One of these was a silly demand that the government itself should control the freight rates on the C.N.R., that is to cut the railway commission out of the control, an impossible undertaking.

Hon. Robert Rogers put the finishing touches to this argument. He pointed out that there were three railways operating in western Camada and that it was impossible, to legislate for one company alone. He said that in 1911 after he entered the Dominion cablent one of the first questions coming to his attention was the discrimination in regard to western freight rates.
