sharpness, Ramleh, 43s 9d, end July; Pugwash, Pictou, or Dalhousie to West Britain or East Ireland, ship, 320 stds., 47s 6d; Ship Harbour to Irvine, ship, 220 stds., 56s 3d; St. Lawrence to two ports e. c. U.K., steamer, 1,200 stds., 46s 3d, July; From Bay of Fundy to W.C.B., 40s to 41s 3d is obtainable, and from Miramichi, &c., 2 1/2 to 3 1/2.

42s 6d to 45s. From the full St. Lawrence to London or W.C.B. 45s is offering for handy July, August, or September boats.

The National Lumber Exporter's Association of the United States, has brought an action against the Atlantic Transport Steamship Line for having refused to give a clean bill of lading on a shipment of hardwood lumber consigned by Samuel A. Bennett to Messrs. Leary & Co., of London. This action is brought to secure an interpretation by the Courts of the Act of Congress, known as the "Harber Act," which provides as follows:—"Section 4: That it shall be the duty of the owner . . . to issue to shippers . . . a bill of lading or shipping document stating, among other things, the marks necessary for identification, number of packages or quantity; stating whether it be carrier's or shipper's receipt; . . . and such document shall be prima facie, evidence of the receipt of the merchandise therein described." "Section 5: That for a violation of any of the provisions of this Act the . . . owner who refuses to issue, on demand, the bill of lading herein provided for shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Two Thousand Dollars."

GOVERNMENT TIMBER SALE.

It will be seen by our advertising columns that the Government of Ontario proposes holding a timber sale by public auction on the 17th September next. Some of the berths are those which were intended to be sold on the 15th March last, but were

withdrawn as the prevalence of smallpox prevented prospective buyers from examining and estimating. Several townships in the vicinity of Sault Ste. Marie are also offered. These townships have been surveyed for a great many years, but being inaccessible were not required for settlement. Now owing to the good land in the vicinity of Sault Ste. Marie being all taken up and the construction of the Algoma Central Railway giving miners and settlers easy access to these townships a number are going in and the timber is exposed to danger from fire. It is therefore considered expedient to dispose of the pine timber, so that the townships can be thrown open for sale or settlement and that the province may get the benefit of the value of the timber.
