
So much has been said as to the efficiency or otherwise of ball bearings, for wagons as to give special value to Pro-fessor Sweet's remark recently in The Rural New Yorker, viz., that such bear-Rural New Yorker, viz., that such bear-ings are successful only when the balls themselves are of the highest quality and the shells and axles are of the best steel, hardened and ground to the high-est perfection. He says that the limit of error in the best does not vary more than one-quarter of one-thousandth of an inch or one-fourth the thickness of tis than one-quarter of one-thousandth of an inch, or one-fourth the thickness of tis-sue paper, perfection of this kind being very costly, especially as the least dirt destroys the whole gain, for if the balls are stopped by any impediment they are very soon runned; and, as such accurate work is not likely to be suit. Diamond Hall accurate work is not likely to be suitably protected or properly cared for in farm vehicles, it is questionable whether the failures would not more than overbalance the advantages.
