GENTLEMEN. - Mr. Mowat having dissolved the Nouse for some purpose not yet developed. I have to ask for a renewal of your com-aboreaching election. The peculiar legislation by which the vote of the majority in Toroato is overruled renders it necessary that this appent should be addressed to the whole city instead of the West kilding of To-ronto, which I had the honor to represent in the last Parliament. Toronto is fairly entitled to four members and to four elec-toral districts. Under the new Franchise Act we are permitted to have three, on condition that two of the votes cancel each other, which practically reduces this great city of one hundred and thirty thousand inhabitants, to one representative in the Legisla-ture of Outario. This wrong must be righted, and justice will be done only on the advent of a Conservative Ministry. I shall have an opportunity, during the canvers, to discuss some of the important questions that divide public opinion in Ontario.
