STREDAHN'S MURDERER.—A special session of the circuit court will be held in the course of a few weeks for the trial of the prisoner "Black," who murdered policeman Stredahn at Moncton. The solicitor general has arranged for this, and the county will thus receive a large sum of money, bringing on the trial.

AN ANAPOLIS SCHOONER SINKS.—The schooner *Myrtle of Louis*, of Annapolis, Lloyd master, on a fishing voyage, foundered in Chedabucto Bay last Saturday morning at 2 o'clock. The crew saved themselves in the dingy and landed at Arichat, C. B. The vessel sprung a leak during the previous day, and the crew noticed the water had reached the floor of the fore-cabin, which is below deck. There being a thick fog at the time, they could not make Canoe harbor, but they succeeded in getting into Chedabucto bay and had hopes at one time of reaching Port Hawkesbury. At 2 a. m., being then about two miles south-west of the rock, the pumps checked and the water rose so rapidly that the men had to take to their dingies and a few minutes later they were down. There were 300 quintals of fish on board.
