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## **BY-LAWS.**

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**BY-LAW** to amend a By-Law passed 17th June, 1861, entitled a By-Law to prevent Horses running at large in the Township of Raleigh.

[Passed 5th May, 1862.]

Be it enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, under and by virtue of an Act, Cap. 54 of the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada.

1. That for and notwithstanding anything contained in the before recited By-Law, or in the 105th Section of an Act respecting Municipal Institutions: It shall not be lawful for any person to recover damages occasioned by Horses running at large and breaking into their enclosures, except they have lawful fences as provided by By-Law of this Township.

**A BY-LAW** to divert and establish the River Road across Lots numbered Seven and Eight, in the Front Concession, Township of Raleigh.

[Passed May, 5th, 1862.]

Whereas, application has been made to this Council, and all necessary forms complied with, according to law, to pass a By-Law for diverting and establishing the Road running across lots 7 and 8, in the Front Concession, in said Township.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, under and by virtue of an Act, Cap. 54, of the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada.

1. That the Public Highway on the bank of the River Thames, running across Lots Seven and Eight, in the Front Concession of said Township, be and is hereby diverted to a line surveyed for

the purposa, by Arthur Jones, P. L. S., Township Surveyor, and and which may be better known and described according to his report and diagram, viz :

Commencing on the limits between Lots Seven and Eight on the Northerly side of the old River Road, thence South forty-six degrees and thirty minutes East, four chains and thirty-two links across the old Road and along the centre of the proposed Road to the Southerly side of the same : thence North sixty-two degrees thirty minutes East, nine chains, twelve links, following said side of proposed Road to a post planted sixty feet from the North side of the old track, and on the limits between Messrs. Stockdale and Peck.

2. That John Edwards and Timothy Dillon be and are hereby appointed a Committee to see that Francis Drake and William Stockdale, at their own expense, move the fences and put the new Road in as good a state of repair as the old one now is, and it shall be the duty of said Committee to report to the Clerk of this Council on the above conditions being complied with.

3. That this By-Law shall take effect as soon as said report is filed in the Clerk's office.

#### A BY-LAW to divide the Township of Raleigh into Rural Road Divisions.

Passed May 5th, 1862.

Whereas, it is necessary to divide the Township of Raleigh into Rural Road Divisions.

Be it therefore enacted, by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, under and by virtue of an Act, Cap. 54, of the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada, that there shall be five Rural Road Divisions in the Township of Raleigh, and that they shall be designated as follows :—

1. The first Rural Road Division shall contain all that part of the Township of Raleigh, commencing on the Town line dividing Harwich from Raleigh, opposite the centre of Lot No. 25 on the Eighth Concession ; thence West on the centre of the Eighth Concession to the side road between Lots No. 12 and 13 ; thence North on said side road to the River Thames ; thence East on the River Thames to the boundary line dividing the Corporation of the Town of Chatham from Raleigh ; thence South on said line to the second Concession ; thence East on the second Concession

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road to the Town line between Harwich and Raleigh ; thence South to the centre of Lot No. 25 on the Eighth Concession to the place of beginning.

2. The second Rural Road Division shall contain all that part of the Township of Raleigh, commencing on the side road opposite the centre of Lot No. 12 on the Eighth Concession ; thence West on the centre of the Eighth Concession to the Raleigh and East Tilbury Town Line ; thence North on the Raleigh and East Tilbury Town Line to the River Thames ; thence East on the River Thames to the side road between Lots No. 12 and 13 ; thence South on the side road to the centre of the Eighth Concession to the place of beginning.

3. The third Rural Road Division shall contain all that part of the Township of Raleigh, commencing on the side road opposite the centre of Lot No. 12 on the Eighth Concession ; thence West on the centre of the Eighth Concession to the Raleigh and East Tilbury Town Line ; thence South to the Fourteenth Concession ; thence East on the line between the thirteenth and fourteenth Concessions to the side road between Lots No. 12 and 13 ; thence North on said road to the centre of the Eighth Concession to the place of beginning.

4. The fourth Rural Road Division shall contain all that part of the Township of Raleigh, commencing on the Town Line between Harwich and Raleigh, on the line between the thirteenth and fourteenth Concessions ; thence West on the line between the thirteenth and fourteenth Concessions to the side road between Lots No. 12 and 13 ; thence North on said side road to the centre of the Eighth Concession ; thence East on the centre of the Eighth Concession to the Town Line between Harwich and Raleigh ; thence South on said Town Line to the fourteenth Concession to the place of beginning.

5. The fifth Rural Road Division shall contain all that part of the Township of Raleigh, commencing on the Town Line between Harwich and Raleigh, on the line between the thirteenth and fourteenth Concessions ; thence West on the line between the thirteenth and fourteenth Concessions to the Town Line between East Tilbury and Raleigh ; thence South on said Town Line to Lake Erie ; thence East on the shore of Lake Erie to the Harwich and Raleigh Town Line ; thence North on said Town Line to the thirteenth Concession to the place of beginning.

A BY-LAW to appropriate the sum of six hundred and five dollars for the improvement of Roads and Bridges.

[Passed May 5th, 1862.

Whereas the Treasurer has received the sum of nine hundred and seventy-five dollars and twenty-eight cents, Non-Resident Land Tax from the County Treasurer: And whereas after deducting the amount to meet Non-Resident School Bills, the balance of \$605, is left; And it is expedient to appropriate the same for the improvement of the Roads and Bridges, in the Township of Raleigh, in the year 1862.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, assembled under and by virtue of an Act, Cap. 54, of the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada.

1. That the sum of six hundred and five dollars be appropriated for the improvement of Roads and Bridges, as follows:—

“ 3rd do do do	\$121,	Henry Manning,	do

Each Councillor is hereby appointed to expend the same in his respective Division, and to grant orders on the Treasurer, to parties working therefor, stating what work has been done for each amount.

A BY-LAW to appropriate the sum of \$808,29 cents, and also the sum of \$28,39 cents, from Land Improvement Fund.

Passed August 11th, 1862.

Whereas it is necessary to appropriate a sum of money for the improvement of Roads and Bridges, in the Township of Raleigh.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, under and by virtue of an Act, Cap. 54, of the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada.

1. That the sum of \$162,66 cents, be appropriated to Rural Road Division No. 1, and that Councillor Edwards be appointed to expend the same; \$170,18 cents, to Rural Road Division No. 2, Councillor Dillon to expend the same, \$135,09 cents be appro-

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appropriated to Rural Road Division No. 3, to be expended Councillor Manning; \$170.18 cents be appropriated to Rural Road Division No. 4, to be expended by Councillor White; \$170.78 cents, to Rural Road Division No. 5, to be expended Councillor Pardo.

2. That the sum of \$28.39 cents, be appropriated to Side Line between Lots No. 18 and 19, from the Middle Road to the Eighth Concession, and that Councillor White be appointed to expend the same, and report as the law directs.

3. That the Treasurer is hereby required and authorized to cash the orders of the Councillors, to the respective amounts.

A BY-LAW to raise certain sums of money therein mentioned, in the Township of Raleigh, for the year 1862.

Passed August 11th, 1862.

Whereas by By-Law, by the Municipal Corporation of the County of Kent, on the 14th day of June last, entitled a By-Law to raise a sum of money to meet the current expenses of the County of Kent for the year 1862, the Municipality of the Township of Raleigh is required to raise the sum of \$1944.87 cents, as their proportion for said year, to be paid to the Treasurer of the County, without any deduction, on or before the 31st day of December, 1862.

Whereas the apportionment of the Legislative School Grant for the Township of Raleigh, for the year 1862, amounts to \$352. According to the instruction of the Clerk of the Corporation of the County of Kent, the Municipality of the Township of Raleigh, is required to levy at least an equal sum of money, according to law, in such case made and provided.

Whereas it is necessary to raise the sum of \$654, to meet the current expenses of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, for the year 1862.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, under and by virtue of an Act, Cap. 54, of the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada.

1. That there shall be raised, levied, assessed and collected upon all Rateable and Personal property in the Township of Raleigh, the sum of or rate of Four and a-half Mills on every Dollar thereof, for the aforesaid County purposes; the sum or rate of One Mill on every Dollar thereof, for the aforesaid School

purposes, excepting the property of certain Roman Catholic supporters of a Separate School. The sum or rate of One and a-half Mills, on every Dollar thereof, to meet the current expenses of the Township of Raleigh, for the year 1862; the sum or rate of One Dollar upon the owner or harbinger of every dog or bitch entered upon the Assessment Roll of the Township of Raleigh for the year 1862.

3. That if the above sums of money so raised and collected by the said Rates, shall exceed in any case the amount so required for said purposes respectively, the Treasurer of this Township shall pass such excess to any deficiency which may arise to any or either of the purposes mentioned in this By-Law, and if no such deficiency shall happen, then all such excess, if any, shall be kept by the Treasurer, and appropriated to the general purposes of this Township, under the direction and control of the Council thereof, as all the public monies, which may come into his hands.

3. That the Clerk of this Corporation is hereby required to levy a special rate, over and above all other rates against the estate real and personal of any School Section within this Municipality, on the request of the Trustees, who shall furnish him on or before the 1st day of September, with a written statement, signed by such Trustees, of the amount of money required by them to be raised, levied, assessed and collected by this Council, for Common School purposes, in such School Sections, such a Rate pro-rata, on all the Rateable property in such School Sections, as will amount to the sum of money required by such Trustees, for the aforesaid purposes, together with five per cent on said amount to defray expenses of collecting the same.

4. That the Collector of this Corporation is hereby required and authorized to collect according to law, the special School Rates levied on the Freeholders and Householdors of such School Sections, the sums of money opposite their names, and to pay the amount so collected on or before the 14th day of December next, after retaining his own fees, to the Secretary Treasurer of such Section, whose discharge shall be his quitance for the sum so paid.

A. BY-LAW to confirm the appointment of John Jenner, in the Office of Clerk of the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh.

Passed 30th September, 1862.

Whereas John Haldane, late Township Clerk, is deceased, and

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John Jenner being appointed by Resolution to that Office, it is necessary to confirm the appointment by By-Law.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, assembled under and by virtue of an Act, Cap. 54 of the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada.

1. That John Jenner be, and is hereby confirmed in the appointment of Clerk of this Corporation, as far as this Council can confirm and ratify the same, and that the said Clerk can continue to hold said office until removed by the Council.

2. That the Clerk is hereby required to enter into Bonds, himself in the sum of Fifty Dollars, and one Freeholder in the sum of Fifty Dollars. Conditioned, for the safe keeping of all Books, Papers and Effects of every description or kind, belonging to the Corporation, and for the delivery of the same, when required to do so by the Council.

A BY-LAW to unite certain Lots of Land therein mentioned to School Sections Number 3 and 12, in the Township of Raleigh.

Passed November 24th, 1862.

Whereas application has been made by the Freeholders and Householdors residing in School Sections No. 3 and 12, in the Township of Raleigh, to attach Lots No. 22 and 23, in the 2nd concession North Eastern Boundary Line, to School Sections No. 3 and 12, in the Township of Raleigh.

Whereas it has been shown to this Council, that these lots of land had been set apart, to form a union School with the Township of Harwich, and in consequence of that union not having been formed, these lots of land have remained for several years not attached to any School Section.

And whereas, the necessary notices of the same have been posted up, notifying all parties interested or concerned in the above alterations having objections thereto, to show the same to this Council. And whereas no person has made any objections thereto.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, under and by virtue of the Acts, Chap. 54 and 64, of the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada.

1. That from and after the 25th day of December, in the year

1862, that the North halves of lots No. 22 and 23, in the second concession, North Eastern Boundary Line, of the Township of Raleigh, shall be and are hereby attached to School Section No. 3. And that the South halves of lots No. 22 and 23 in the 2nd concession North Eastern Boundary Line, shall be and are hereby attached to School Section No. 12, in the Township of Raleigh.

Passed January 19th, 1863.

Whereas Thomas Crow having resigned the office of Fence Viewer in the Second Rural Road Division, in the Township of Raleigh, and it being necessary to appoint another person in his place.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, under and by virtue of an Act, Cap. 54, of the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada.

1. That the resignation of Thomas Crow as Fence Viewer in the Second Rural Road Division of the Township of Raleigh be accepted, and that John Crow be appointed in his place.

2. That anything contained in the By-Law passed February 10th, 1862, entitled a By-law to confirm and appoint the Municipal Officers of the Township of Raleigh, for the year, A. D., 1862, contrary or inconsistent with the provisions of this By-Law, be and is hereby repealed.

A BY-LAW to appoint and confirm the appointment of certain Municipal Officers of the Township of Raleigh, and to provide for the salaries of the same, for the year 1863.

[Passed February 9th, 1863.

Whereas it is necessary that the Municipal Officers appointed

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by this Corporation in each year should be appointed under the Seal thereof.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, under and by virtue of an Act, Cap. 54, of the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada.

1. That Phillip Andrew, nominated by the Reeve, and William H. White, nominated by the Council, are hereby confirmed in their appointment as Auditors.

That James Hea is hereby confirmed in his appointment as Assessor.

That Martin Drew is hereby confirmed in his appointment as Collector.

That William H. Taylor is hereby confirmed in his appointment as Inspector Licences.

That Arthur Jones, P. L. Surveyor, is hereby confirmed in his appointment as Township Surveyor, for the current year.

2. That the Salaries of the Auditors shall be the sum of \$5,00 each, and no more.

That the Salary of the Assessor, shall be the sum of Fifty Dollars, and no more.

That the Salary of the Collector, shall be the sum of Fifty Dollars, and no more, except the sum of five per cent on all sums of money collected by him as special rates for Common School purposes.

That the Salary of the Inspector of Licences, shall be the sum of eight Dollars, and no more.

A BY-LAW to amend a By-Law, passed the 13th day of February, 1860, and entitled a By-Law to define the limits of the Statute Labor Divisions in the First Ward of the Township of Raleigh.

Passed February 9th, 1863.

Whereas it is necessary to amend the above recited By-Law, in so far as the same relates to the Seventh Statute Labor Division, in what is now termed the First Rural Road Division in Township of Raleigh.

1. Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of an Act Cap. 54 of the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada, that the existing limits of Statute Labor Division No. 7, in the First Rural Road Division of the Township of Raleigh, be and is hereby abrogated and declared to exist no longer.

2. That from the day of the passing of this By-Law, the seventh Statute Labor Division in the First Rural Road Division in the Township of Raleigh, shall be divided into two Statute Labor Divisions, to be known and described as the Seventh and Twelfth Statute Labor Divisions, the Seventh Statute Labor Division, shall contain the South halves of Lots No. 14, 15, 16 and 17 in the Sixth Concession, and all of the Lots numbered 14, 15, 16 and 17, in the Seventh Concession, Western Boundary line, with the Concession Road abutting thereon, and the the Road through Lot No. 14 to Concession A.

The Twelfth Statute Labor Division shall contain the South half of Lot No. 18, and the South West Quarter of Lot No. 19, in the Sixth Concession, and Lot No. 18, and West half of Lot No. 19, in the Seventh Concession, Western Boundary Line, with the Side Road and Concession Roads abutting thereon.

3. That this By-Law shall come in force from the passing thereof.

And whereas it is necessary that the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh shall hold a certain piece of Land for the purpose of building a Town Hall, and other necessary buildings thereon, for the use of the said Township of Raleigh.

1. Be it enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, under and by virtue of an Act, Cap. 54 of the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada: That the half acre of land on the South West corner of Lot No. 15, on the Eleventh Concession of the Township of Raleigh, purchased by the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, from Francis Goulett, and held by a Deed made to the said Corporation by the aforesaid Francis Goulett, shall be held and is hereby held by the Municipal Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh, for the purpose of erecting a Town Hall and other necessary buildings thereon, for the use of the said Township of Raleigh.

2. And that this By-Law shall come in force from and after the passing thereof.

2. Anything contained in the herein before recited By-Law, inconsistent with this By-Law, be and the same is hereby repealed.
