

SERBIA CALLED TO ARMS

KING MILAN DETERMINED TO HAVE HIS WAY

Wain Effects of the Powers to Check his Pretensions—The Conference to meet at Constantinople to-morrow.

St. Petersburg, Oct. 27.—The Novorossia and the Moscow Gazette are skeptical of the benefit from a conference of the powers on the Roumelian question, and fear it will injure Russian interests.

A Promise to Serbia. A report from the frontier says that Bulgarian regulars fired upon the Serbian customs officials at Negatina and Radjace, and that the officials withdrew from their posts pending orders.

King Milan has informed the representatives of the powers that he is willing to waive the demand of Europe expressed by the conference now assembling, and pledges himself to the maintenance of peace if the status quo is maintained.

The British foreign office has telegraphed to the British minister at Belgrade requiring the Serbian government to make an immediate investigation into the reported arrest of an English officer at Nisch and his expulsion from Serbia.

The Serbian government has replied to the collective note of the powers refusing to disarm the Serbian troops until an equilibrium in the Balkans has been restored.

Prince Alexander's Position. London, Oct. 27.—Prince Alexander has received assurances from the representatives of England, Italy and Austria that his deposition will be related in the conference if he places himself unreservedly in the hands of the powers on the basis of a re-consideration of the clauses of the treaty of Berlin dated 1878.

King Theodor's Obstinacy. London, Oct. 27.—King Theodor has received the British ultimatum through the French agent at Mandaly.
