London, June 3.—Mr. Spenser Wilkinson, reviewing the events of the week in South Africa for the Associated Press, says: "The situation can clearly be understood if we in the first instance neglect the Pretoria telegrams. Lord Roberts advanced from the Vaal in two columns, the first with the main body following the line of the railway and Generals French and Hamilton keeping pace with him a short march to the left and slightly in advance.

MOST REVOLTING SCENES IN THE FAVOR OF CAUSE

Grossome Story Told by the Editor of The Christian Herald After Visiting the Stricken District.

People Dying in the Fields and by the Roadside—Cholera Carrying off Thousands—Vultures and Jackals Feasting—Government Doing Everything Possible.

Newbury, June 3.—Mr. Louis Klopsch of New York, publisher of The Christian Herald, who arrived here May 14 and started at once on a tour of the famine-stricken districts, has returned after traveling through the most woe-stricken districts of the Empire, including Gujarat and Bombay. He made the following statement regarding his observations: "Everywhere I met the most shocking and revolting scenes. The famine camps have been swept by cholera and smallpox. Fugitives aching in all directions, and the stricken in flight, were found dying in the fields and roadside ditches. The number at one relief station was increasing at the rate of 10,000 per day.

SCHOOL QUESTION NOT SETTLED, SAYS ARCHBISHOP LANGEVIN

The St. Boniface Prelate Read a Pastoral Letter to His Flock Yesterday Morning, and in His Official Capacity Stated There Was No Settlement.

Winnipeg, June 3.—Archbishop Langevin read a pastoral letter to Catholics of Winnipeg this morning in St. Mary's Church, in regard to the school question. In his letter the Archbishop commended the Catholics of Winnipeg for their recent action in appointing a committee to interview the Public School Board. The committee, he said, had acted in a wise manner, and had discharged its duties efficiently and well. His Grace also said that the report that the school question had been settled is untrue, and that he wished to deny it in his official capacity, and also to state that the Catholic minority of Manitoba was not satisfied with the so-called concessions granted by the Government. The letter exhorted the Catholics to continue their efforts towards having their grievances redressed, and advised them to pray for the desired end.
