

What would our grandfathers have said if they could have foreseen that their boys would find their chief amusement in poolrooms, and our young women meet in the afternoon, and in order to secure darkness draw the blinds and play bridge?

Canon Tucker referred to the Niagara power project as something as surpassing anything that was dreamed of in the Arabian Nights.

He spoke of the work the late Bishop Cronyn, Archdeacon Brough, Archdeacon Marsh and others had done, and recounted how they had been greatly assisted in their work by contributions from England.

"Now," he said, "it is our turn to do for others who need it, what was done for us. We have a splendid chance for missionary work in the Canadian west, and in order that they may have the benefits of the future that we have now, we should assist them. It is our duty to do this."

Archdeacon Richardson made an adress, in which much history of the growth of the church was given. He told how the people of Broughdale hed given \$1,000, how gifts amounting to \$1,300 had been received, and the balance of \$8,000 required was obtained from Toronto and England. LEGISLATURE OPENS

Fifth Session of Nova Scotia Parlia-ment Is Being Held.

Halifax, Feb. 23.—The Nova Scotia Legislature opened this afternoon. The inaugural speech of Lieut. Governor Mactiregor referred to the death of King Edward, and the late Lieut. Governor Fraser, and the loyalty of the province, was pledged.

Special reference was made to the proposed legislation to improve the highways of the province, and for this a large sum of money is proposed to be borrowed. This is in lind with an announcement made last summer by Attorney-General McLean. A rallway from Halifax towards the Strait of Canso has for many years been asked for by the peeple of that section of the province. The speech made no definite announcement regarding this, but it is understood that the Government has a pretty well defined policy, the main feature of which is that the road of about 150 miles will be built as a branch of the Intercolonial Raliway by the Federal Government, assisted by a large subsidy from the Provincial General Assembly.

General elections will be held soon after the House rises. This is the fifth session of this Parliament.
