Farm and Garden.

September 21st.

From the American Agriculturist for September. In laying down a piece of land to grass finish the dead furrows with the shovel, leaving them broad and shallow, so that the mower runs easily over them, while the water is carried off as thoroughly as in a narrow furrow.

Finish digging the early potatoes, before rains cause them to sprout. Keep the later kinds free from weeds, and by running a narrow cultivator through the rows, by hand-pulling.

Backwater is easily injured by frost, and should be cut in good season. As it shells easily, cut with the dew upon it, let it cure in small, loose bunches, and draw it to the barn when slightly moist.

Stock should receive good care through this month. Summer heats still prevail, and hard work continues. Horses and oxen deserve good feeding and regular watering.

ORCHARD AND FRUIT GARDEN. The picking and marketing of early fall fruit is now in order. Special care should be taken in handling early varieties of apples and pears; slight bruises lead to speedy decay.

Send only the best fruit to market, well packed, and don't waste the rest, but preserve by drying. The patent dryers are being improved each year, and of all sizes and prices, and there is now no excuse for season fruit.
