BIBLE KNOWLEDGE IN EARLY LIFE.

In looking over the broad field of Christian labour, that ever widens as we view the necessity for energetic and persevering action, the subject of Scripture schools and of faithful Bible teaching seems to me of great weight ; and I have queried much as to how a higher degree of success in this work can be attained ; what is most needed to secure a more earnest and holy zeal for the promotion of this cause—that would secure to us, and especially to the *lumps* of the fold, a groundwork of principle and a true foundation of faith in the seed-time of life.

To all these queries the answer of inspiration comes most forcibly—"If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, who giveth to all men liberally and upbraideth not, and it shall be given him." Then follow in the mind the explanatory words, "Behold the fear of the Lord, *that is wisdom* ; and to depart from evil is understanding."

We may safely conclude, if we feel any lack, that should we ask of God, and so often as we feel a lack we should continue to ask ; and in so doing I do believe we will dwell more continually in His Spirit ; and if so dwelling, have we not the promise of *that* which alone *can* lead us to find the best and right way to make our Bible instructions lively, practical, and effectual, securing encouraging appreciation ! That this is a work from which we cannot be excused, let us hear the Divine command concerning the teachings of Scripture : "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might. And these words, which I command thee, this day shall be in thine heart ; and thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up. And thou shalt bind them for a sign upon thine hand, and they shall be as frontlets between thine eyes. And thou shalt write them upon the posts of thy house, and on thy gates."—Deut. vi. 5-10. By the study of the Bible, the mind of man is brought into contact with the mind of God.

The Saviour said, "Search the Scriptures," and the Apostle testifies, "They are able to make wise unto salvation, through faith, which is in Christ Jesus." I find no chapter or text which releases us, at any period of life, from the study of the Scriptures. But, do we sufficiently realize the importance of the *time of beginning* this study, or of teaching it? Solomon said, "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it." The prophet says, "Whom shall he teach knowledge, and whom shall he make to understand doctrine? Them that are weaned from the milk and drawn from the breasts. For precept must be upon precept, precept upon precept, line upon line, line upon line, here a little and there a little." The first seven years of life are more important than parents are aware. In them are sown the seeds of all that is good and amiable in character, or most that is evil. The most effectual corrector, even at this early period, is the Bible. And since the condition of a child is that to which we must come to receive the blessed Saviour, I conceive that childhood is the important season in which to sow the seed. For at mature age we have to make use of all the childlike simplicity and confidence that remains in our nature to help us to exercise faith in God's word or his promises. *Faith*, that very simple and yet difficult thing to be obtained, after leaving childhood, it is that makes us a child of Christ. "Whosoever shall not receive the kingdom of God as a little child, shall in no wise enter therein." Receive it with childlike confidence, believing from the heart that "Jesus died for me, even me."

The need of early culture cannot be sufficiently estimated; of beginning with the bud or germ. "In the morning sow thy seed, and in the evening withhold not thy hand." I am impressed that the weight of the command is *in the morning*; wait not for the noonday sun, nor for the evening shade. Pre-occupy the ground. Seek the *dew* of God's blessing, and our children shall be numbered among the lambs of Christ's flock.

"The lambs of Jesus, who are they,
But children who believe and pray —
That keep God's laws and ask His grace,
And seek a heavenly dwelling-place.

"The lambs of Jesus, they are meek,
The words of peace and truth they speak;
To all God's creatures they are kind,
And, like their Lord, of gentle mind."

They may and probably will be more vivacious, sprightly, lively, and buoyant in juvenile life than afterward. This is natural; religion tends to happiness; cheerfulness and joyfulness are commendable, as the fruits of faith and hope in God.

The "fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, long suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith."

"Religion never was designed
To make our pleasures less."

It imparts true pleasure and abiding peace, and sweetens every thing in life. The child Samuel heard the voice or call of the Lord, when aged Eli did not. May we sow the seed in faith, and the Lord will take care of it. To us teachers the poet has said:

"O'er wayward children would'st thou hold firm rule,
And sun thee in the light of happy faces?
Love, hope, and patience—these must be thy graces,
And in thy own heart let them first keep school."

The Bible says, "He that winneth souls is wise"—he does not drive, but wins by love and kindness. May we strive to imitate our blessed Master, who so loved us that He gave himself for us; and we will be able to

"Breathe o'er our labours the fervent prayer,
That the shadows of grace may dwell richly there."

Finally, as there can be no success of lasting benefit without the sure influence of the Holy Spirit, let us ever seek to dwell very near to Christ; for Scripture assures us "our labour cannot be in vain in the Lord."—*Friend's Review.*

Canadian and Domestic.

REPORT OF REV. D. D. McLEOD.

To the Board of Directors of the Upper Canada Bible Society:—

GENTLEMEN,—I began the visitation of the Branches assigned to my care in the county of Wentworth, on the 19th of January. On that evening visited Alberton, but found, through my notices not having reached the Secretary, no meeting had been intimated. Arranged afterwards for another meeting which was held on the 16th of February. The attendance was good, and besides an address by the Agent, addresses were delivered by the Rev. W. P. Walker, Rev. — Spencer, as well as by the Secretary and Treasurer, A. Miller, Esq., and G. Taylor, Esq. Much interest was manifested in the operations of the Society, and with proper attention to the business of collecting we may look for a larger contribution to the funds of the Society next year.

On January 20th Ancaster East was visited. The attendance was remarkably good, and very interesting addresses were delivered by the Rev. Messrs. Black and Walker, in addition to the address of your Agent. The Society has some warm and energetic friends in this Branch, and the contributions reached a liberal amount.

On the 26th January Copetown was visited. Here the Branch seems in a languishing condition. Mr. Fry, the Secretary, however, and some others take a deep interest in the work, and it is to be hoped the Branch will again revive and prosper. On the night of meeting so few came out that no addresses were delivered. This lack of interest in the matter I hope will be removed by the attention of the community being directed to the subject from the pulpit and otherwise before our next meeting is held.

On January 28th I visited Nairn Branch. Here we had a large and enthusiastic meeting. The interest manifested in the Society's operations was most gratifying, and the contribution was very liberal. Addresses were delivered of an interesting and impressive kind, by the Rev. A. McLean and Rev. R. W. Padgham, in addition to the address of the Agent. The meeting altogether was very refreshing, and the various office-bearers deserve much credit for their attention and zeal in the duties they are called on to discharge.

On the 3rd of February Lynden was visited. Here the meeting was very small. I delivered a short address. Circumstances prevented the neighbouring ministers, with one exception, from being present. I have reason however to believe that more will be done there (than was accomplished this year) at our next time of visitation, and that your Agent will have a more cheering account to give of the condition of the Branch.

On February 4th I held a meeting in Ancaster Village. The meeting was not so large as might have been expected, and none of the neighbouring

clergymen were present. There are, however, some earnest friends of the Society in the community, and though the collection was not so large as the previous year, owing to exceptional causes, considerable interest was manifested in the Society's operations. There is reason to hope that this Branch will exhibit in the future greater activity and liberality than it has yet done. Your agent delivered an address giving an account of the Society's work.

February 10th I visited Jerseyville. The attendance at the meeting was very good, and much interest appeared to be felt in the work of the Society. The Rev. Mr. Dymock took part in the meeting. The office-bearers of the Branch, old and well-tried friends of the Society, take an active interest in the work, and it is my experience when this is the case, the meetings are good and the interest of the people is awakened also. The contribution was very liberal, and on the whole the meeting was very interesting.

On February 26th the Branch at Glanford was visited and a very good meeting held. The ministers of the neighbourhood were prevented from being present, but in addition to the Agent's address the President and others spoke warmly in support of the Society. Although the whole district was not canvassed, a very good contribution was given to the funds. This was the second appointment at Glanford. On the first visit of your Agent it was impossible to hold a meeting.

On the 19th February the Branch at Binbrook was visited. Although the evening was unfavourable the attendance was very fair, and considerable interest was manifested in the work. The meeting was addressed by your Agent, but no other ministers were present owing to other engagements detaining them.

These were all the branches allocated to me. When it was possible the depositaries were visited, but in none of the Branches was there a large local circulation.

The Branch at Bartonville appears to be altogether defunct. I had not an opportunity of visiting it, having written to the former office-bearers on the subject of having a meeting, and got no replies from them.

Although in some of the places visited the collection was not so large as in the preceding year, this is to be accounted for chiefly by local and temporary causes which may not be felt so much next year. I have to testify most gratefully to the uniform kindness and courtesy with which I was received by the office-bearers of the various Branches. In many cases attendance on the meetings entailed considerable inconvenience on the part of the people owing to the unfavourable state of the roads and weather, and the presence of so many in such cases testified to a sincere interest in the work of the Society. On the whole I had reason to be satisfied with the condition of the Branches, though in one or two instances there is need of the infusion of more life and zeal into the work.

REPORT OF THE REV. JOHN KAY.

To the Directors of the Upper Canada Bible Society.

GENTLEMEN,—As soon as possible after receiving my commission, I entered upon the work of visiting the Branches assigned me, viz., eight in the County of Norfolk, and seven in the County of Grey, and succeeded through the guidance of a gracious Providence in reaching all of them according to appointment, with one exception.

I am happy to say that I found a very cordial and hearty reception at all the Branches I visited. (It is, however, greatly to be desired that the ministers of the churches generally would take a deeper interest in the practical

working of the local Branches. I am quite sure that if they would heartily enter into the spirit of our work, and would use their influence upon the public mind, the meetings would be far more successful.) I spent Sabbath, March 1st, in Owen Sound, and preached in the morning in the Wesleyan Church, and in the M. N. C. Church in the evening. The meeting on Monday was very successful, but in consequence of the formation of a Branch in connection with the "National Bible Society of Scotland," the interest is somewhat divided, so that there is really more done in Bible Society work in Owen Sound than appears from our reports.

At Thornbury the Branch is weak. Meaford is doing well. Eugenia is seeing the day of small things, but Mr. Purdy, the Depositary, has the work at heart, and is doing all he can for the objects of your society. Maxwell has "suffered the loss of all 'things'"—stock, cash from sales, and account books—through the terrible fire which swept away nearly the whole village last summer. But our meeting was well attended and the people are resolved by God's blessing to put forth every effort to restore the Branch to its former state of efficiency.

Cornabus bids fair to be an important Branch at no distant date.

I failed to reach N. Sydenham in consequence of a heavy rain which prevented me.

Lynedoch, Port Dover, Port Rowan, St. Williams, Simcoe, and Vittoria are doing well, and we hope to see Waterford and Delhi visited with a revival of interest in the work of your society.

The financial receipts in both counties are considerably in advance of previous years, but there is plenty of room for still further improvement.

I cannot see how the unselfish, non-sectarian, and God-honoured work of the Bible Society can fail to commend itself to the Christian sympathy of all who love the Lord Jesus Christ in sincerity.

"Word of the everlasting God,

Without Thee how could earth be trod,
Or heaven itself be won!"

Norval, Feb. 19th.—Attendance small, as roads were bad and evening rainy. The excellent Secretary, Rev. Mr. Alexander, assisted. Contributions a little less than last year.

Georgetown, Feb. 20th.—A very pleasant meeting. President, Rev. Mr. Johnston, Episcopalian, in the Chair, ably assisted by Rev. Messrs. Ewing (Presbyterian), Unsworth (Congregational), and Cox (Baptist). Contributions in advance of last year.

Cumminsville, Feb. 23rd.—Meeting small owing to stormy evening. Contributions in advance of last year.

Milton, Feb. 24th.—Very good meeting. Ably assisted by Revs. Messrs. Gray and Eadie. Collections not yet taken up.

Hornby, Feb. 25th.—This branch I would say is dead. No meeting. It is not possible, it appears, to get officers that will act.

Nelson, Middle Road, Feb. 26th.—A very pleasant meeting. Contributions about the same as last year.

Feb. 27th, Intended to hold meeting at Oakville, but in consequence of other meetings had to postpone.

Acton, March 10th.—Night very cold, consequently a small attendance. Contributions to be forwarded.

Oakville, March 12th.—Good meeting. Ably assisted by Rev. Mr. P. rson and the very excellent Secretary of the Branch, Rev. Mr. Meikle. Contributions to be forwarded.

Wellington Square, March 13th.—Good meeting. Excellent addresses delivered by Rev. Messrs. Christopherson, Shaw, and Little (the previous Agent) who was visiting some friends in the neighbourhood. Contribution in advance of last year.

REPORT OF REV. JOHN GEMLEY.

To the Board of Directors of the Upper Canada Bible Society.

GENTLEMEN,—During the last week in the month of June, and the first in July, 1873, I visited the Branches of Penetanguishene, Waverley, Orillia and Parry Sound, therewith commencing my visitatorial duties for the year closing with the 31st March, 1874. I preached once at Parry Sound. Owing to the Dominion elections in progress, I had to make some re-arrangements of my plans; still the meeting, in each of the above places, was interesting and satisfactory. The weather was oppressively hot, and the long road from Barrie to Penetanguishene (which I had to pass over three times) was dreary; and to me, in my then enfeebled condition, it was very debilitating. I felt, when too late, that I should not have undertaken this work until the completion of the vacation which you had kindly granted me for the purpose of seeking invigorated health. The Bowmanville Anniversary was held in the Town Hall, on Wednesday, the 3rd December. I had the pleasure of being associated with the agent, the Rev. Mr. Montgomery, in this meeting. We feared we would have no congregation, as it was held on the evening when that terrific storm commenced, which, before the next morning, had done so much damage in Toronto and in other places. However we had a good attendance, and the meeting was one to which I look back with pleasure and satisfaction. This is an excellent Branch. Sunday and Monday, the 14th and 15th December, were spent at Berlin, and I have to report very encouraging prospects of the Branch there. Winterbourne, Elmira and Hawksville were visited on the Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, and as heretofore were well sustained by the people.

1874. On the 7th January I took part with the agent, the Rev. Mr. Harper, in the Brantford Annual Meeting. The evening was one of the most forbidding I ever witnessed, yet a large congregation assembled in the Baptist Church—a majority of those present were ladies. The meeting was enthusiastic, and the collection in advance of the princely givings of former years.

On Sunday and Monday, the 25th and 26th January, I had the satisfaction of being present at Elora. Preached in the Wesleyan church on the Sunday, and aided in the meeting, in the same place, on the following evening. An episode, of a pleasant yet somewhat painful character, took place at this meeting. Mr. Joseph Carder, the beloved and efficient Secretary of the Branch, was obliged, after having filled the office for more than a quarter of a century, partially to retire from active work. A very handsome Bible and a suitable address were presented to him, in the name of the friends of the Society, by the Rev. Mr. Middlemiss. This is a flourishing Branch. I was at Hespeler on the 27th. The meeting was held in the N. C. Church. The attendance was small; but it is expected that this Branch, which was organized within the past few months, will become one of the most prosperous. On Wednesday, the 28th January, I assisted at the meeting in Galt. It was held in the Wesleyan Church. The audience was not as large as desired; but, from the spirit manifested in the Committee, I anticipate continued advancement in this very important Branch. On February, the 1st and 2nd, the Anniversary of the St. Thomas Branch was held. I preached in the Presbyterian Church on Sabbath morning, and had the pleasure of being associated with the agent, the Rev. Mr. Johnston, in the encouraging meeting, which was held in the Wesleyan Church on Monday evening. I left by the Southern R. Road on Tuesday, the 3rd February, for Wallace-town. The meeting was held in the Presbyterian Church. The night was cold, and the snow deep, but the friends here have warm hearts, and the results were very satisfactory.

The Annual Meeting of the Peterborough Branch took place on Monday, the 9th February. I preached in behalf of the Society, on Sunday, the 8th, in the Canada Presbyterian church, to a large Congregation, from which a liberal collection was received. The meeting was held in St. Andrew's Church, and was fairly attended. This is a large and most flourishing town, and, as one of my fields of former ministerial labour, it afforded me much pleasure to revisit it. The Committee here take a deep interest in the distribution of the Word of God among the lumbermen in the northern section of the county, and I had great satisfaction in being authorized by the Board to assure the Peterborough Committee of their desire to do all in their power to aid them in this laudable purpose. I was much disappointed in not meeting the agent, the Rev. R. B. Montgomery, who by sickness was prevented from coming. On Sunday, the 15th February, I preached in St. Andrew's Church, Stratford, and received a good collection in aid of the funds of the Society. On the following evening, the meeting, which took place in the Town Hall, was largely attended. The spirit manifested throughout the services, and the liberal collection presented at their close was most encouraging. My last visit for the year was to Napanee. I preached in the Wesleyan church on Sunday evening, the 1st March. The congregation was large, and the collection presented liberal. The Annual Meeting was held in the new and beautiful Episcopal Methodist church. Everything connected with this meeting was most cheering and gratifying. This Branch has greatly prospered within the past few years. For this, we are much indebted to the judgment and energy of our agent, the Rev. Mr. Stone, who is a resident of this prosperous town.

Want of space only prevents me from definitely expressing my appreciation of the aid I have received from ministers at the various meetings I have attended during the present and preceding years. It would also have afforded me sincere pleasure to have named those gentlemen—lay and clerical—who so kindly assisted me from time to time in reaching my appointments. It is now five years since I entered upon the duties of the Permanent Secretariat of the Upper Canada Bible Society, from which I now retire, again to devote myself fully to the work of the ministry. As it has been in the past, so will it be in the future, my aim to do all in my power to aid in the dissemination of the Sacred Scriptures. During the many years in which I have been

called to advocate the claims of Bible Society operations, I have felt it an honour to be engaged in such advocacy, and hope ever to feel it an honour.

TORONTO, 15TH SEPTEMBER, 1874.

THE REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING of the Board of Directors was held on Tuesday, August 11th, at 7.30 p.m. The attendance was good. The Rev. S. Rose was called to the chair, and opened the meeting with the usual devotional exercises. The minutes of the July meeting were read, and having been amended, were adopted. The report of the Auditors, Messrs. Kerr and Anderson, which gave a most satisfactory account of the condition of the Society's books, and the manner in which they are kept, was referred to a committee. The Depositor's Cash Statement for July was submitted and passed. The gratuities made during the month of August were confirmed, amount \$41.30. An application for a further grant to the Central Prison was referred to the Secretaries. A vote of thanks to the Parent Society for its grant of £200 stg. in aid of Agency Expenses, and also for a grant of Reports, was very cordially adopted. The Agency Committee was requested to undertake also the supervision of the Colportage field. On motion of Mr. J. K. Macdonald, seconded by Mr. G. M. Evans, a committee was appointed "to report to the next monthly meeting of the Board, on the future duties belonging to the office of the Permanent Secretary, and also to report any suggestion in reference to the office which in their opinion may be in the interest of the Society." A committee was appointed to inspect the Society's premises, and ascertain what repairs were necessary. After prayer by Rev. J. Potts, the meeting was brought to a close.

THE SEPTEMBER MONTHLY MEETING was held on Tuesday the 8th inst. The attendance was very large. The Hon. Wm. McMaster, V.P., occupied the chair, and called upon the Rev. J. Potts to conduct the devotional exercises, after which the minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed. The Report of the Committee on the future duties of the Permanent Secretary was read and received. The Report was to the following effect: "The Committee, after full consideration, respectfully begs leave to recommend, that in future the duties of the Permanent Secretary be limited to

those of the office as these are defined in the Society's Rules and Regulations, apart altogether from agency work. The said duties, however, to include the editing of the 'Bi-monthly Recorder.' The Committee would also recommend that so much of the former regulations as required the Permanent Secretary to give his whole time each day to the work of the office, or as may be otherwise inconsistent with the proposed change, be repealed." On motion of Rev. J. M. King, seconded by Mr. J. K. Macdonald, the Report was adopted. The same Committee, on motion of Rev. J. M. King, were requested to report as to the amount of time to be given by the future Secretary, and the remuneration he should be entitled to. It was moved by Mr. Gillespie, seconded by Mr. G. M. Evans, "That his Board desires to record its high sense of the valuable services rendered this Society by the late Permanent Secretary, the Rev. John Gemley, since his appointment, five years ago, and that his name be added to the list of Vice Presidents of the Society." The motion was unanimously adopted. The Depository's Cash Statement for August was read. The gratuities during the month, amounting to \$15.78, were confirmed. The Schedule of the Colporteurs' labours was read. Notice of motion that the publication of the Annual Report, in its separate shape, be resumed, was given by Dr. Genkie, and the meeting adjourned at 10.15 p.m.
