The protest against the election of Col. Higinbotham for North Wellington makes but slow progress before the Speaker. The redoubtable Jacobs went to Ottawa last week to give evidence with respect to validity of his security. We are informed that he had no real estate registered anywhere in the Dominion, but that he owned a farm in Arthur Township, near-Kenilworth; that this farm was worth \$3,500, having been offered \$3,000 for it a day or two previous; that he bought this farm from Geo. A. Drew, and got a deed for it about a year and a half ago, but did not recollect who witnessed said document or when it took effect. He also gave the same evidence in reference to a piece of property in Mount Forest, known as the Allan and Fiddes Survey, claiming to hold that property jointly with Drew, and to have a join deed from him, but not registered. An application was made by the sit-ting member's counsel to the Speaker for an order to produce these deeds, but he refused to gran t it.

DOMINION PARLIAMENT.

OTTAWA, April 26.

At the opening of the House on Saturday, Mr. E. B. Mr. Mackenzie then suggested that some general system should be pursued by the Department with respect to lighthouses. He thought the surveys and the charts of the Imperial Government must supply the information necessary for carrying out some plan.

The vote was then agreed to.

On the vote for fisheries, Mr. J. Young called attention to the disproportionate sum spent on Nova Scotia fisheries, as compared with the revenue derived therefrom. The wardens and overseers in that Province were, he pointed att, more numerous than in any other Province, but the revenue was little or nothing.

In answer to an allusion of the previous speaker, Mr. Mackenzie pointed out that it was not fair to charge Ontario with the whole sum spent in that Province, as a large amount was attributable to the fish-breeding establishment of Mr. Wilmott, whence ova was supplied to the whole Dominion.
