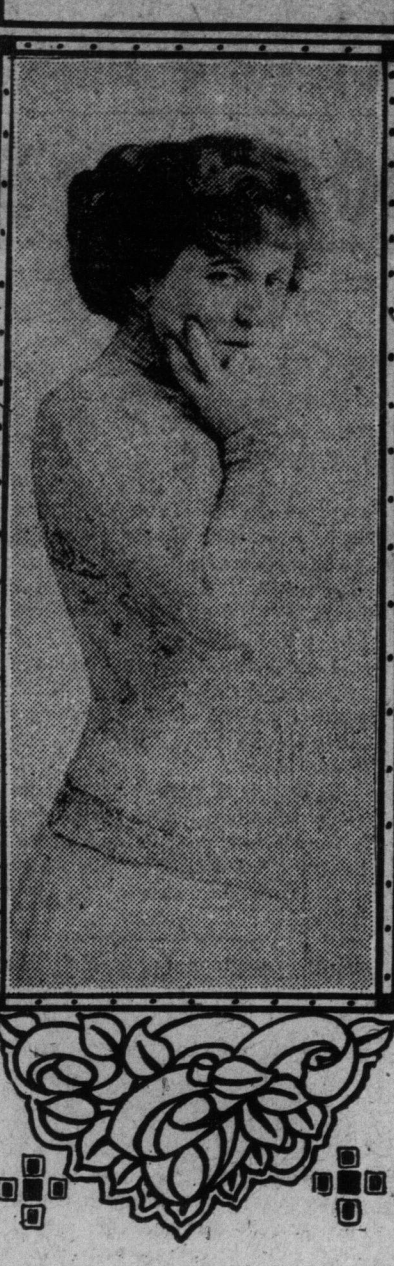

MAYOR HOCKEN WAS CHEERED AT RAPID TRANSIT MEETING CALLED BY HIS OPPONENTS

Chairman Ellis of Anti-Purchase Association Compelled to Pause in His Speech at Mayor's Entry — Hecklers Forced Foster to Sit Down — Judge Jefferies of Detroit Evidently Not Conversant With Toronto Situation.

The Royal Grenadiers' band, a Detroit judge and the anti-street railway purchase candidates were not sufficient to attract enough people to fill the main floor of the Malsey Hall at the Toronto Rapid Transit Association meeting on Saturday night.

On entering the hall one might have been led to at first think it was an anti-purchase meeting by a huge banner across the back of the platform bearing the following: "If you are opposed to the street railway deal vote for Foster."

It was an "anti-purchase" meeting, at which Chairman Ellis, president of the Toronto Rapid Transit Association, was forced to discontinue his speech thru the wild cheering which greeted the unexpected entrance of Mayor Hocken, and a meeting at which Controller Foster's attempted speech on the street railway question was spoiled by a rapid succession of remarks from all quarters of the hall.

That Judge Jefferies, advertised as a Detroit public ownership expert, and who was brought here to convince the Toronto people that buying the street railway would be against the interests of public ownership, did not understand the true situation became more and more apparent as he unknowingly made statements which strengthened the arguments of the anti-purchase party.
