HELEN RICE NOW AT HOME

She escaped from a Montreal convent and turned up at her home in New Brunswick, N.J. May 22—Miss Helen Rice, who caused a sensation in this city last November by fleeing with her father, Dr. J. W. Rice, to escape the decree of the court, surprised her friends yesterday by unexpectedly arriving in town. She had been in a convent at Montreal, where she had been placed by her father when she was 16 years old and good looking, was removed from the custody of her parents by Vice-Chancellor Rice on the ground that they were not competent persons to care for her.

The proceedings to have a guardian appointed were instituted by Mrs. John Woodbridge of this city, Miss Rice's aunt. It was alleged that both Dr. Rice and his wife were intemperate users of morphine and heroin. A few hours after the court had appointed Mrs. James Demarest, of Queen's, L.I., as guardian of Miss Rice the young woman fled to her father's home in New Brunswick, N.J. WEEK'S MUNICIPAL REVIEW

IT HAS BEEN A TIME OF FEARS AND QUARLS

Economy With a Vengeance Has Been the Daily Order—Parling and Having the Estimates—For Sweet Charity's Sake Has Lost its Charm—The Salary Here, Next Week.

"Cut down" has been the watchword during the week, as the Board of Control, day by day, took up the consideration of the estimates. To the ordinary civic official, next to the municipal election and organization of the council, the adoption of the estimates is the greatest event in the official year. As soon as the various chairmen of committees get firmly seated in the middle, work on estimates commences, and from that hour his energies are devoted towards the attainment of two great objects, first, to get the largest appropriation possible placed to the credit of the department; and next, to see that it is spent before the end of the year. Sweetly, of course—but speedily. In this he generally, with rare exceptions, receives the most cordial support of the officials of his department, and his popularity in a very great measure depends upon the diplomatic skill which he evinces in pulling through with the least possible loss of "fat" when proposed by the Board of Control. "Fertility of resource and plausibility of excuse are of inestimable value when any particular item is insisted upon by a wealthy member of the board, and many amusing instances have occurred where the alert chairman, dexterously prompted by his official satellite, has been able by means of excuse, more or less relevant, to steer the bark off the rock.

"Strike out" the item has been allowed to stand in many cases, not because the Board of Control was "convinced" of its utility, or necessity, but lack of technical knowledge has compelled them to throw up the sponge under the well directed, time honored "bluff" of "interests of the city."

A special committee of council has attempted to reduce the grants to charities to a systematic basis. In many cases the departure from the haphazard way of making such grants in a lump sum as it is split up, resulted in a very large reduction. The result has been that the Board of Control has been besieged by deputations of ladies and gentlemen, all of whom have most affecting stories to tell in connection with their work. The board, however, has taken all such appeals on deliberative and appellate have gone away in perplexity. Below that mark, while only in one year did the maximum height exceed 30 inches.

The third nine years (1871-79) include almost an entire year below zero mark, and in every year the lowest reached was below zero, while the very highest reached was 41 inches above.

During the winter of 1881-82, only four times did the record show a lower yearly minimum than zero, while in two years the maximum was 40 inches or above, and in two other years 40 inches was not reached.

In the last six years (1891-96) the general decline in level repeats. "Every year, excepting the first, shows a decline in level below zero, and in 1895 no month reached zero, the very highest water reached at any observation last year being an inch and a half below.

This was on May 18th. The record of monthly averages during 1896 was as follows, all inches below zero:

The recent low water period is no doubt phenomenal. The average level of 1896 was as much as two and a half inches below zero.

The only other instance of an annual average level below zero was in 1879, when the year by man was 4.8 inches below zero.

The highest yearly average since 1850 was 20.5 in 1858. Since the latter only two years have exceeded 11 inches.

It is thus seen that the lake has in the present year fallen and greatly during the past 40 years. For a clearer realization of the extent of the change, the following average heights are given:

TESLA HAS TRIUMPHED.

His Light is Perfect—The Human Hand Photographed Accurately—Lamp Perfectly Discovers

New York, May 22.—Nikola Tesla has solved the problem which he set before himself many years ago, and which will revolutionize the system of electric lighting. It is, electrical experts say, the nearest perfect adaptation of the great force of nature to the use of man.

In Mr. Tesla's laboratory, in Housatonic-street, is a bulb not more than three inches in length, which, when the current turns into it becomes a ball of light. The heat is almost imperceptible. With it a very large room is so lighted that it is possible to read in any corner. Yet this is done without the attachment of any wires to the existing lights.

The bulbs are so strong that the sharpest photographs may be taken by them. No new dynamo is required to produce the current. The bulb is attached to a wire connected with the street current. There is no danger of harmful shocks in its use.

Mr. Tesla has been working for many years on his theory of the necessity and the practicality of the conservation of electrical energy. The present incandescent light gives only three per cent. efficiency. The other ninety-seven per cent. is wasted in heat.

The bulb which he has perfected gives ten per cent. of light and loses ninety per cent. of energy. Mr. Tesla declares that he will, with a few more experiments, be able to produce forty per cent. of light. The waste will be reduced to only sixty per cent., or thirty-seven per cent. less than at present.

The principle of light is vibration. The illumination is secured by means of what Mr. Tesla terms a vibrating needle within a vacuum. The needle vibrates so rapidly that the figures are second sound in character, but it is this intensity of energy which gives the light its brilliancy and its apparent steadiness. The lights do not have to be renewed.

Friends who recently visited Mr. Tesla saw him photographing the light of his light. The exposure was but two seconds in the light of a single vacuum tube or bulb, without electrodes, having a volume of about ninety cubic inches. The light given was approximately 250 candle power.

The announcement of Mr. Tesla's discovery created a genuine sensation at the Electrical Show last night and was the topic of conversation among the experts in the application of power.

EAST OF THE CITY LIMITS.

School Boundary Dispute Amicably Settled—Accident at the Blantyre School.

The long-continued boundary dispute between East Toronto School Section No. 6 and York School Section No. 2, during which resort was made on both sides to law and injunctions has finally been amicably settled by arbitrators chosen, as the result of a friendly conference between the officials of the two sections. The award of the arbitrators reads:

We award that part of Union School Section No. 6, York, lying to the north-east of the village of East Toronto, and bounded on the east by the town line between York and Scarborough Townships, on the south by the G.T.R., north by Danforth-avenue, west by the boundary of East Toronto, which is continuous with the eastern boundary of the G.T.R. property, lying east of Main-street, and being composed of parts of lots Nos. 1, 2 and 3, concession 1 from bay, in section township 17, north, together with \$150 due from the East Toronto School Board collected on the debentures covering the detached property from the union of York Township, and used in the school building fund, The Municipal Council of East Toronto shall pay the same to treasurer of school board of No. 26 on or before Dec. 31, 1896.

The Township of York will pay the fees of the arbitrators, which amount to \$25.

John Sullivan, a boy of about 12 years of age, who is undergoing the discipline of the Blantyre Industrial School, Scarborough, fell down two flights between the spiral stairway of the main school building and broke his right arm a little below the elbow. The fall was fortunately broken by the boy grasping a banister rail in his passage downward, but he was unconscious for some time after being picked up from the ground.

Canadian Temperance League and the Pavilion. Those meetings under the management of the league have been of the most beneficial character, patronized by most of the eminent ministers and Christian workers of the city, engaging public speakers from the best pulpits and platforms of the largest cities of the United States and Canada, by whose voices and influence Toronto is eloquently advertised and exhorted to be of the opinion, with thousands of others who have attended those Sunday afternoon meetings, that the Parks and Gardens Committee is making the gravest mistake in attempting to bar out the league. It is not merely against the league, as an organization, but against the interests of society, moral and religious.
