London, Mar. 18.-British troops, continuing their rapid advance on the heels of the retiring Germans, have oc cupied the important towns of Nesle, Chaulnes andPeronne
Along a front of about forty-five miles they havevintired the German positions to a depth of ten miles in places. In addition, the British have taken over sixty villages. cial report tonight from British headquarters. The statement follows:
"We have occupied Nesle, Chaulnes and Peronne. Pressing back the enemy's rear guards we advanced several miles during the past 24 hours to a depth of ten miles in
places on a front of approximately forty-five miles, from south of Chaulnes to the neighborhood of Arras. "During this period, in addition to the towns above mentioned we gained possession of over 60 villages.
"Two enemy raiding parties reached our trenches in th night northeast of the Vermelles area.
"There was great activity in the air yesterday, a number of large enemy formations were engaged by our machines and dispersed. In the course of the fighting seven
hostile airplanes were brought down and nine others were hosilie airplanes were brought down and nine others were
