A MASSACRE IN BURMAH.

FOUR SADOON SURROUNDED BY 500 KACHYNS.

The British Garrison Completely Besieged and Many Members of the Force Either Killed or Wounded—Heavy Fall of Snow in Great Britain—Change in the Irish Local Government Bill.

STONORACE, Feb. 21.—Fort Sadoon in Upper Burma, which is garrisoned by a force of British troops, is surrounded by 500 Kachyins. The latter have made repeated attacks on the stronghold, but so far have been repulsed. Nineteen men of the British force have been either killed or wounded. The garrison is closely besieged by the enemy who have completely blocked the road leading to the fort. Ten Sepoys have been massacred while on their way thither.

LONDON, Feb. 21.—Advices have been received from Upper Burma to the effect that the Sadoon post which is being besieged by Kachyins is garrisoned by 100 British and several Indian infantry under the command of Lieutenant Harrison.

The Kachyins attack was instigated by dajinamas who have been disrupting the frontier line and who have lately been encroaching on frontier posts held by British troops.

Major Yale, in command of the district is away with 500 men dispersing Kachyins and is not expected to return until the 25th inst. Details of the reverse are still wanting.

WRAPP IN A FURRY MANTEL. Great Britain Encounters Another Heavy Snow Storm.

LONDON, Feb. 21.—Snow storms prevailed Saturday night throughout the United Kingdom. The snow was very heavy and fell in great depths in that part of the country.

All outdoor work in the shipyards at Hartlepool has been stopped, rendering idle the workmen.

The snow storm continues in Westmoreland and traffic on the various railway lines is seriously impeded.

WRECKED OFF PENANCE. A Spanish Vessel Goes Down With All on Board.
