Copenhagen, Nov. 22.—General Von Eberhardt, who has assumed command of the West Russian army, has asked the Lettish commander-in-chief to accept a truce pending the decision of an armistice, according to a Riga despatch under Friday's date received here. General Von Eberhardt's telegram declares the West Russian army had placed itself under German protection, it is said. The truce will become effective at midnight next Wednesday.

No reply has been sent by the commander of the Lettish troops, who, however, points out that General Von Eberhardt's action might make the aggressive campaign of Colonel Bermondt against Riga a German affair, according to the despatch.



## DISASTROUS CONFLAGRATION AT TROIS PISTOLES CAUSES \$600,000 LOSS TO PULP AND LUMBER

35,000 Cords of Pulp Wood and 2,000,000 Feet of Lumber Destroyed—Property of Brown Bros. of New Hamp-shire—Pulp Mill Escaped Destruction.

Quebec, Nov. 21—A despatch from Trois Pistoles says one of the most disastrous conflagrations that has ever occurred in this vicinity broke out about four o'clock Thursday afternoon at Tobin, near here, where is situated the big pulp and lumber industry of Brown Bros., of Berlin, N. H., and which resulted in the destruction of some 35,000 cords of pulp wood and about 2,000,000 feet of lumber entaring a monetary loss of about \$600,000 which is pretty well covered by insurance. The fire stanted in a residence north of the lumber yard, is said to have been caused by children playing with matches. A heavy northeast gale was blowing at the time which carried the sparks onto the lumber and pulp

## PULP AND PAPER.

Representative Reavis told the U. S. Congress recently that destruction threatens the small dailies and week-lies because of their inability to obtain newsprint, and he added that paper manufacturers were giving the big city dailies the preference on orders. Whereupon a New York newspaper publisher wrote to the "Fourth Estate" that he was forced to omit forty columns of advertising (a loss of \$5,000) from one issue of his paper because he could not buy enough newsprint. The Chicago Tribune says that the normal demand for paper is now 25 per cent. greater than the supply, and it has started a movement for restricting the size of papers and conserving advertising space until manufacture overtakes the demand. Newsprint has increased about 300 p. c. in price in the United States in recent years. In the circumstances New Bruns-wick ought to advertise a policy broadly envisaging the development of pulp and paper-making enterprises in the Province, but the logic of the situation is so strongly in her favor at present that there is probably no need of any unneighborly attitude. There are two Maine companies which are permitted to export pulpwood from the Crown lands of this Province, the privilege being accorded by permission of the Legislature for reasons that appealed strongly to the great majority to the members. One company which has timber leases on the Salmon River is cutting pulp wood, along with lumber, for export, but it obtains pulpwood from burnt over lands, utilizing timber that would otherwise go to waste.
