Sir:-
I am writing to ask if you would kindly give the attached form your earnest consideration and, if agreeable, to sign and return to me at your convenience.

The object in view is to group Forty (40) of the best available musicians in this City, who are ready and willing to give their time and services without payment, and to give a Series of Six (6) Orchestral Symphonic Concerts, Two (2) each month starting in March, with the idea of gaining the feeling of the public for a larger organization next year, an organization that will be worthy of lfontreal.

Publicity and help has already been promised by the Press and these Concerts would be given under the auspices of the different Societios and Clubs such as, "Kiwanis", "Rotary", "Lions", "Womens Canadian", "Knights of Columbus" and others. The above is to try and encourage the largest possible interest in every way to Symphonic Music and at the same time assure success.

The estimated cost of these Concerts would be about Seven Hundrod (700) Dollars each and from the experience gained from the Concerts given by the Band of the Canadian Grenadier Guards, where with poor management the receipts amounted to about Six Hundred(600)Dollars, I feel sure that this present organization can and will prove a success.

However, as the musicians are devoting their time free and as music is their livingy they could not pay any loss, therefore, I am asking about prominent citizens to help as guarantors should there be any losse

In the event of these Concerts turning in a profit, such money would be distributed amongst the musicians as renumoration for their services.

So far, my plan has been endorsed by General F. S. Meighen, Sir H. Vincent Meredith, Bt., F.E. Meredith, K.C., Sir Hormidas Iaporte, Lady Drummond and otherse

My aim is also to prove that such an enterprise as this can be mado essentielly a CANADIAN one, and that amongst our own musicians there is enough talent to fomm an Orchestra of the very highest class and, with the support of the public at all times, it can, in a few years be compared with any visiting Orchestra whether from the United States or elsewhere.

As a rule these Orchestras are composed almost entirely of foreigners, therefore positions, encouragement, and money gres to people who have no interest whatsoever in our

Country, while our own men, absolutely as good musicians, are practically starving and mostly from want of encouragement. Therefore, I would esteem it a very great favour if you could help me with this project, and should you desire to see the endorsements of the parties mentioned or wish for any more information I am at your Ieisure.


In consideration of the object and aim of a Series of SixConcerts to be aiven by an Orchestra which shall be known by the name of
as explained by J.J. Gagnier, (Organizer and Conductor) and fully understood by me, I do hereby agreo, that should the Concerts prove a loss, I will protect and pay a sum, up to and incluaing, but not more than ONE HUNDRED (100) Dollars, on the complete Series of Siz-Concerts.

It is also understood that I will only be called upon to pay my proportion of the loss, if any, on the whole series of Concerts, such proportion being based on the total number of Guarantors at ONE HURDRED (100) Dollars each.

It is further understood and agreed that expenses are to be kept at a minimum and that after each concert I am to receive a full statement of receipts and disbursements.
