United States Minutes.

CONSCITED BY USONA

The Treasury Department, circular of July 1, giving the exchange values of foreign coins shows the dollar is the unit of value in several countries and that the worth of this unit in U.S. coin varies considerably. The Dollar of British North America, British Honduras and of Liberia is worth \$1.00 gold U. S., that of Newfoundland \$1.014, while those of silver standard countries, such as Hongkong, Straits Settlements and Labuan (Mexican dollars), and Mexico are worth \$0.476. The Peso, often stated to be equivalent to a dollar is pretty nearly equivalent to a Mexican dollar in the silver standard South American countries, but in Uruguay (gold standard) it is equivalent to \$1.034 U. S. This should be remembered in estimating the cost of dealers' advertised bargains, a one cent stamp of Johore, for instance, advertised o. g. at two cents, is being sold at over four times its face value, and so on in proportion. When sending money to foreign countries under this unit, \$1 Canadian or U. S. should purchase over \$2 face value of stamps.

The South Carolina Interstate and West Indian Exposition, having been denied a special set of stamps, has gotten out a brilliant bi-colored sticker, after the style of the Buffalo ones advertised so freely. It is diamond shaped, vermillion ground lettering, with a centre view in dark blue of the Isle of Palms.

The J. M. Bartels Co., warn dealers and collectors against Z. K. Dowse of Mahwah, N. J., and Class Dover, 3025 East 6th St., Kansas City, Mo. They are alleged to have obtained stamps on approval and to have made no returns for them.

The Nebruska Philatelist, a promising monthly, has yielded up the ghost; cause: failure to get a transfer of second class rates from Hastings to Omaha.

The neat rubber stamp "R. F. D." cancellation of the Rural Free Delivery is beginning to appear frequently in the mails.

The Dodgeville-Mineral Point (Wisconsin) mail route probably enjoys the distinction of costing the government as little as any. One cent per year pays the contractor for hauling the mails 18 miles every day, except Sundays, rain or shine.

A badly arranged monthly, with reprinted articles and "shaky" advertisements, has been sending me sample copies for a month or two, and recently forwarded one with a paragraph conspicuously marked with ink. This was to the effect that they had concluded to discontinue the sending of sample copies, and intimated quite

plainly that they expected 25c by return mail. The sample copy fiend is worthy of anything evil that could be done to him, even of the dark and terrible punishments conceived by the editor of the Adhesive, but is the publisher worthy of better treatment who, without request from a victim, seeks to establish a color of a claim upon his generosity by forwarding successive copies of a valueless publication, and boldly makes a demand for a subscription?

When the Scott? Stamp and Coin Company in their announcement of the new album, conclude the abandonment of space for the foreign cut square envelopes and wrappers they bring one step nearer the time when printed albums will be the exception instead of the rule. The collector of entires will take it for a token that his part of the science is waxing prominent, but really there is nothing of the kind indicated, as the envelopes and wrappers are left entirely out, and will require a separate album. Printed albums are becoming useless, thel collector who has a large enough Scollection to make a respectable showing in one of the International albums uses a blank album, and the printed albums are bought by beginners and as presents, to be abandoned when the uselessness of attempting to get a complete collection comes before the philatelist. One thousand stamps in a blank album look far better than 5000 in one of the last edition of the International. The Standard catalogue is the key that should be used to classify and arrange, and a pencil note of the catalogue number will enable ready reference to a cut and description in a portable shape.

The U.S. government will issue new documentary stamps in about thirty days.

It is declared impossible to wash the stamps without being detected instantly, as they change color. The new stamps will be a grayish drab. The denomination of the stamps will be printed in figures on different colors, each denomination having a different color of its own.

Recently a communication was sent from the post office department at Ottawa, Can. to Washington asking if the United States postal authorities regarded the Philippines as coming under the domestic postal rate, or, in other words, whether the Philippines were United States territory, and the reply was in the affirmative. Accordingly today the Canadian postal authorities issued a notification to all postmasters that on and after the 1st of October next the domestic rate will apply to Porto Rico, Hawaii, Guam, the Philippines and the American Islands of the Samoan group.

The peculiarity of this order is that while the distance from Canada to the Philippines is twice that from Canada to Great Britain, the postal rate to the latter is just double that to the Philippines. To Great Britain it is 2 cents per half ounce, while to the Philippines it will be 2 cents per ounce.—Washington Star. 9-8-00.

Ewen's News contains the interesting information that the 2½d blue, Cape of Good Hope, has been surcharged in three lines:

ORANGE RIVER COLONY.

It is reported that minor varieties exist, consisting of letters slightly above or below the rest of the word. A correspondent states that he has seen the surcharge with the period after "COLONY" missing. Are we now to be favored with an entire new set of surcharges on Cape stamps?—Weekly Era.

Information.

In plate 262 of the one cent periodical the division lines meet in a focus over V in the word "Engraving" in the imprint; also in plate 269 of the two cent periodical while on plate 100 the point of focus is between A and V.

The reprints of 1875 were perforated 12, notwithstanding the fact that the reprints of 1856-61 were 15.

The first year that International money orders were sold to British Guiana, 84 were drawn for a total value of \$1249.57 and 279 paid for \$2724.56.

The U. S. has a post office in China, at Shanghai. Five cent stamps are the ones most used. For shipment there the stamps are placed in specially constructed tin boxes to keep them from sticking and becoming ruined.

I recently saw a copy of the 3c, 1870 with the grill covering the entire stamp.

700,00 of the 5 sen and 14,300,000 of the 2 sen Japanese Silver Wedding stamps were issued.

The manufacture of letter sheets was discontinued on August 30, 1894 by the order of the Postmaster-General.

Postmasters in the United States are not permitted to arrange for fictitious canceling of stamps, thereby gaining personal profit for themselves and the purchaser at the expense of the department.

I have several copies of envelopes addressed to me with only the post mark upon them. They were mailed in a small town where I spent the summer by an employee of the P. O. and put in my box without a postage stamp of any kind. If they are of any value I would be pleased to hear from any one interested in them.

Selected Paragraphs.

BY JOHN PELTZ.

I herewith present my readers with a few extracts from various old issues of philatelic papers, accompanied with comments on them by the author, i. e. myself. The fact is that any philatelic paper can profitably clip some short notes, or good articles from old files of philatelic journals; there are always new readers among us, and the old ones may have read years ago. Although there are many who will not he itate to criticise me in taking this step, I hope this article will not be left out in the cold, but that ye editor will deign to accept it.

The Pomeroy local stamps were cancelled with a red ink very similar to that occasionally found on early issues of U. S. adhesives. Lock out for those cancelled in any officer way, as they are likely to be forgeries.—Adam Dollard.

These stamps are quite a temptation to the torger, as the value of used specimens runs from \$1.50 to \$30.00. The values and catalogue value of used and unused copies is as follows:

Pomeroy's Letter Express, 1843 unused used 5c black, on yellow paper \$5.00 \$1,50 3.00 10.00 5c blue 1.50 5.00 Se black 10.00 25.005c red 5c black yellow paper value erased 30.00 Thus it can easily be seen what a profit can be made by the unscrupulous, if they buy the 5c blue, 5c black and 5c red in unused condition, and put a cancellation on them. If you want to buy these stamps

used it would be well to exercise caution,

otherwise you may be duped into buying

faked stamps.

The overprint on the 1876 issue of Turkey is different for each denomination. The catalogue would make one believe that all have the same surcharge. The difference lies only in the lower horizontal group of characters.—A. D. Schoch.

Anyone wishing to know the difference of surcharge in each stamp has only to buy the entire set, and they are within the reach of the average collector. It seems queer that illustrations of each surcharge is not included in Scott's catalogue perhaps it is due to an oversight; anyway they ought to be illustrated in Scott's, as there are some collectors who imagine that each kind of surcharge exists in all the other values, thus making out that there are five varieties for each value, whereas there is only one, thereby getting things all mixed up.

The 3c orange of 1893 issue of Argentine is now obsolete (July, 1898) not being in use any more; remainders were burned and not sold to dealers.—G. A. Hunt.

Some collectors believe that as the 3c orange watermarked "large sun with rays' was in use only a few months they will soon advance in value. By the way, no 3c value is included in the recent issue, and thereby I conclude that there is no occasion for such a stamp.

The time for the usual annual crop of papers which appear from Canada is at hand. During the past month we have received the Canada Stamp Sheet, from Quebec, Que., the Canadian Philatelic Magazine from Toronto, Ont., and Philatelic Fun, is announced from Berlin, Ont. It is rumored that another paper is to appear from Montreal shortly, under the management of a prominent cellector.

EDITORIAL OPINIONS.

Prancing about on the roof of the back wood shed; wildly fanning the air with a stuffed club; grinding its new teeth together with a noise like a stone-process flour mill, and yelling like the steam piano in a circus—this metaphorically speaking represents our esteemed contemporary the Montreal Philatelist—all because of a little victory the Advocate gained by securing permission from the Postmaster General for Canadian papers to publish cuts of stamps. Our success would not be so galling to the editor of the M. P. if he had not failed to get the desired permission.

In its May number the M. P. in a four column editorial intimates that it will take no farther notice of personalities. that sime it has indulged more than ever in "rag chewing" with its contemporaries. While we do not claim any great honor for the victory we secured there is nevertheless a little satisfaction in knowing that we did not openly violate the laws of our country. Sec. 86 of the P. O. Act, as published in July M. P., reads "Every one who..... imitates any po. age stamp.....except by permission of the Postmaster General, is guilty of felony and liable to imprisonment for life" etc. The editor of the M. P. wrote to the P. M. G. for permission but did not get it. His letter was merely acknowledged by the Secretary. We did not "run the risk of prosecution" but kept fighting quietly until we had the permission of the proper authorities. Judging by the numerous controversies engaged in by the editor of the M.
