NO MORTGAGE COVENANT

With a view to meet the public wish the Toronto Land and Loan Company offers its lands for sale at the reduced prices of the day, and without the usual personal covenants.

It is a surrender of the claim for the mortgage covenant. We believe that the mortgage covenant must go or be greatly modified. If it goes certain results will follow.

The loan companies may advance less on land than they do under the personal covenant, and that larger cash payments will be required in land transactions. But on the whole these changes are desirable for all parties concerned.

The real danger to the loan companies is that the land may at times through decline in values fail to realize the amount advanced on it, and if a change in the law would bring about a real protection to the companies and to their debtors holders.

We also take this circular of Mr. Harvey's company to mean that they consider themselves advanced enough to look after themselves without special legislation. Why should the man who sells land or buys mortgages have a privilege and a protection above any other seller or buyer? Equal rights to all, special privileges to none, applies to those who deal in land as well as to others, or rather it should do.

WHO SELECTED OTTAWA?

The Empire yesterday morning had a dispatch from Ottawa in which it was stated that steps were being taken to purchase Forbes' portrait of Sir John A. Macdonald as a present to Her Majesty, and in remembrance of his recommendations as the Canadian capital. A gentleman of the Civil Service tells us that he well remembers the reception of the news by Sir Edmund Head at the old government house, which stood on the site of that now occupied by Mr. Kirkpatrick, and he is positive that Sir John Macdonald had nothing whatever to do with the selection of Ottawa as the capital. Local jealousy ran high, but it may be imagined that Sir Edmund Head gave the impression of a man who had his own mind made up.

Some months ago a rival company started in business in opposition to the Montreal Gas Company. Simultaneously with this decision comes the announcement that the old company has decided to reduce the price of gas from \$1.20 for illuminating purposes and \$1.30 for cooking down to \$1.00 all round. This reduction is the result of competition, or threatened competition, for \$1.20 to 95 cents is a big drop to make to one cent. It is a reduction of 21 per cent. We do not believe in competition where a regulated monopoly is possible. Competition has its disadvantages as well as its merits. If a gas company, with certain competition staring it in the face, can manage to distribute gas at 95 cents, it becomes a pertinent question to know what price it could afford to charge with the competitive element eliminated. The Consumers Gas Company of Toronto enjoys a monopoly of the business here, and under these conditions it can afford to sell cheaper than either of the Montreal companies. When the Consumers Gas Company holds its next annual meeting, as it will in a few weeks, the shareholders will act in its own interests, and head off a lot of future trouble by reducing the price of gas to 80 cents.
