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CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
OF THE
PROVINCE OF QUEBEC RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

CONSTITUTION.

As Revised 14th August, 1889.

1. That this Association be called the "PROVINCE OF QUEBEC RIFLE ASSOCIATION," and shall have for its object the encouragement of rifle shooting in the Province.
2. Any person subscribing Two dollars to the funds of the Association shall be a member thereof for the year in which such subscription shall be made.
3. A donation of Twenty dollars in cash, at any one time, for that express purpose, or of a prize of not less value than Forty dollars, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall make the donor eligible for election as a Life Member at next Annual Meeting of Council.
4. Any regularly constituted Rifle Association or Corps subscribing Ten dollars or upwards, per annum, to the funds of the Association shall be considered as being in connection with it, and shall be entitled to a number of memberships, for competition only, in proportion of one for every dollar so subscribed. The Association thus affiliating is to select from its members the persons to hold such memberships.
5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons, named by the Council. (The Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron.")

6. There shall be a President, to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

7. There shall be four Vice Presidents—one for each Brigade-Major's Division—to be elected in the same manner as the President.

8. There shall be a Council composed as follows, viz :

1st. Eight members to be elected annually at the Business Meeting.

2nd. One representative member from each affiliated Association or Corps in this Province.

9. The President, Vice-Presidents, the District Deputy Adjutants-General of Militia and Brigade-Majors of the Province of Quebec, shall be members *ex-officio* of the Council. Five members of Council shall form a quorum; and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members, from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the Council shall have the power of filling such vacancies. All members of Council, excepting representatives of affiliated Associations, must be Individual members of the Association.

10. Representatives to the Council shall be chosen by the Associations they represent, and the names of delegates, when changed, shall be sent to the Secretary at least one month prior to the Annual Meeting.

11. The Council shall, at its first meeting, choose from its members a Chairman.

12. There shall be a Secretary and a Treasurer, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.

13. The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire

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management and superintendence of the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts or deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

14. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such By-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them; no by-law being in any case altered, or new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.

15. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on by the Council; and the prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such regulations as may be passed from time to time by the Council.

16. An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the Prize Meeting as may be found practicable.

17. An Annual Business Meeting of the members of the Association, for the election of Officers and Council, who shall assume office on the first day of succeeding January, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on by the By-Laws.

18. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting, or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month, at least, previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed; and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all members of the Association of such proposed amendments, and also to post them on the bulletin board at the opening of the Annual Matches.

BY-LAWS.

As Revised 5th May, 1881.

1. The Annual Business Meeting of the Association shall be held on the second day of the Annual Matches.
2. There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council, the first of which shall be held immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.
3. Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by any six members of the Council, notification being sent to each member of Council at least ten days previous to such meeting; and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meetings.
4. The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, open to the inspection of all members of the Council, and published with the Annual Report.
5. There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council to be chosen at their first meeting.
6. The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such chartered Bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association.
7. All expenditure for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the signature of a member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner. Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.
8. A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.

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THE TWENTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
PROVINCE OF QUEBEC RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

—1891—

In submitting the Twenty-third Annual report of the working of the Association, your Council have to congratulate the members on a fairly successful year. The thanks of the Association are due to both old and new friends for subscriptions both in money and kind, a list of which will be found at the end of the report, while thanking those who have so kindly aided us in the past, we would call the attention of the members to the large number of Merchants and others, who should subscribe to the funds, but who have not done so, some means should be devised to reach these, and the Finance Committee ought to take this matter up.

RANGES.

Early in the season, a deputation of members of this Association and of the Amalgamated Rifle Associations waited on the Hon. Minister of Militia, and obtained the appointment of a new Caretaker, Mr. Robert Allan, also the promise of the necessary repairs to the Ranges. The Association altered last year's Telephone system, and laid down four new lines, giving a separate telephone service to each section of targets, a new system of the division of targets was also adopted, and with these improvements the Range is now in first-class shape, and the Competitors at the Matches report the working as most satisfactory.

We believe the Minister has authorized the cleaning of the drains and target pits, also the fitting up of the 800 and 900 yards targets, which will be very much appreciated next season.

A very important item, however, is still wanting, viz: a Caretaker's house. Owing to the Ranges being situated in a comparatively out of the way place, a house for the Caretaker is an absolute necessity, in

order that the property of the Department and of the different Montreal Regiments should be preserved from wanton destruction. The cost of the house, with well, &c., would be a comparatively small amount, and the benefits to the range and the Militia Force largely increased.

Numbers of the Montreal Regiments would go to Ranges over night, to obtain early morning practice, had they the convenience of meals and lodging, which the Caretaker's house could afford them.

PRIZE MEETING.

In the absence of the Secretary, who had gone over to England as adjutant of the Bisley Team, Mr. Elliot was appointed Assistant Secretary and Major Bond, Chairman of the Executive Committee, kindly undertook the detail of the working of the Matches. Lt. Col. Mattice was Executive officer. The Range officers were Major Hodgins, Capt. Manly, Capt. Oswald and Lt. D'Orsennes. Camp Quartermaster was Capt. D'Orsennes. The programme was drawn up to last four days; closing at 4.15 on Friday, 14th August.

The Executive Committee decided to increase the number of men in the Teams for the Carslake Cup to fifteen, but finding that a large number of the competitors were opposed to it, they reduced the number again to ten.

The Frontier Match, Series "B," was altered by charging an entrance fee of 25c. and arranging that a Competitor could take a prize in each series. The Merchants was restored to the programme, making it a ten shot Match, at 600 yards, M. H. Rifle. Sighting shots were again introduced, competitors being allowed one at each range, at a charge of 10c. each.

There was a large falling off in the entries as compared with last year, the total being 1636 individuals against 2021 for last year and 28 Teams against 47. The largest number of entries in any one match being 129 in the Frontier against 174 in same Match last year, and 383 in the Extra Series, 600 yards, as against 430 in the 500 yards last year.

No apparent cause can be said to have effected the large shortage in the number of the Competitors this year, but the dropping away of several of the Regimental teams, notably the 8th Royal Rifles, of Quebec, the Prince of Wales Rifles, of this city, and the Governor General's Foot Gaurds, Ottawa, would account at once for 30 of the Individual entries short in each Match.

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Some of the Council are of the opinion that the large number of League and Regimental Matches, now taking place in the early part of season, prevents any ordinary practice for men who are not shooting on the teams, and brings up a question which will shortly force itself on the attention of the Montreal Brigade, viz : the necessity of increased Second and Third Class target accommodation on the Ranges.

This want has been felt for the past two seasons, and will probably be still more noticeable the coming year. At least ten more Second and Third Class targets are required to afford the necessary accommodation for the nine Regiments now practicing every Saturday on the Cote St. Luc Ranges.

A suggestion has also been thrown out that the date of the Annual Matches should be changed, and that they be held the second week in July instead of the second week in August, as heretofore. The Council do not recommend this, but leave it to the consideration of the new Officers and Council.

The Ammunition furnished by the Militia Department continues to give good satisfaction to the competitors.

A motion was passed at the Competitors Meeting, suggesting to council that the lunch at present furnished by the Association to the Field officials and visiting officers be done away with. Your Council would recommend that this suggestion be adopted.

We have sixty Individual members, and fifteen Affiliated Associations, having gained "A" Co'y, 43rd Batt., Ottawa and lost, G. T. R. Rifle Association, Toronto, R. A., 85th Batt. R. A., 45th Batt. R. A., Queen's Own R. A., Hemmingford R. A., Sherbrooke R. A.

We are very much pleased to see competitors from the 55th Batt., 86th Batt., 56th and 59th Battalions and hope they will come in larger numbers next year.

Your Council are still of the opinion that with the usual number of competitors, which they trust to see the coming year, that it will take four days to carry out the Programme successfully. And would recommend the incoming Council to give it another trial.

MEDALS, CUPS, &C.

Governor-General's Silver Medal was won by Sergt. Riddle, 6th Fusiliers, with 72 points.

The Governor-General's Bronze Medal was won by Col.-Sergt. Currie, Royal Scots, with 72 points.

The Lieut.-Governor's silver medal was won by Col.-Sergt. Pratt, 6th Fusiliers, with 86 points.

The N. R. A. Medal and P. Q. R. A. Championship Badge, was won by Private D. Smith, Royal Scots of Canada, 238 points.

The D. R. A. Silver Medal was won by Staff-Sergt. Clark, 53rd Battalion, with 235 points:

The D. R. A. Bronze Medal was won by Lieut. C. McAdam, 3rd Battalion, V. R. C., with 233 points.

The Ont. R. A. Silver Medal was won by Private Keough, 3rd Battalion, V. R. C., with 233 points.

The City of Montreal Jubilee Challenge Trophy was won by the 6th Fusiliers, with 484 points.

The "Carslake" Challenge Trophy was won by 3rd Battalion, V. R. C., with 730 points.

The Martin Nursery Challenge Shield was won by "A" Coy 43rd Battalion, with 1064 points.

The Association Cup was won by the 43rd Battalion, with 268, points.

The "Association Aggregate Team Cup" was won by the 43rd Battalion, with 1183 points.

PRESENTATION OF PRIZES.

There was no public presentation of prizes this year, but on Wednesday a large number of friends visited the grounds during the afternoon, where they were received by Mrs. E. L. Bond on behalf of the Executive Committee. Maj.-Gen. Herbert and Capt. Streatfield arrived on the grounds shortly before 12 o'clock, accompanied by Lt.-Col. Houghton.

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The General made a careful inspection of the whole range, including the Butts, Cook Houses, Shelter Sheds, etc., and expressed himself as quite satisfied with all the arrangements as far as completed. During the afternoon the ranges were also visited by Admiral Coiverville and the Captain and Officers of the French Man-of-War "Bisson," who, under the guidance of the General and the members of the Executive, took a warm interest in the shooting and general arrangements of the competition.

The Canadian Pacific Railway, with their usual courtesy, furnished a prompt and efficient train service during the matches.

To the statistical officer, Lt.-Col. D. T. Fraser, great credit is due for the squadding and timing of the competitors, the new system of separating competitors from the same Battalion throughout the matches was carried out successfully.

FINANCES.

This year has been a little difficult in the matter of money; there was a considerable expenditure required to put the ranges in order, \$451.00. Owing to the lateness of the session there was delay in payment of the Dominion grant, and there was a marked falling off in entries, \$333.00. In consequence of this, some of our Executive Committee had to provide money on their own responsibility, and our thanks are due for their prompt assistance.

We received the usual Government grants and private subscriptions, the affiliations and membership together produce about the same as last year, but the income from entries is reduced, as already stated, \$333.00.

The expenditure for the matches, shows a reduction of \$50 for employees, also a similar reduction in the Council Tent, and other expenses. The printing account is somewhat increased, owing to payment of some accounts belonging to last year. The permanent work has cost \$451.00, during the year. This will of course not be required to be made again. The other items do not require comment. The balance on hand is \$99.95, with all accounts of every description paid and the ranges in good order. Our only liability is to those members of the Executive Committee who have advanced us the necessary

money to place us in this position. We still have to regret the smallness of the individual membership, and that our subscription list is with one or two exceptions, confined to the city of Montreal.

In conclusion we would commend the following items to the attention of the incoming Council, viz:—

1. The changing the date of the Annual Matches from the second week of August to the second week in July.
2. To allow unlimited team entries in all team matches.
3. To improve the value of the extra series prizes.
4. To drop providing lunch for the officials and visiting officers at the expense of the Association.
5. To increase the individual membership.
6. To increase the collections from the public.
7. To make more prominent every year the "At Home," or public presentation of prizes, which is the only method of interesting public in the doings of the Association.

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REGULATIONS.

MEMBERSHIP.

Individual membership, \$2.00.

Affiliating Associations are entitled to ten (10) members' tickets and one badge on payment of \$10.00.

The above subscriptions must be paid on or before the 6th of August. Twenty per cent. additional will be charged after that date.

Firing shall commence each day at 9 o'clock precisely.

All firing shall be conducted under officers or persons appointed for the duty by the Executive Committee, and all Competitors shall be under their authority.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS.

1. Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the Regulations, as also with the conditions of the Match for which they have entered, as in neither case will the plea of ignorance be entertained.

2. The Range Officers will decide disputes on the ground. Appeal from their decisions may be made in writing to the Executive Committee, whose decision will be final and without recourse. Their decision to be given in writing to the Secretary.

3. When at the firing point they must comply with all orders given by the Range Officer, or Officer in charge.

1. —GENERAL REGULATIONS.

I.—No Active Militiaman shall shoot as a member of more than one corps.

II.—No non commissioned officer or private, employed by the P. Q. R. A. for duty at the firing points or in the butts, shall shoot either for a prize or for practice during the meeting.

III.—In all competitions restricted to Active Militiamen, or in which they shoot as such, the uniform of their corps shall be worn, and in accordance with the R. and O. of M., viz.:

1. Tunic, patrol or regulation fatigue jacket. Elbow caps not allowed.
2. Trousers.
3. Regimental head dress, or a cap cover, with or without a cap under it.

Cap Covers or Puggerees may be worn over the regimental full or undress cap, and great coats or waterproofs over uniform.

All officers of the same corps must appear in the same order, as must also non-commissioned officers and privates, but where a duly authorized undress for officers exists, they must appear in it, although the non-commissioned officers and privates may be in full dress. Cross belts need not be worn.

4. In competitions not restricted to the Active Militia, competitors must appear either in complete uniform or wholly in plain clothes. Any objections on the score of a competitor's dress must be raised *before* he takes up his position to shoot, or while he is shooting.

IV.—Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection when required.

V.—Fixed artificial rests will not be allowed, except in the Skirmishing Match.

VI.—Competitors may use a waterproof sheet, mat or great coat, not folded up, but laid flat on the ground; but no cork beds or elbow rests will be allowed except those furnished by the Association

VII.—No wiping out between shots will be permitted.

VIII.—No competitor shall load until he has taken his position at the firing point, and the Register Keeper has given the word "All clear!"

IX.—Competitors are allowed to fire "fouling" shots only in the pits provided, and on presentation of a "fouling" ticket.

X.—Slings may be used in all matches, but they must be of the Government length and pattern, white, brown or black, and attached to the rifles, as in Government arms. The greatest length of a Government sling is $54\frac{1}{4}$ inches, not including the tongue or the buckle.

IN INDIVIDUAL COMPETITION.

XI—(a) A competitor may use a binocular or telescope, *not mounted on any kind of stand*, provided his doing so causes no delay to the shooting.

(b) After a competitor has taken his place at the firing point, no person, except the Register Keeper or an officer on duty, will be permitted to speak to him.

(c) No coaching of any kind will be permitted in any match.

Any violation of this rule, or any part of it, must be at once reported by the Register Keeper to the Officer in charge, who will caution the offender, and on any repetition of the offence shall report the same to the Range Officer, to be dealt with by the Executive Committee, as laid down under the head of "penalties," and the person or persons offending may be removed from the firing points.

2.—PENALTIES--DISQUALIFICATION.

XII.—Any competitor—

(a) Who shall fire in a name other than his own; or,

(b) Who shall fire twice for the same prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the competition to do so; or,

(c) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target; or,

(d) Who shall offer money, or a bribe of any kind, to any employee of the Association, under any pretence whatever; or,

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(e) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Executive Committee may consider discreditable; or,

(f) Who shall be reported to the Council or Executive Committee as having been elsewhere guilty of such conduct or the aforesaid offences; or,

(g) Who shall directly or indirectly make any arrangements with any other competitor for pooling or dividing any prize,—

Shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Council or Committee, or on the receipt of such report from any affiliated or duly recognized Association, forfeit all his entrance fees and prizes, and be forever disqualified from competing at any prize meeting of the Association.

EXCLUSION FROM FURTHER COMPETITION DURING THE MEETING.

XIII.—Any competitor—

(a) Who shall fire when the danger signal is up; or

(b) Who shall discharge his rifle on the range, except in accordance with the regulations for shooting; or,

(c) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle, except when at his proper firing point and engaged in competing; or,

(d) Who, from a proper want of care, discharges his rifle accidentally (if such discharge is due to a defect in his rifle, an ample and satisfactory explanation must be given); or,

(e) Who shall fire a pool shot before delivering his ticket to the Register Keeper, or,

(f) Who shall alter or make any erasure on his firing ticket; or,

(g) Who shall act in any way that might prove dangerous.

Shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, be excluded from all further competition at the Meeting, and shall forfeit all his entrance fees.

DISALLOWANCE OF SCORE.

XIV.—Any competitor—

(a) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any particular prize; or,

(b) Who shall infringe on any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the Meeting while shooting for any particular prize; or,

(c) Who, when competing for an aggregate prize, shall omit to enter, or shall enter incorrectly, his previous score or scores on the register or ticket provided for that purpose; or,

(d) Who shall shoot dressed partly in uniform and partly in plain clothes—
(See Reg. III., Sec. 4.)

Shall, on the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, have his score for that particular prize disallowed.

FINES.

XV.—Any competitor—

Who shall fire a fouling shot except at the place provided, or who shall accidentally fire at the wrong target, shall be fined one dollar, to be paid forthwith to the Range Officer.

In cases where a competitor is excluded from "further competition," or where his score is disallowed for any particular prize, *the circumstances only* under which the penalty was incurred shall be posted on the notice board, as a warning to others, without the name of the individual implicated.

In case of "disqualification," the names of the offenders, as well as the particulars of the case, shall be posted on the notice board.

MITIGATION OF PENALTIES.

XVI.—The Executive Committee shall have power to mitigate or remit any of the above penalties.

3.—PRIZE WINNERS.

XVII.—Unless otherwise specified, no one will be allowed to take more than *one* prize in any competition.

XVIII.—Winners of prizes, on signing the certified receipt, will receive the amount or amounts due to them from the Treasurer of the P.Q.R.A.

4.—DISTANCE AND TARGETS.

The ordinary Targets, divided into three classes, shall be of the following dimensions:—

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5.—MARKING.

1. The marking will be as follows:—

a. Bull's Eye	5 White Disc.
b. Inner	4 Red Disc.
c. Magpie.....	3 Black and White Disc.
d. Outer	2 Black Disc.
e. Ricochet.....	R Black Bar.

f. *Misses* will *not* be signalled; but if a target has been lowered under the impression that it has been hit, and if no hit is found on it, after raising it the Marker will wave a red flag, which will signify a miss.

2. When *two* shots strike the target simultaneously, that which has the highest value will alone be signalled with the signal disc, and the competitor whose proper turn it was to fire at the target will be credited with that shot, provided he has fired. Both shots will, however, be shown by spotting discs.

3. On a target being lowered, the position of a hit, if any, and its value, will be shown by spotting disc, when the target is again raised.

4. The signalling shall not be questioned, but if a shot is not signaled, and the officer in charge of the firing points be satisfied that a reasonable doubt exists as to whether the shot may not have struck the target, he may ask the officer at the butt to examine the Target. *The result of this examination as signalled shall be final.* Any competitor challenging a shot shall deposit the sum of twenty-five cents with the officer in charge at the firing points, which shall be forfeited in case no hit is found on the target.

5. If on a target being raised, the spotting disc appears manifestly to disagree with the signal disc, the Register Keeper shall stop the firing at the target, and report the circumstance to the Range Officer, who shall decide the shot after enquiry of the Officer in charge at the butt; but no deposit shall be required, nor shall there be any appeal from the decision given.

6. All claims for shots signalled must be made before another shot is fired at the target in question.

7. If, at the moment at which a competitor fires, his target should be lowered in such a manner as to falsify the result of his shot, the Range Officer is empowered to cancel the result of such shot, and to permit the competitor to fire another shot in its place.

8. All alterations of the Registers must be initialed by the Range Officer making them, but no alteration, except in case of a clerical error, shall be made without his having first signalled to the butt.

9. No person will be permitted to go and examine a target during the Meeting except the Range Officer, or such person or persons as he may duly authorize to do so in his behalf.

Military Match Targets.

(4 feet by 2 feet 6 inches high ; 3 Divisions.)

1. Lower belt, 15 in. high ; score value 5 points.
2. Middle belt, 10 in. high ; score value 3 points.
3. Upper belt, 5 in. high ; score value 2 points.

In Skirmishing.

When the number of hits counted on the target exceeds the number of shots allowed in the competition, three marks shall be deducted for every such hit in excess of the number of shots, unless it be proved that such hit on the target in excess of the number of shots allowed could only have been made by competitors in the squad firing more than their usual number of rounds, in which case the squad shall be disqualified.

6.—RIFLES.

The rifles shall be Snider and Martini-Henry rifles, either the Government issue or of *bona fide* Government pattern, and bearing the Government Viewer's mark.

1. Weight of Snider not to exceed, without bayonet, 9 lbs. 12 oz. Weight of Martini-Henry, without bayonet, not to exceed 9 lbs.
2. No pad or shoe for the heel plate of the butt will be allowed.
3. Minimum pull of trigger, 6 lbs.
4. Sights to be strictly in accordance with those of the Government issue. Filed sights will not be allowed.
 - (a) All sights may be temporarily blackened or whitened, but no application of a permanent nature will be allowed. No shading of sights will be permitted.
 - (b) The back sight may be tilted forward or backward, or supported at an angle by any extemporized means.
 - (c) The sliding bar may be reversed, and used on either side of the uprights. *One* permanent centre line for the Snider and *three* for the Martini-Henry will be allowed, and *temporary* marks or lines of any kind, removable at pleasure, may be used.

7.—AMMUNITION.

Competitors must use the ammunition provided by the Association, the cost of which is included in the entrance fee.

8.—POSITION.

- a. Unless otherwise specified, the shooting at all ranges shall be from the firing points, and may be any position with the head to the target.
- b. In the Standing position, the whole of the left hand must be in front of the trigger-guard, and the left elbow clear of the body.

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9.—ORDER OF SHOOTING.

1. When a competitor has joined a squad he shall not leave it until he has retired or completed his firing, without leave from the Range Officer; any competitor losing his turn, or being absent without leave, or who does not hand his scoring ticket to the Range Officer at the firing point to which he is squadded at the time detailed on his ticket, will be disqualified for the match, and lose his entrance fee. Time will be regulated by the Association clock in the Secretary's office.

2. In all competitions, except those open to "Any Rifles," competitors shall, when possible, be formed up by threes, and fire shot and shot *alternately*.

3. Where but *one* competitor is present, he shall fire his shots without undue delay, but the Officer in charge of the firing point, *or some person named by him*, must witness the shooting, and countersign the Register. Failing such verification, the score will be invalidated.

4. No two competitors shall shoot in any competition with the same rifle, *except with Martini-Henry*; nor shall a competitor change his rifle at any range, during a competition, unless his first rifle should become unserviceable through an accident, which must be verified through the officer in charge.

5. In the case of unreasonable delay in firing on the part of any competitor, or of such delay as the Range Officer may consider likely to prolong the firing beyond the time allowed, the Range Officer shall have the right to caution and time the competitor by a sand glass, purporting to run one minute, more or less, and if, after such caution, the competitor does not fire before the sand has run out, the Range Officer shall declare the score forfeited, and call on the next competitor to proceed with his firing.

6. The competitor must, after delivering *each shot*, pay attention to the score called out by the Register Keeper, and himself see that such score is correctly entered on the blackboard, so that any objection to the score recorded may be investigated before the next shot is fired, and before leaving the firing point ascertain that the total has been correctly entered by the Register Keeper.

N.B.—The right of objection in the above case only extends to the registration of scores by the Register Keeper, and not to Marker's signals.

10.—TIES.

Ties shall be decided as follows:—

A.—*In Individual Competitions for a series of prizes:*

1. If at more than *one* distance, by *the range totals in inverse order*.
2. By the fewest *outers*.
3. By the fewest *magpies*.
4. By the fewest *inners*.
5. By the *value of each shot in inverse order*.
6. FOR MONEY PRIZES, by *Division*.
7. FOR PRIZES IN KIND, by *shooting off*, as in Clause B.

8. In the case of a PRIZE, PART IN KIND AND PART IN MONEY, by shooting off for the Prize in Kind and dividing the Money.

N.B.—In all competitions the order of the winners shall be decided by the foregoing rules, if possible; but in the case of absolute ties the names shall be arranged alphabetically and bracketed.

B.—*Individual Competitions for a Single Prize.*

1. By the aggregate scores in three rounds at the longest distance.

2. By firing single shots until decided.

Absentees shall forfeit their claim to shoot.

C.—*In Team Competitions:—*

1. If at more than one distance, by the aggregate range totals in inverse order.

2. By the fewest *outers*.

3. By the fewest *magpies*.

4. By the fewest *inners*.

5. By the highest scores in each team shooting off, as in Clause B.

D.—*Aggregate:—*

Ties for the first place to be shot off, as in Clause B.

For other places:—

By the aggregate total of each range in inverse order, viz:

1. By the total score at 600 yards.

2. By the total score at 500 yards.

E.—*In Military Skirmishing and Volley Firing by the largest number of hits.*

F.—In cases not met by the foregoing—

1. By any special rules attached to the conditions.

2. By the fiat of the Executive.

11.—ENTRIES.

1. Entries, accompanied by the fees for the first seven matches, must be made on or before Thursday, 6th August, addressed to the Secretary, P. O. Box 1367, Montreal. After that date, 20 per cent. extra will be charged.

2. Every competitor shall enter and shoot under his own name, and not oftener than once for any prize, unless specially allowed by the terms of competition.

3. To meet the case where the difficulty may be experienced in selecting the actual competitors in sufficient time to make the required entries by the 6th August, Officers commanding corps, and Secretaries of Local Associations, will be permitted to send in their applications for *(state number of competitors)*, accompanying such application with the amount of the entrance fees, and to postpone the rendering of the actual names of those for whom they make the entries until the selection of the competitors is definitely made. In

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such case the Register Tickets shall not be issued before the final return is handed to the Secretary, but in no case will the entries be made unless the money is forwarded. Any payment made for entries in excess of the number of competitors nominated will be returned in full, as provided for under paragraph 12 (a), Return Entrance Fees.

4. Entrance Fees must be paid at the time when entries are made.

The Register Tickets will be issued on application at the Secretary's Office, on the Range.

The Executive Committee reserve to themselves the power of refusing any entry, either for Volunteer or All Comers' Prizes, or of cancelling, at any moment, any entry that may have been previously accepted.

12—RETURN OF ENTRANCE.

1. Entrance fees in full will be returned to those—
 - (a) Who are prevented from being present at the meeting ; or
 - (b) Who attended the meeting, but who are incapacitated from illness or accident ; or,
 - (c) Whose entries the Executive Committee may have cancelled.
2. Claims based on other considerations than the above will, if allowed, be subjected to a penalty of half forfeit.

13—SQUADDING.

1. In the case of competitors classified as ordinary entries, arrangements will be made and details published on the Range, of the day and target at which each competitor will be required to attend to fulfil his engagements.

In the case of post entries, competitors must await the squadding of ordinary competitors before being assigned to any target.

14—ALTERATION OF SQUADDING.

Any alteration which the Executive Officer may find it necessary to make will be duly notified on the notice board, and such notice shall be a sufficient authority for the change. In the absence of such notice, tickets will be available only for the target for which they were originally issued, and any erasure or alteration will cancel the ticket, unless verified by the initials of the Executive Officer.

15—REGISTER TICKETS.

1. Should a competitor lose his ticket, or omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed, or give a wrong ticket, and so by *his own neglect*, miss the opportunity of competing for the prize for which his ticket was issued, he shall forfeit his claim on the Association, and *no duplicate ticket shall be issued to him except under special circumstances.*

2. Any erasure or substitution of one name for another shall invalidate the ticket.

The Executive Committee reserves the right to alter, amend or rescind any of the foregoing regulations as circumstances may require.
