MILLAN IS SENTENCED TEN YEARS FOR BURNING THE OSGOOD BUILDING.

The convicted man assures the Judge that as there is a God in Heaven he is innocent of the Charge-Free and Leland Also Receive Their Sentences.

William McMillan, who was found guilty in the Sessions of causing the fire which destroyed the Osgood Building in January last, was brought before Judge McDougall on Saturday and sentenced to 10 years in the penitentiary.

When asked if he had anything to say, the prisoner answered: "Your Honor, you charged the jury very strongly against me, and on that charge I found guilty. As sure as God is in Heaven, I am innocent. It was not the cause of that fire."

McMillan was outwardly cool as he listened to the Judge's words as sentence was pronounced. His Honor said: "I wish I could agree with what you say, but in view of the testimony given at your trial, I must agree with the finding of the jury. I have made careful enquiry as to your antecedents and your character, and the facts that I have learned do not tend to your credit. They all show a gradual deterioration. It is true that some of them are equal to the one for which you are to be punished, but they all indicate the going down hill process to which you have subjected yourself."

"The consequences of your act might have been a great deal more serious. You might have been standing in the dock convicted of murder. It is only by a merciful dispensation of Providence that the three persons who were on the floor of that building escaped with their lives."

"I do not believe that you deliberately set fire to that building, but I think you committed that act with criminal negligence."

Sentence was then passed upon McMillan. The collected man afterwards expressed the belief that his counsel's appeal to Ottawa for a new trial would be successful. The members of the sentence seemed to raise his spirits, and he seemed quite hopeful as he was taken from the court room.

Other Sentences Pronounced. After sentencing McMillan, Judge McDougall dealt with John Free, convicted of stealing eight cattle. The prisoner said that he did it because he was in want. His Honor suggested that what did not account for his stealing eight animals, and sentenced him to three years' imprisonment.

The next offender of this character that came before the court His Honor would sentence for a five years' term, as robberies of the kind had been very frequent.

James F. Lewis, who disposed of a piano on which there was a lien, received a sentence of two months at the Central Prison.

Lumbering on Lake Huron's Shores. John Wells of the lumbering firm with which John Charlton, M.P., is connected, says that lumbermen in the section tributary to the head of Lake Huron are not satisfied with the turn the weather has taken. It hinders considerably the large logging operations. The weather has been so dry and so cold that the ground was frozen hard enough to make the conditions favorable in the woods. In this case it freezes up right within the next 48 hours, the ground will be in a condition. However, should any spells of mild weather come between now and February they will be expensive to the logging contractors, as they will be obliged to keep a large force of workmen waiting for colder weather. The only work which can be done now is felling trees. The men has 75 men at work on about 45,000 logs on the skids.

SOME ONTARIO STATISTICS AGRICULTURAL DEPARTMENT'S INTERESTING ANNUAL REPORT.

The Grain Yield of Ontario, Manitoba and Principal American States—Value of Live Stock and Hoes—Information Concerning the Bonded Indebtedness of Townships, Towns, Villages, Cities and Counties of Ontario.

The Department of Agriculture has issued Bulletin No. 17, 1895, statistics of Ontario. A comparison of the average yield per acre of cereals in Ontario and the principal grain-growing states of the American Union and of Manitoba is presented and the average of the last 13 years from 1882 to 1894 is given. According to these tables Ontario's average yield of fall wheat for the 13 years was 24 bushels per acre, New York State showing an average of 14.9 bushels and Michigan, which shows the highest yield in any American State, comes below Ontario, with 15.4 bushels. In spring wheat Manitoba stands at the top with 15.2 bushels, Wisconsin and Minnesota coming next with 12.8 bushels.

In barley Manitoba comes to the front with an average of 27 bushels per acre, Ontario next, with 23.5 and Wisconsin next with 23.3. Only a slight difference exists between the average of Manitoba and Ontario in the matter of oats, Manitoba showing 24.5 per acre and Ontario 24.4.

Live Stock. The total value of all live stock sold or slaughtered in the year ending June 30, 1894, was \$3,935,593. In 1893 it was \$3,610,356 and in 1892 the aggregate was \$2,663,617.

Bees and Honey. The number of colonies of bees in possession of farmers in 1894 was 200,094, including the outfit required, were valued at \$1,931,574. In 1893 there were 203,701 colonies, valued at \$1,182,945, while 195,822 colonies were reported in 1892. In 1894 the honey produced averaged a ton over 30 pounds per colony.

Wool Clip. The total clip of wool in 1894 was 5,235,036 pounds, valued at \$1,953,721. In 1893 the clip was 5,896,592 pounds, valued at \$2,073,274. The average annual clip for 13 years was 5,560,068 pounds, valued at \$1,935,439.

Cheese Factories. There were 107 cheese factories in operation in Ontario in 1894, being an increase of 12 over 1893. The average output per factory was 96,226 pounds of cheese in 1894, compared with 90,961 pounds in the year previous, 109,887 in 1892, and an average of 93,637 pounds for 12 years. The total output of cheese in 1894 was 11,122,829 pounds in excess of 1893, while the gross amount of money received was \$1,023,238 greater than in 1893. The total amount paid to patrons in 1894 was \$7,931,022, which is equivalent to 77 cents per 100 pounds of milk, or \$3.15 per hundred pounds of cheese. The cheese sales averaged \$1.70 per pound. Since the average expense of making, hauling, etc., averaged \$1.55 per 100 pounds of cheese.

Bonded Debt. The combined bonded debts of townships, villages, cities and counties increased from \$29,924,883 in 1886 to \$48,083,243 in 1893.

The Returns for the Province show a decrease of \$15,418,244 in the value of farm lands and a decline of \$4,523,529 in the value of live stock, while an increase of \$3,818,878 is observed in the value of farm implements, a gain of \$94,253 in the value of implements, the net result showing a falling off in the total value of \$15,866,563 as compared with 1893.

The average rental per acre of leased farms based upon the whole acreage of farm was \$1.88 in 1894 as compared with \$1.85 in 1893. The rental in the cleared portion the average was \$2.65 in 1894, as against \$2.72 in 1893, and \$2.73 as the average of the past nine years.
