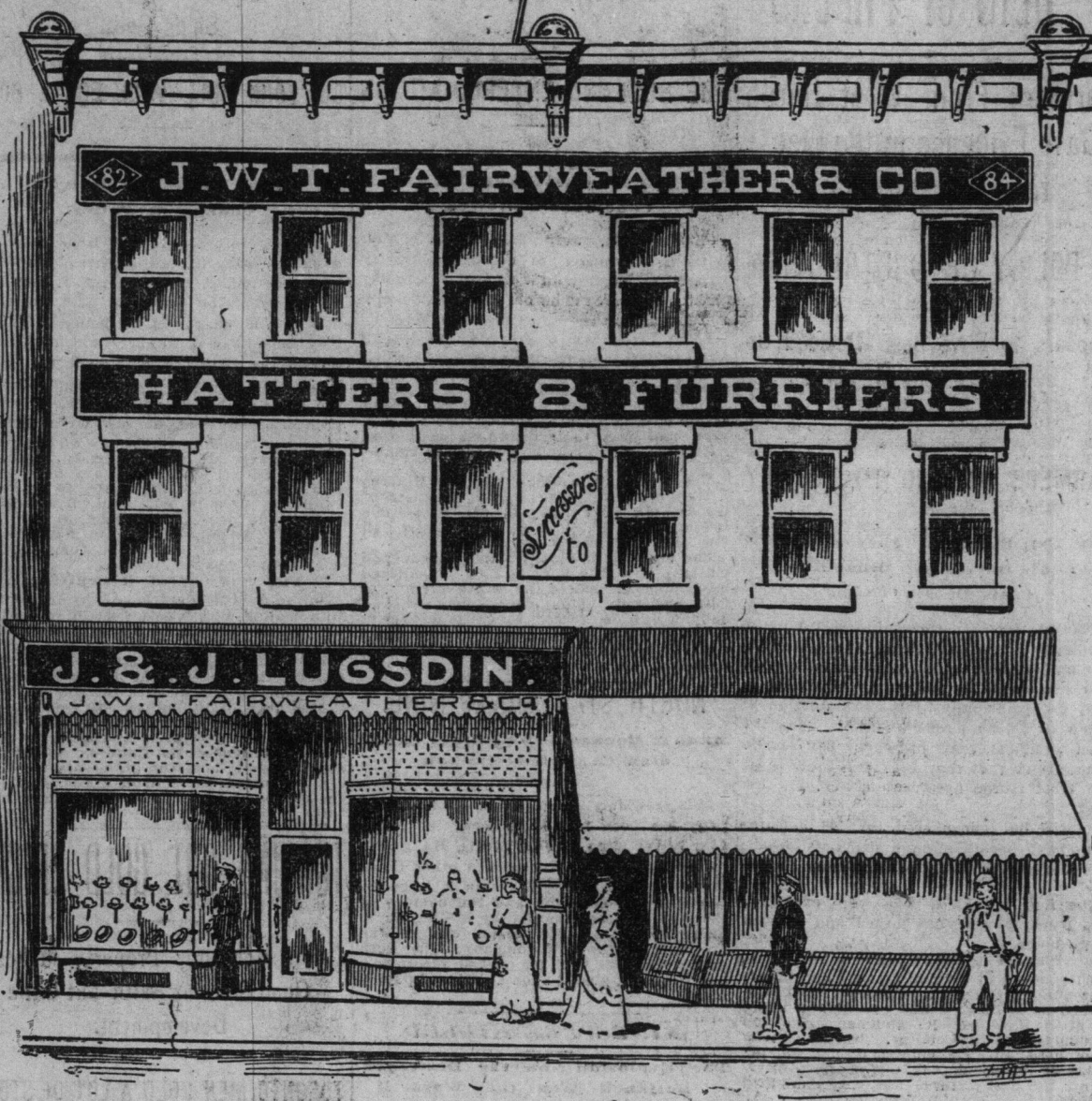

OUTPUT OF GOLD IN NEW ONTARIO

For the Current Year Will Run Up to About \$600,000, Thus Doubling the Product for 1898

Three Thousand Men Engaged in Gold, Silver, Copper, Nickel, Iron and Zinc Mining in Algoma and Rainy River.

Algoma letter No. 7—Containing some general data regarding the number of men employed in mining in Greater Ontario, their wages, the output of gold, etc.

Deer Portage, July 4.—(Special Correspondence.)—It would seem well before concluding this series of letters to devote a little space to statistics regarding the output of the mines of Northwestern Ontario, the number of men employed therein, etc.

The gold mines of Ontario will during the year 1899 produce about \$600,000 in bullion. This estimate I have from a semi-official Governmental source, and it is based upon the returns from the several working properties, as far as received for the first half of the year. These figures appear at first glance rather small, but when they are placed alongside of those for the preceding seven years, they look larger.

The Ontario Bureau of Mines reports about the following yield of gold for each 12-month period since 1861:

After all a provision that in the first eight years of mining a quarter of a million must be worked out of the province, and the fact that this year's output will be double that of last year and 18 times that of seven years ago, is sufficient evidence that the industry is making rapid strides.

Up to the end of last year were practically only three producing mines in the province, viz., the Milkado, the Regina and the Sultana. New York, July 21.—Bob G. Ingersoll died of apoplexy at his home, Dobbs Ferry, N.Y., this afternoon. Mr. Ingersoll went to Dobbs Ferry, N.Y., two days ago, apparently in good health.

Shortly after his arrival at his summer home, "Walston," he complained of a slight indisposition, and that he would go to consult his family physician in this city. He spent this morning in his study, and he was found dead almost instantly.

Sitting Rigid in His Chair.

Dr. C. H. Judson of the village was immediately summoned. When he reached "Walston" he found Mr. Ingersoll sitting rigidly in his chair. All signs of life had passed. Mr. Ingersoll had died almost instantly.

Those at "Walston" at the time of his death were his wife, his two daughters, Miss Maud Ingersoll and Mrs. Walston H. Brown; his brother-in-law, Mr. Farrell, and his son-in-law, Mr. Walston H. Brown.

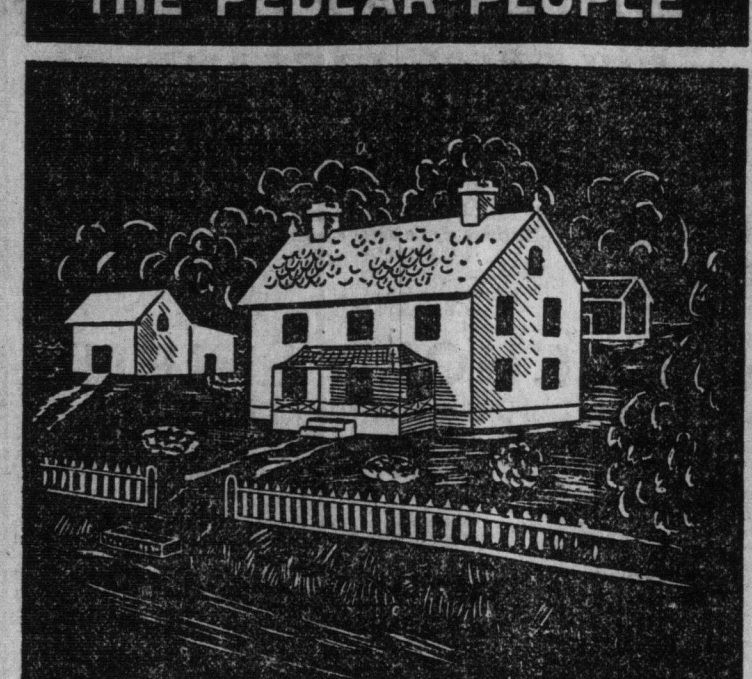
