One hundred and thirty-three casino were authorized by the ministry of the interior last season to have baccarat, the mechanical racing horses, whist, bridge besiques, cearte and piquet. The officia figures before the commission show that the casinos in France at summer resort and springs took in about \$10,000,000 profit during a single season.

Public gambling revenues, according to the official figures, have increased about fourfold since 1907. These figures do not include 4,600 clubs in France where gambling is allowed and for which the state also takes a percentage of the profits, nor the pari-mutuel machine at race courses, which last season tool bets of about \$80,000,000.

Some of the newspapers, in reproaching the cabinet for trying to take more "tainted" money, relate that one of the wealthiest proprietors of casinos in France began as a dish-washer in a restaurant, and that his income is now \$400,000 a year, besides that from his accumulations, which amount to \$6,000,000 Another proprietor, who was a house painter, is reputed to have a fortune of \$4,000,000.
