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BY-LAWS.

1. The President shall be, *ex-officio*, chairman of all meetings, ordinary and special, when he is present.
2. In the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall preside, but in the absence of both, then the chairman of the Committee or other member of the Association as shall then be nominated by the members present, may preside, and said chairman shall, for the time, be clothed with all the powers of the chairman.
3. In case of two members rising at the same time to address the meeting, the presiding chairman shall decide who has the floor.
4. Any member addressing the meeting shall do so through the presiding chairman, and shall not occupy the floor more than fifteen minutes without permission.
5. At all meetings the chair is to be taken punctually at the hour appointed, and in case thirty minutes elapse without a quorum, the meeting may stand adjourned until such time as the members may name and appoint.
6. It will be the duty of the Secretary to keep the minutes of all meetings of the Association and read them at the next meeting, in order to their correction and confirmation; to conduct all the correspondence of the Association. It will also be the duty of the Secretary to make a full annual report, at the regular or adjourned annual meeting, of the proceedings of the Association for the preceding year.
7. The Treasurer shall take charge of all funds and keep a correct account of the same, disbursing them under the direction of the Association, being prepared at any regular meeting with a statement of the finances and making an annual report at the regular or adjourned annual meeting.

CONSTITUTION.

1st. This Association shall be called the "Pioneer and Historical Association of the Province of Ontario, Canada."

2nd. Its objects shall be to unite the various Pioneer and Historical Societies of the Province in one central head or organization, thereby the better to promote intercourse and union of all such societies, for the better preservation of historical and other records and memorials of the Province, for the forming of new societies for such purposes, and for the promoting and extending the influence and benefits thereof. Also, this Association shall publish an annual report, containing the names of all the members of each and every affiliated society, with such other matters as may be required, each such affiliating society to receive copies thereof.

3rd. Its membership shall consist of delegates from all the various Pioneer and Historical Societies of the Province, of such as are now in existence, and of those that may in the future be formed.

4th. The affairs of this Association shall be managed by a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, Treasurer, and an Executive Committee of five; all of whom shall be appointed from among the regular members of the Association. The officers being, *ex-officio*, members of the committee, all of whom shall hold office until their successors are regularly appointed.

5th. An annual general meeting of the Association shall be held at such place in Ontario as shall be appointed at each preceding annual or adjourned annual meeting, such annual meeting to be held on the first Wednesday in June in each and every year, to receive the annual reports of the Association, and taking proper action thereon; for the nomination and election of officers, the committee and two auditors, and to transact such other business as may be required. Five members to form a quorum; for the committee, three.

6th. It is not the intention of this Association to exercise any control in governing or directing any of the affiliated societies, or in any way to interfere in their private working; but in case any question is referred to this Association by any of the affiliated societies, then it will be competent for this Association to consider and decide upon any such question or reference.

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7th. No portion of the Constitution or By-Laws of the Association may be altered, added to, or repealed, until approved of by two-thirds of the members present at the meeting; and for such proposed alteration, adding to, or repeal, notice thereof shall be given to the Secretary in writing and signed by such requirer, at least one month before the said meeting; and the Secretary shall immediately, on reception of said notice, send copies of such proposed alterations, adding to, or repeal, to each member of the Association.

8th. Each and every affiliated society shall pay into the funds of this Association an annual sum, as dues, of ten cents for each and every member of such society; but when the number of members of such society exceeds one hundred, or ten dollars, then no further annual dues, namely, than ten dollars per annum for such affiliated society, will be required; said dues to be due and payable at each annual meeting, and if not paid, the delegates from such society will not have a vote until such arrears are paid.

9th. Honorary members not living in Ontario may be elected on the recommendation of the Executive Committee, but such honorary members shall not vote or hold office except as an auditor. Nor shall such honorary members have a voice in the regular business of the Association, except by permission.

10th. A special meeting of the Association may be called by the chairman upon a requisition signed by three members, which meeting shall be competent to entertain no business except such as it is called for.

11th. No subjects involving differences in religion or politics will on any account be considered proper for discussion.

12th. Each and every affiliated society may send to this Association not more than five delegates, but as soon as nine different societies are represented, this section of the Constitution will be null and void, and section 12 will read as follows, viz. :—

Each and every affiliated society will be represented in this Association by one delegate regularly appointed by such affiliated society, the Secretary of this Association being notified in writing by the Secretary of such society of the appointment, with name and address of same.

THE PIONEER AND HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION OF THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO, CANADA.

The Annual General Meeting of the Association was held in the Canadian Institute, Toronto, Wednesday, June 7th, 1893. The President, Rev. Dr. Scadding, in the chair.

The following delegates of affiliated societies were present: W. H. Doel and Wm. Rennie, from York Pioneer and Historical Society; Eli Crawford and Thos. Morphy, from Peel Pioneer and Historical Society; D. B. Read, Q.C., Grenville Pioneer and Historical Society; A. F. Hunter, Simcoe Pioneer and Historical Society, and Dr. Canniff, Historical Section of Canadian Institute, Toronto.

The Minutes of the last Meeting were read and adopted.

Secretary read the following report, which was adopted:

There are at present seven Pioneer and Historical Societies in affiliation with the Provincial Association, viz.: York Pioneer and Historical Society, Peel Pioneer Society, Lundy's Lane Historical Society, Wentworth Pioneer and Historical Society, Grenville Pioneer and Historical Society, Simcoe Pioneer and Historical Society, Historical Section Canadian Institute, Toronto.

The celebration of 1892, in commemoration of the 100th anniversary of the establishment of the Province of Upper Canada, under the auspices of this Association, was carried out in a manner becoming the occasion.

On 20th April, 1892, a joint meeting of this Association and other Historical Societies decided to hold two centennial celebrations, one on the 16th July at Niagara, to commemorate the issuing of the Proclamation by Governor Simcoe declaring the electoral divisions of the Province of Upper Canada; and a second in Toronto, September 17th, at the new Provincial Parliament Buildings, to commemorate the opening of the first Parliament of Upper Canada.

The following liberal sums of money were granted for carrying out the celebrations:

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The Niagara celebration on the 16th July, 1892, was largely attended, His Honor Lieut.-Governor Kirkpatrick, Sir Oliver Mowat and other guests were received by Mayor Pafford and members of the local committee. On the arrival of the boat from Toronto a procession was formed and proceeded to old Fort George headed by the Army and Navy Veterans' band; there were also in the procession Niagara, Lundy's Lane, and the 19th Battalion bands. The town was gaily decorated for the occasion with arches, flags, and large streamers with suitable mottoes.

On arriving at Fort George the Proclamation summoning the first parliament was read by the Lieut.-Governor which was received by a royal salute of twenty-one guns by the Welland Field Battery. His Honor delivered a most interesting address, recalling the leading political events connected with the history of our country from 1757 to the present time.

Rev. Canon Bull officiated as chaplain by reading prayers from Captain John Brant's prayer book, printed in 1774.

At the conclusion of these interesting ceremonies the members of the committee and their guests partook of luncheon at the Queen's Royal Hotel. In the afternoon there was a large gathering in the town park, presided over by the Lieut.-Governor; Sir Oliver Mowat, Premier of Ontario, was called on as speaker of the day. He delivered an historical and patriotic address, which was listened to with intense interest. Eloquent addresses were also delivered by Senator Ferguson, Lieut.-Col. Denison, Dr. Oronhyatekha (a lineal descendant of Mohawk Chief Brant) and Hon. A. McKellar. The proceedings closed with the National Anthem.

The celebration of the 100th anniversary of the meeting of the first Parliament of Upper Canada took place in Toronto in front of the new Parliament buildings, Saturday, 17th September, 1892.

A procession was formed at the old Legislative hall, Front Street, and proceeded to the Queen's Park, headed by the Army and Navy Veterans' band. In the front carriage were His Honor Lieut.-Governor Kirkpatrick, Mrs. Kirkpatrick, Miss Kirkpatrick, Master Kirkpatrick and Commander Law; following in carriages were the members of the Local Legislature, City Council, High School, Public School and Separate School Boards, members of Pioneer and Historical Societies,

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Army and Navy Veterans, and a large number of prominent citizens. On arrival at the park His Honor and party ascended the platform, erected for the occasion, when No. 2 Company Canadian Regiment of Infantry band played the National Anthem. On the opposite side of the square facing the platform were 1,500 school children on raised seats who rendered a number of patriotic selections, accompanied by the Royal Grenadier Band.

His Honor the Lieut.-Governor presided. He first called on the children to sing "God Save the Queen," and the Hon. Thos. Ballantyne, Speaker of the Legislative Assembly, to read the opening prayer (the form prescribed for use in the Local Legislature).

The Lieut.-Governor then delivered an address, after which the children sang "The Maple Leaf for Ever" in grand style.

Addresses were delivered by Hon. Thos. Ballantyne, Hon. J. M. Gibson, Provincial Secretary; Hon. Richard Harcourt, Provincial Treasurer; G. F. Marter, M.P.P.; W. McCleary, M.P.P.; and Rev. Dr. Scadding, President of the Pioneer and Historical Association of Ontario. Between the speeches the children sang "Hail to the Land" and "Rule Britannia."

The proceedings closed with singing the National Anthem, and three cheers for the Queen and three for Lieut.-Governor Kirkpatrick.

The Centennial Celebration Committee have published a memorial volume, 500 copies to be presented to the Local Legislature, each member of the Committee and others who assisted in the celebrations. A Centennial medal was also struck commemorative of the event.

At Niagara, in front of the court house, the Committee erected a memorial fountain, also marked four historical spots by placing on each a large stone (boulder).

Through the persistent appeals made by our President and others of our Association, we have reason to believe that the Ontario Government will shortly make a beginning towards the erection of a monument to the memory of Governor Simcoe by locating a site in front of the new Parliament buildings and provide a design for same.

The Treasurer's statement showed that there was a deficit of \$10.96 on account of printing last annual report.

Moved by Mr. Crawford, seconded by Dr. Canniff, that \$25 be taken from Centennial fund to print annual report, and that the balance on hand be a contribution to a fund for a monument to the memory of Governor Simcoe.—Carried.

On motion of Dr. Canniff it was decided that the Executive Committee of this Association (with power to add to their number) be a Special Committee to solicit contributions for the erection of a monument to the memory of Governor Simcoe.

It was agreed that we have our annual excursion on the 22nd inst. to Hamilton, and that other Pioneer and Historical Societies be invited to join us at Hamilton.

Resolved that twelve copies of Memorial Volume be sent Sir Oliver Mowat, and that one copy be sent to each of the Mechanics' Institutes in towns of 2,000 and over.

On motion of Dr. Canniff the meeting endorsed the action of the Historical section of the Canadian Institute in asking the Provincial Government to make a suitable grant of money for the purpose of collecting and preserving documents, letters, papers, &c., relating to the early days of the Province and relics of pioneer life.

The following officers were elected : President, Rev. Dr. Scadding ; Vice-Presidents, Rev. Canon Bull and W. H. Doel ; Secretary and Treasurer, Wm. Rennie. Committee, F. W. Fearman, Eli Crawford, D. B. Read, Q.C., John A. Orchard and A. F. Hunter. Auditors, J. A. Skirrow and Capt. D. F. Jessopp.

Decided that the next annual meeting be held in Toronto.
Meeting adjourned.

The following items are from the Secretary's last Annual Report :

The Society's excursion to Niagara took place on the 16th July, 1892, to join in commemorating the 100th anniversary of the establishment of representative government in Canada.

During the Industrial Exhibition the Old Log Cabin was crowded with visitors from morning until night.

Papers read by members during the year:—W. H. Doel, on the "Rock River Engagement of the War of 1812 to 1814, in which the British Forces had a sharp and very successful engagement with the Americans;" Dr. Scadding, "The Memorable Proclamation issued on July 16th, 1792, by Lieut.-Governor Simcoe;" Mr. Chas. Durand, "The Indians of Ontario;" D. B. Read, Q.C., "The History of Upper Canada in 1792;" Mr. Wm. Lea, "Life in Canada in the Old Days;" Mr. Thomas Humberstone, "Reminiscences of York and Yonge Street;" Mr. Wm. Lea, short papers on various subjects; Mr. Wm.
