# KILLED NEAR

Train and Dragged for Some Distance.

The body of Joseph Mills of this city was found alongside the railroad track, about tweny-five yards west of the Westfield Beach station, last night about ten o'clock, and it is supposed that he was struck by an incoming freight train which passed there about eight o'clock.

The deceased had left the city on the Boston Express in company with Edward Corbett, foreman for Sutherland & Mitchell contractors on the Valley Railway and was going to work for that firm.

When the train arrived at Westfield Mr. Mills announced his intention of looking for some place where he could get something to eat, and that was the last seen of him alive.





The supplying of material to fill the demands of Red Cross work is of tiself a business. Whether a request comes from headquarters for dressing gowns, or for new razors for hospital use, or for comfort bags or bandages, or bedsocks or quilts or magazines or anything practically, it is always possible to supply it as short notice, thanks to the efficiency of the buying committee and the hearty co-operation of the merchants who now seem to know by intuition what the Red Cross will need. This means a heavy outlay of money, but it is here that the generosity of the men and women back of the firing line is equal to the demand. In concluding her report Mrs. White presented the following list of articles sent to the military hospitals—military and epidemic.

To the military, one dressing gown, 50 hospital shirts, 60 pillow slips, 22 rolls absorbent cotton, two pieces gauze, 12 arm-slings, 6 surgical kits, 6 small pads, 1 box dressings, 6 bandages 7 pneumonia jackets.

To the epidemic, 6 dressing gowns, 48 hospital shirts, 53 towels.

For the knitting department Mrs. Heber Vroom, convener, reported 1,030 pairs of socks received during the month which, owing to the lateness of the January meeting has been a short working month, making this return more noteworthy. Twelve trench capes, 735 pounds of yarn had been bought and the expenses of the department amounted to \$698.28. Twenty express parcels had been received, containing 381 pairs of socks, and 22 parcels containing yarn had been sent out from the department. Mrs. G. K. 


