### PROCEEDINGS OF THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE SOCIETY HELD ON MONDAY, JUNE 8th, 1874, IN THE BIBLE CHRISTIAN CHURCH, LONDON.

Sermons having been preached the preceding Sabbath by the Brethren, John Kenner, Edward Roberts, and William S. Pascoe; J. H. Eynon was called to the chair.

After singing and prayer and some pertinent remarks by the Chairman, the Secretary presented an abstract of the Society's operations and financial statement for the past year.

## REPORT.

As the colors of the flowers, the construction of an insect, the majesty of an elephant, the economy of animal life, the tides in their ebb and flow, the vicissitudes of the seasons, the alternate succession of day and night, the revolutions of the heavenly bodies, and the exactness with which all the forms of nature occupy their stations, perform their destiny, and compose one harmonious whole, tend legitimately to convince the intelligent beholders

> "These are thy glorious works, Parent of Good, Almighty ! thine this universal frame, Thus wondrous fair ! thyself how wondrous then ! Unspeakable ! who sits above the heavens, To us invisible, or dimly seen In these thy lower works ; yet these declare Thy goodness beyond thought and power divine."

So every year of Church history and Missionary enterprise, furnishes indubitable evidence that Christianity is divine in its origin, and sustained and propagated by immeasurable power. Nothing at first sight could appear more contemptible and mean than the instruments employed for its diffusion. A company of illiterate men, most of them without learning, all of them without wealth or interest, are selected to make it known throughout the world. Their extreme poverty and exterior insignificance deprived them of all countenance and authority from the great. No princes introduced them to the notice and veneration of the multitude; no philosophers espoused their unpopular pretentions; no heroes gave weight or splendor to the exploded cause of the Gospel; no legions were retained or employed to make its way through plunder and never sought but with inno than all the fl asserted, plain and death of

The first preachers never sought to satiate men by the charms of wit and eloquence, but with innocence and simplicity, more powerful and persuasive than all the flourishes of the richest elocution, they declared and asserted, plainly, firmly and steadily, the doctrines, miracles, life and death of Jesus Christ.

They roused the fiercest opposition: the people attached to the religion of their fathers, the philosophers whose idle speculations Christianity did not respect, the priests who officiated in the Temple and fattened upon the sacrifice, the rulers of the world who bore the most distinguished offices of religion, the Jews who thought all nature and grace laid under contribution for their immediate benefit, all united for the diabolical purpose of crushing the church in her cradle; but in spite of all opposition, the Gospel car moved on. At the expiration of 40 days from the death of its founder, it numbered 120 followers, and immediately after, 3,000, and soon after, 5,000 more. Ere a single century had elapsed, it had spread itself over Syria and Lybia, Egypt and Arabia, Persia and Mesopotamia. It pervaded Asia Minor, Armenia and Parthia, and even large portions of Europe ; though to the Jew a stumbling block, and to the Greek foolishness, yet it entered on the conquest of the world, and ere three centuries had passed away, it was embraced by Constantine, and endowed as the National Religion.

Men imbibed its spirit, breathed its purity, performed its conditions, and became what it commanded them to be. So strange, and effectual, and immediate were the operations of the Gospel, that it charmed the most flagitious into genuine goodness; it overcame their prejudices, bent their obstinate habits, subdued their brutal appetites, moderated their inordinate passions, tamed their savage and selfish tempers, reclaimed and corrected their depraved inclinations, and produced an immediate and entire revulsion in all their modes of thought, speech, life and action.

The vision of Ezekiel is ever and anon being presented to the students of the Bible and of humanity. The valley is deep, the bones are numerous, and their number only equalled by their dryness. If God were to ask the Church in any age "can these dry bones live?" the answer must be the same, "Lord thou knowest."

To preach the Gospel to dead dry bones, is both a thankless and hopeless task unless the Divine breath be breathed. But that breath hath been breathed. The prophets of the Gospel have prophesied, the wind of heaven hath been felt, a noise in the valley hath been heard, bone hath come to bone and sinew to sinew, a mighty army hath been raised up to fight the battle of truth, and the triumphs have been signal. These commendations are not flowers thrown upon Christianity's tomb. The Gospel is still a hale green tree with bud never more promising, bloom never more fragrant, and fruit never more luscious than now. Schools are being multiplied, colleges are being set up, ministers sent forth, the gospel preached, sinners converted, superstition giving way, and the temples of idolatry are crumbling to dust. The Saviour who was once abased is now honored, once a servant, now the Prince of the Universe, once dead, now alive again, having the keys of hell and of death; the crown of thorns is exchanged for a diadem of beauty, the reed for a sceptre, the blasphemies of eart h for the praises of heaven, the cross for a throne, and an ignominious death for the powers of an endless life. While divinely generous to his friends and ever replenishing his spiritual kingdom with more life, he exercises his power to control every foe. All agencies, favorable or unfavorable, all creatures, whether friends or enemies, are under his control and subject to his command. Angels, unfallen, are his swift winged messengers, and delight to do his pleasure. Devils, dire in opposition, are yet under his reign, subject to his control, and compelled, however unwillingly, to promote his grand designs. Providence, in all her manifold movements, obeys his will and works out his designs; creation waits to execute his commands; the stars in their courses fight for him; the lightning, the tempest, the earthquake, are all his servants. His servants continue to prophesy, and he continues to breathe, and thus the work speeds on ; from the past and present we infer the future, and that future shall be glorious. Already the light of the star is being lost in the light of the sun; the light is spreading and throwing its fair mantle over distant China and unaccustomed eyes are lifted up to heaven ; the rays are stretching over distant Africa, and her swarthy sons are bursting the bonds of their iniquity, to revel in the heaven-born liberty of the children of God.

On India the sun is rising, and that darkened theatre of death is glowing beneath the effulgence of gathering day. The tide of glory is full upon the flow, wave after wave of golden light is breaking on the golden strand, and as each crested billow breaks upon earth's shore, leprous devotees leap forth washed and purified to shout the praises of Emmanuel. The voice of Jesus shall again and again be heard saying, "Lazarus come forth;" the divine afflatus shall be communicated and so men rise from the ruins of the fall. They burst the cerements of death and unswathed from all the bands of war, freed from the grave-clothes of superstition that en-wrapped the soul, and vitalized by a life divine, they come. The islands of the sea give up their spiritual dead, and the continents give back the dead that are in them. BURLINGTON .- We feel to regret that we cannot report greater manifestations of God's presence in our midst, and, that throughout the mission there is not a deep-toned piety and devotedness to God, yet God has been very gracious toward us, in that death has not broken the ranks of our little Zion, and in permitting us to enjoy so many delightful seasons of refreshing coming from His presence while worshipping in His sanctuary. Our congregations are good, and the class-meetings well attended. Constituted a mission only at last Conference, we have succeeded beyond the expectations of many. Financially, the mission has done well. A new Parsonage House is now being built near the Burlington Road Church, toward which, something over three hun-In conclusion we feel to dred dollars have been subscribed. thank God and take courage.

BELLEVILLE.-God has been with us to keep us and bless us as well in the private as in the public walks of life. He has cheered us in duty and sustained us in conflict, ofttimes making our hearts to rejoice on account of the light of His countenance. Our religious services have been seasons of refreshing and much spiritual influence. Peace and brotherly love have prevailed among us, so that the world has had this evidence that we are the disciples of Jesus. We record our deep gratitude to the giver of all good, that we have not failed of a single Sabbath Service from sickness, inclement weather, or the want of a congregation. We have had from five to seven religious services on an average, every week ; and for seven weeks we had special services, during which time about forty were lead to decide in favor of God and his cause. About thirty-five have united with us during the year. After allowing for five removals, and eight dropped from our roll, we have an increase of twenty-four. Our Sabbath School is not large, but those who do attend are present nearly every Sabbath, and all our teachers are members of the Church. Several of the larger scholars have been converted during the year. Financially, we have done well, meeting all our expenses for the year with the liberal grant we had from the Conference. On the whole we feel to thank God, and work on in his service.

CAMPBELLFORD.-In reporting the spiritual state of this mission, we find cause for thanksgiving. We have not realized that amount of success in winning souls which we hoped at the beginning of the year, but we have not been without proofs of the power of God to save precious souls. More than twenty have professed to find peace through believing in Jesus. Some have been dropped through unfaithfulness, others have died in full hope of a joyful resurrection, while others have removed to other parts, yet we report a small increase in our membership. Our interest in this prosperous village has largely increased in the last seven months. Our church is too small to hold all who come to hear; many of our friends have increased in their liberality. Our missionary receipts are about \$30 in advance of those of last year. Some of our members are faithful in attending the various means of grace, would that this were true of all. We feel encouraged still to work on and pray on till the Master says, "Well done."

COLBORNE.----The past year has not been so prosperous as we could have ardently desired, but still we feel there is much cause for gratitude to God and much to stimulate us to labor with renewed diligence in the vineyard of the master. At Zion our congregations continue good; the class-meeting a place of power and blessing; and the Sabbath School is conducted with great efficiency, numbering 114 scholars; but death has here entered the ranks of the class and Sabbath School, and taken one at the early age of 14 It may frequently, with propriety, be said, " Death loves a years. shining mark." She left many friends behind to regret the loss of one who was pious, engaging, and affectionate. The special services held, were, upon the whole, connected with gracious influences, the Lord was present to bless, and we had very tangible evidence that our labor was not altogether in vain in the Lord-At Ebenezer our cause is likely to be very seriously affected by removals and death ; during the past two years, 7 have removed, and an old and long tried friend and zealous Sabbath School Superintendent and class leader, has left his family, the class, and school, for a rest in glory. Death found him with his armor on, and with a smiling face he spoke of the fear of death being all gone, and with the glorious city in full view, he gently furled his sails in the haven of rest. The spirit of generous liberality and

loyalty manifested, and the precious seasons enjoyed in the classmeeting, lead us to hope that Ebenezer may yet flourish. At Lake Shore our congregations have increased, and of late the tear of penitence has been seen, and the cry for mercy heard there. Our Missionary Meetings were of a valuable character, and the Missionary receipts \$12.41 in advance of last year. Financially, we are still self-sustaining, and hope by the grace of God to continue so. "Awake, O north wind and come thou south, blow upon my garden, that the spices thereof may flow out. Let my beloved come into his garden and eat his pleasant fruits."

CLINTON.—The public services of the Sanctuary have been of a cheering character. God's presence has been manifested among us, doing us good. Yet the success anticipated at the commencement of the year, has not been realized, owing in part, to the want of suitable help not being furnished us. Nevertheless, some precious souls have sought and found Christ, who now rejoice in his love. We do hope and pray, that we as a station, may soon become self-supporting. O Lord, send us now prosperity.

COLCHESTER .- Our Society is living together in peace; but there is a lack of interest manifested in the Class Meetings-They have not been as well attended as is desirable. Some live at a distance, and the almost impassable state of the roads, at certain seasons of the year, keep them from attending the means of grace ; while others who live nearer the church, do not feel sufficiently interested. The public means of grace are well attended, especially on Sabbath evenings. The day is not far distant when we shall have to enlarge our church. The appointment at Sandwich East, promises well. Some of the people are beginning to speak of building a church; we think steps should be taken to do so, the coming summer. After allowing for removals and unfaithfulness, we report 5 members more than last year. What we most need, is a baptism from on high; may it be speedily realized. Amen.

DEREHAM.—We are sorry to say that we are not able to report any great spiritual prosperity. Special efforts have been made without realizing any accessions to the church, though we have had manifestations of the special presence of God. FENELON .- Our spiritual state is not very interesting; and yet some good has been done, during the year. At two places in :he Mission, we have had "a little renewing" in the church, and ten persons have joined our ranks. We have also been favored generally, with peace within our borders ; but to be consistent with our rules, we have had to drop quite a few members from our Class Books, as absentees from the Sacrament, Class and Prayer Meetings. We think it is not truthful, and therefore not right, to return persons as approved members, who do not, nor will not attend to the rules of our Society. The majority of those dropped, should have been so treated last year. We have lost by removals, ten members ; these, with the expelled, leaves our members a few less than was returned last year ; that is if we do not return Cambray Society, which has united with us since last Conference. The attendance to the ministry, both as to number and regularity, is moderately good, except at the Falls : here we are low. A Sabbath School at Cambray, has been formed during the year, and is doing well; also at Ebenezer, the School is prospering. The other two Schools are somewhat stationary. We have only to repeat what has been said a hundred times before, "We want more of the power of God." Nothing short of this can meet our case.

GREV.—Our societies have neither been thinned by death nor torn by bickerings and strife. Peace ! without an exception, has prevailed among us. Financially we have had a somewhat heavy task to perform ; but united effort has rendered our receipts equal to our disbursements. Our protracted meetings did not result in the amount of visible good that we expected, nor that usually attends such efforts ; nevertheless we were not without heart-cheering manifestations of God's favor and blessing, there being some few dead souls raised to a newness of life in Christ. On the first Sabbath in January last, we commenced morning services in the New Connexion Church, in the village of Brussels, and we think our prospects are sufficiently cheering to warrant an effort to build

a church in said Village. Land has been offered us by two parties, and we think one of the lots to be just in the right place for a church. Our Sabbath School is in a fair condition. On this Mission we suffer much on account of our isolated position. We have some of the most liberal-hearted and warmly-attached members of the church of God that I have met with anywhere, and may God bless them abundantly. Amen.

HUNTINGDON.-Sorrow fills our hearts at the .thought, that so few of Satan's slaves have been emancipated. Our winter's campaign has been long and toilsome. Sometimes victory seemed to perch upon our banner. A little ground was gained, a few captives brought into glorious liberty, but our success has been so small and few, that we blush to speak of them. One of our faithful laborers, BRO. JAS. HARLEY, has gone to his reward. Our loss is his gain. On the other hand, we are led to rejoice that with scarcely any exception, peace and unity prevail among us; and we trust there has been an increase of spiritual life, manifesting itself in a more regular attendance at the public and social means of grace. We are enable to report an increase of 15 members. The parsonage debt has been cancelled ; the debt on Bethel church, Madoc, has been paid off, and provision made for future improvements. Our new Stone Church is so far completed that we have been enabled to hold service in it for some time; the congregation and membership have considerably increased. The present debt is only about \$60, and \$70 or \$100 more will finish it, and then we shall have one of the most comfortable little churches in this part of the country. On account of the excessive drought of last summer, felt, perhaps, more here than in any other part of the Dominion, the consequent hard times, and the efforts above mentioned, the regular finances of the Mission will fall a little behind; but upon the whole, we feel that we have abundant reason to thank God and take courage.

HUNGERFORD has to mourn over a decrease of members, prevailing worldliness, deficient exchequer, and neglect of the private means of grace. - But in the strong attachment of some friends, good congregations, lessened debt on Parsonage and Church, lies ground to hope for better things.

HAMILTON.-In presenting our report, we acknowledge God's care and mercy over us during the past twelve months. In his infinite wisdom, he saw fit to take from us two brethren, viz, Reed and Jones-his death was peaceful and happy ; Reed was one of our most faithful and beloved brethren. Of our Mission in general, it may be said that it is taking form and beginning to develop its power. We are pleased to be able to report, that the friends generally, have been very prompt in their responses to all the calls and claims of the church, made upon them. The following will prove that they have had a mind to work : For repairs and alterations to our church, Quarterly Receipts, Missionary contributions; for the benefit of our Sunday School and Band of Hope, Lighting, cleaning and heating church, they have raised about \$1500. The membership, after allowing for two deaths, and nine removals, is about the same as last year; over this we deeply mourn. We should have been glad to report a geater interest on the part of some of the members, in their attendance to the social means of grace; the too great distance of several friends from church, is perhaps partly the reason of their absence. The public services are well attended ; the congregations have far more than doubled, and often, while engaged in the worship of Almighty God, we have felt most blessedly happy. The Sabbath School is There has probably never been a time since the progressing. origin of the Mission, when there was so much hope as at the present.

INGERSOLL.—Our cause in the Town, during the past year, has suffered considerably through removals. Out of 29 returned last year, 9 (some of them leading members) have moved from the Mission. The chief drawback to this Station has been the irregular manner in which the Sabbath appointments have been supplied. This arises from the fact that both congregations want service at the same hour. We tried to remove the difficulty by giving up the evening appointment at Putnamville, but found that we might as well give up the place altogether. We are fully convinced that the two places cannot be worked by one Minister successfully. On the other hand, we have several things to chronicle of a pleasing character. The year has been an harmonious one ; a few have been admitted into Society ; the Quarterly receipts

have largely increased; the interest on the borrowed money on the property in Ingersoll, has been paid; about \$40 has been raised for furniture for the Parsonage and fixing cellar; and what is best of all, many of the public services and social means of grace have been rich in Divine influence.

LINDSAY .- The year now closed, has not been characterized by any unusual occurrances. We have had many anxieties and fears, but through Divine aid, we have been sustained ; and from past success, we are encouraged to more vigorous, continuous and The year has been one of organization, and prayerful exertion. we have sought to place things on a firm foundation for future successful operations. But despite all our efforts, we have still to mourn over an irregularity of attendance, and in many instances, a want of appreciation of the social means of grace. Many of our members are true to the cause of Christ, but some, we fear, are so nearly spiritually dead, that instead of praises, we hear complainings; instead of labors for the Lord, it takes the preacher on the one side, and the leader on the other, to keep them on their feet, while they grasp the dollar so firmly, that neither the necessities of the Station, or the claims of the Redeemer, will induce them Our congregations in the town and country are to part with it. The Sabbath School is not so prosperous as we could wish, good. principally arising from the want of suitable teachers and funds to The debt on the Church is felt to be a carry it on efficiently. heavy burden, and must be lessened for the comfortable working We have this year rented the seats with tolerably of the station. A few souls have professed faith in Jesus, during good success. the year, and we hope for yet greater blessings.

LAMBETH.—We are living in peace, but not so prosperous as is desirable. The public means of grace, on Sabbath day, are well attended, and at Lambeth, an enlargement of the church, or a new one is greatly needed, to accommodate the people who come. There is not that relish for the private means, with some of the members, that we could wish, but others appreciate their importance and realize their benefit. Our week-night services are few and but thinly attended. We need a continuous and fuller supply of the Sacred unction. 'Age and home duties prevent the pastor from performing that pastoral work which is an essential element of success on all stations.

OSHAWA .- Our record is neither as bad as it might be, nor as good as it ought to be. Hard labor hath been performed and favorable results reached, but not so favorable as would have been if every soldier had fought and every laborer been diligent throughout the day. A minor portion of the society hath been at ease in Zion, and during seven weeks of special services, neither came to offer one prayer for the fallen nor raise one shout over the prey being taken from the mighty. Over this we mourn, as being disastrous to themselves, discouraging to the more earnest and faithful portion, and correspondingly retarding the progress of God's cause. The Church hath been beautified and enlarged, giving additional seating capacity to over 200; the seats in the body of the Church are as fully let as before, and the attendance proportionally good. The liberality of our friends is gradually progressive, evidenced by the fact that the cost of enlargement, amounting to about \$3,000 has been paid to the Treasurer, except \$1,100, and that is covered by subscriptions, to be paid within 12 months. The total monies raised on the station for the year, gives an average of over \$22 per member. The teachers in our Sabbath School, with a solitary exception, are all members of the Church, and have 23 children under their care more than last year. In our special services, 49 persons professed to find the Saviour, 11 of whom are from a distance and other Churches, 20 we return on trial, leaving 18 as a margin, some of whom we hope will prove a substantial gain to the Church. James Brewer, a devoted christian and warmly attached friend of the denomination, at the advanced age of about 90 years, has been called to the mansion of the Master. We have suffered a loss by removal of 17, reporting an increase in the total of 14 more than last year. Our quarterly receipts have equalled our disbursements, with a balance of near-\$30 to the good, and we hope we have now reached the happy position when it is no longer necessary to ask a grant from the Missionary Society. Deploring what is defective and rejoicing in what is good, we resolve on re-consecrating ourselves to God and our work, and to hope for still greater prosperity.

LITTLE PRAIRIE.—We feel we have reason to be very thankful to our Heavenly Father, for the many mercies that have been in our lot. Notwithstanding our heavy loss in the destruction of our new Church by fire, we hope, by the blessing of God, to rise

above our difficulties. Our friends have been remarkably liberal, and the members, with few exceptions, have done nobly in every possible way to rebuild the Church, which is now almost completed. Some few profess attachment to the cause, but manifest little interest in it. Quite a number attend the social means of grace, and make progress in the Divine life. It appears very evident to us that our future welfare and prosperity depends upon erecting suitable places of worship. Our congregations are good, and will, we think, improve as accommodation improves. Numerically, we are in advance of last year, there being an increase of 35. With care and attention, holy living and Christian effort, the missionary expects it to prove a fruitful field.

PERRYTOWN .--- In reviewing the past year we are thankful to God for peace in our borders and a measure of prosperity. Our congregations, on the whole, have been good, and preachers and people have been comforted and strengthened while waiting together in the Sanctuary. The class and prayer-meeting have been moderately well attended, and have been seasons of rich spiritual influence. During the year, one of our old and respected members died in the triumphs of faith. Several have removed from our midst ; yet after making allowance for deaths and removals, we report a small increase; to God's worthy name be the praise. Owing to disappointment in procuring the brick, the erection of the Perrytown Church is postponed until next summer. We hope to be able to pay for the timber, lumber, &c, which is on the ground, without touching the regular subscriptions for the Church ; \$60 has already been raised, and we expect to have the rest before Conference. Our Sabbath Schools are prospering; quite an addition has been made to Providence library ; the attendance is large, and with judicious management the School will do a good work. Perrytown School has a good prospect, having a good library, plenty of funds, and plenty of officers and teachers. Eden School does not advance as it should, owing to a lack of interest by the community. We hope and pray that the Church may soon realize her relationship to the School and do her duty by it; recognizing it as a part of herself, and utilizing all her talent in it. Our hope on this mission is in the Schools.

PICKERING .- We rejoice in saying that the Lord has been with us. During the year the new Church at Duffin's Creek has been erected and dedicated to the worship of God, with a small debt remaining upon it. The new church on our own land, has encouraged our people, and has given the public confidence in us as a denomination. The new church is nearly filled on Sunday We believe the day is not far distant when we shall evenings. be an independent Circuit. There are certain things necessary to give us prosperity in the future, namely, the uniting of Bethel and Providence congregations into the village of Brougham, by erecting a church in the above growing village. We need more prayer and pleading with God. We received a few members during the year, who are in earnest in working out their own salvation with fear and trembling. Lastly, we rejoice in saying that we have peace, great peace in our midst.

PRINCE ALBERT.-We have reason for gratitude to our gracious Master, that our labors have not been in vain in the Lord. Some have yielded to the force of truth, and have sought and found salvation through the Redeemer's blood, and are going on their way rejoicing; while others, we trust, have been stimulated to pursue their heavenly course with increased vigor. After filling up the places of those who have removed, and those who have been dropped, our statistical table shows an increase of 23 mem-Efforts have been made, during the year, to improve our bers. church property. A new church has been built at Cæsarea, at a cost of \$800, and the entire amount has been raised or provided for by subscriptions. At Bethesda, the shed has been finished and the debt paid off, to the credit of the few who took the work in hand. At Bethany, the interior of the church has been painted, and otherwise improved, and a new shed built, costing \$155; and the whole has been provided for, leaving a small balance in hand for further improvement. The debt on the Prince Albert church has been reduced \$15.50; \$50 has also been paid toward the debt on the house. Our Quarterly Receipts suffer considerably for want of regularity in paying, on the part of some of our members, but on the whole, our finances are in a healthy state. We feel to thank God and take courage.

PALMERSTON.—This Mission was opened in September last, in answer to a pressing request from several Bible Christians re-

siding in the neighborhood. Three places were at once opened for preaching; the congregations were good, and two classes formed, with 18 members, including 3 on trial. Most of those are still united with us, and are "contending for the faith once delivered to the saints," and have done all in their power to make Some have grown weary in well our Mission here a success. doing, others have sunk beneath the wave of worldly cares ; yet the God of our salvation has not left us without visible tokens of His approval. People more intent on hearing the Word, I never saw, and some few souls have been led to seek and have found the Pearl of great price. Our losses have been more than made up. We are now in the midst of building our new church, 36x40, on a lot, said by all who have seen it, to be as good as any in the village. We begged all the rough lumber and a considerable amount in cash and goods for a Bazaar. The church when finished will be worth \$1000, and we see our way clear to all we need, except \$200, which amount the Trustees have decided to borrow for 3 years. We intend to build a Parsonage as soon as we can get the Owing to want of a room, we have not been able to material. hold any special services during the winter, or we have no doubt our numbers would have been much larger. Pray for Palmerston.

P. E. ISLAND.—The Missions here are reported in a prosperous condition, especially Summerside.

SUTTON .- A review of the year constrains us to "Thank God and take courage," for while we have not realised all we had anticipated, and have not been blessed with any very extensive outpouring of the Holy Spirit, yet our efforts have not been in vain in the Lord, and the year has been one of consolidation and extension. In Sutton the church has been painted, two sheds erected for the convenience of teams, the property suitably fenced and a side walk laid down from the main street to it. An Organ has also been purchased and facilities provided for the working of the In the Egypt settlement, a School House was Sabbath School. purchased and fitted up for a church at a cost of \$150, part of which has been paid; a good congregation has been gathered, a society formed, and the prospect for extended usefulness is good. At the Georgina appointment another school house at a cost of \$90, has been converted into a sanctuary, a class has been organised, which bids fair to succeed. Bell-Haven presents an encouraging aspect. Although our services were held in a Tavern hall the congregations have exceeded our most sanguine expectations, and with a Church (which we hope soon to erect), our cause will be established. Pefferlaw and Bethel present their usual appearance, yet excite our hopes for a brighter future. Our Sabbath Schools are prospering, our congregations improved, our finances healthy, our societies living in peace, and we are resolved to work for the Master until he calls us to his reward.

ST. THOMAS.—The past year has been a time of hard labor and anxious toil. From various causes we have suffered some defeats; but in the name of the Lord we have obtained some decided victories over sin and the devil, when the slain of the Lord have been many. The power of God's grace has been in our midst converting and sanctifying the people, so that they realize "that old things are passed away, and all things are become new." Although there has been 11 removals and several have been left off, we return an increase of 36 members over last year. Our financial success has exceeded our expectations. We have taken up an appointment in a Schoolhouse three miles west of the town. The Sunday School is in a prosperous condition; it has increased about 100 scholars during the year.

TORONTO .- The past has been a year of anxiety and toil, marked by Divine aid and much to encourage. The God whom we adore and serve, has been to us strength in our weakness, and wisdom in our ignorance; and the generosity of the Bible Christian Executive, in sanctioning and so liberally aiding in the erection of our spacious and elegant Church edifice on Agnes-street, has placed us under great and lasting obligation to the body to which we owe our ecclesiastical existence. We have sustained much loss from removals; and, as inseparable from planting a new mission, fish of every kind have been taken in the net, many of which have presently, when found bad, to be cast away. Still, we are thankful to be able to report a membership of 70 now, compared with 44 a year ago; and our present members give promise of greater reliability than at any previous time. A large proportion of the membership are regular attendants upon the social and public means of grace, and the class meetings are usually well attended. The Sunday Schools are,

on the whole, prosperous. Agnes-street School is steadily increasing in numbers and interest, and its regular attendance has now reached 130; while Lippincott-street now contains a less migratory and otherwise more reliable staff of officials and pupils than formerly. The two schools now number 226, against 155 last year. Our congregations at Agnes-street are considered good for so young a cause, and appear to be steadily increasing, at least 350 to 400 being in attendance every Sabbath evening, and from the number of seats rented, we may safely calculate upon a steady growth in this respect. A Lodge of Good Templars was opened last November, at Lippincott, which has done a good work, and has greatly benefitted our cause ; and, from the steadily, and we may say rapidly, increasing population in the neighbourhood, we trust that our darkest days as to that part of the mission are gone by. An interesting Band of Hope is in successful operation at Agnes-street. The finances of the mission are satisfactory. We are now hopeful that, by the fostering care of the denomination, and the blessing of God, we shall, in a few years, rise to be a source of strength and support in the great future of the Connexion's operations.

UXBRIDGE.—Another year of our work and earthly sojourn is ended. We have endeavoured to be diligent in our Master's work, yet our labours have not been blessed with so much success as we fondly hoped. This however, we can say, that the congregations are better, *i.e.* larger and more established than they were at the close of the last year; that we have admitted 20; our increase in membership is ten; and that some of the friends have given very liberally for the support of the Gospel among them. We are purposing to re-build Zion, and establish regular preaching there. That will take but one appointment from Uxbridge in a month. Our Sunday School is prospering, yet we have suffered numerically through removals, and other schools changing their time of meeting. The Societies are living in peace and harmony. The social means are seasons of refreshing. We are praying for a much larger increase of spiritual power and prosperity.

feel truly grateful to our Heavenly Father for health and strength equal to our toil. We have not been laid aside from our work by ill health, but have toiled on amid many difficulties. A few have sought Jesus and found him to the joy of their souls, others are still seeking and enquiring, while the great majority of those who hear of him reject him, and many others will neither hear or read his word, but live on in sin. We have taken up one fresh place but preach there only on week evenings. The congregations, particularly in the villages are good, and at Wiarton, with the influx of population steadily increasing. The Sabbath School is doing well, but the Wednesday evening's Bible Class is not so well attended as it ought to be. It is a lamentable fact that Bible Classes, Prayer and Class Meetings, &c., are held at a discount by the people generally. The Temperance cause through the winter has moved on and received many adherents, and so has the cause of intemperance. Four licensed taverns in our little village are dealing out death to all comers. We have a part of the material on the ground for the new church in the village, but have to move cautiously for want of funds, as we do not intend to go in debt. We hope the Conference will help us in this matter. We, as a Denomination, have suffered considerably, both numerically and financially, from the fact that since last Conference, four additional Preachers are employed within the limits of the station, and some of our supporters have gone back to their old friends.

WINDSOR.—It was not until March 4th, 1874, that we became incorporated with the Bible Christian Denomination. We are not able to give such a glowing report as some of our friends in other places, yet while they have been blest with the streams of Divine grace, "coming from the presence of the Lord," we have felt the droppings of the shower. Believers have been quickened, some are enjoying the blessing of sanctification, while others are seeking to obtain it. Sinners have also felt the force of the Divine power, two have stepped into liberty, while others are trying to stretch out the "withered hand." Our success greatly depend upon our having a Church. Our people, like the captive Jews, "have a mind to work." There is a great field for labour here, for out of two thousand Methodists as returned in the assessment statistics for the year, there is only church accommo-

dation for one half that number, beside the multitude who seek their happiness in pleasure, and the desecration of the Sabbath. "May the God of all grace" supply us with all necessary mercies.

The following Statistical Table shows that the Society employs 40 Itinerant Preachers, assisted by 70 Local Preachers, who preach in 78 churches, with 51 other preaching places; 21 have been removed by death, 175 migrated, 204 remain on Trial for membership, 1921 members, 2125 Total, 408 Teachers, 3131 Scholars ; showing an increase of I Itinerant, I Local Preacher, 7 Churches, 3 other preaching places, 1 death, 50 on Trial, 153 approved members, 203 Total, 34 Teachers and 438 Scholars.
