The object in view is to group Forty (40) of the best available musicians in this City, who are ready and willing to give their time and services without payment, and to give a Series of Six (6) Orchestral Symphonic Concerts, Two(2) each month starting in March, with the idea of gaining the feeling of the public for a larger organization next year, an organization that will be worthy of Montreal.

Publicity and help has already been promised by the Press and these Concerts would be given under the auspices of the different Societies and Clubs such as, "Kiwanis", "Rotary", "Lions", "Womens Canadian", "Knights of Columbus" and others.

The above is to try and encourage the largest possible interest in every way to Symphonic Music and at the same time assure success.

The estimated cost of these Concerts would be about Seven Hundred (700) Dollars each and from the experience gained from the Concerts given by the Band of the Canadian Grenadier Guards, where with poor management the receipts amounted to about Six Hundred (600) Dollars, I feel sure that this present organization can and will prove a success.

However, as the musicians are devoting their time free and as music is their living, they could not pay any loss, therefore, I am asking about resty (48) prominent citizens to help as guaranters should there be any loss.

In the event of these Concerts turning in a profit, such money would be distributed amongst the musicians as renumeration for their services.

So far, my plan has been endorsed by General F.S. Meighen, Sir H. Vincent Meredith, Bt., F.E. Meredith, K.C., Sir Hormidas Laporte, Lady Drummond and others.

My aim is also to prove that such an enterprise as this can be made essentially a CANADIAN one, and that amongst our own musicians there is enough talent to form an Orchestra of the very highest class and, with the support of the public at all times, it can, in a few years be compared with any visiting Orchestra whether from the United States or elsewhere.

As a rule these Orchestras are composed almost entirely of foreigners, therefore positions, encouragement, and money goes to people who have no interest whatsoever in our

Country, while our own men, absolutely as good musicians, are practically starving and mostly from want of encouragement.

Therefore, I would esteem it a very great favour if you could help me with this project, and should you desire to see the endorsements of the parties mentioned or wish for any more information I am at your leisure.
