When Great Britain awoke to the danger of the German menace in 1999, and a situation of the utmost gravity developed, New Zealand and Australia offered subscriptions and Dreadnoughts; Sir Wilfrid refused either, but expressed his great willingness if war should ever break out, to "stump the constituencies of Quebec" as his contribution to Empire defence. It is safe to say that, had another Premier been at the head of either party since 1896, Canada would today have stood side by side with the other dominions on the vital question of naval defence, and as much ahead





FIND BODY IN BARREL AT MONTREAL STATION

Ghastly Crime Revealed When Opened in Grand Trunk Freight Sheds--Shipped from Jarvis, Ontario.

Montreal, Dec. 21.—The commission of a ghastly crime, but where committed is as yet unknown, was unearthed in this city by the opening of an unclaimed barrel-at the Grand Trunk freight sheds this morning. The barrel was supposed to contain poultry, and was so marked, but, instead, it contained the body of an old man.

The barrel has been in the sheds for some time, and officials wanted to get it out of the place, and, in order to do so, authority was secured to open it. The barrel was shipped from Jarvis, Ont., by J. McSorley, and was first addressed to J. Bousefield, 911-2 St. Lawrence Market, Toronto, a native of Jarvis. While it was yet in the Toronto freight shed a man called and had it readdressed to the care of the janitor of Hishops' College, Ontar to street, Montreal. Bishops' College has been out of existence for years. When the barrel arrived here it was sent to the Canada Cold Storage premises, as it was marked turkeys. As no one caffed for it, it was decided to sell the goods, and a merchant was asked to make an offer.

When the storeman, James Singleton, opened the barrel he fainted when he found what was in it. The grey beard of an old man was the first thing he saw. When the body was taken out it was found to be trussed with stout cord to keep the legs doubled up beside the body.

The police here are inclined to accept the theory that the old man died a natural death and that someone, in order to avoid the expense of interment, shipped the body to thaw out. In the meantime the Ontario police anthorities have been asked to investigate.




