THE ORDINANCE OF BAPTISM is dispensed on the first Sabbath of every month, at the commencement of the morning service, and on the first Wednesday of every month at the commencement of the prayer meeting.

THE ORDINANCE OF THE LORD'S SUPPER is dispensed on the last Sabbath of January, April, July and October.

A PREPARATORY SERVICE on the Friday immediately preceding each of the said Sabbath's at 7.30 p. m.

SPECIAL COLLECTIONS for the poor are taken up on the FRIDAY EVENING and SABBATH MORNING, on every sacramental occasion, separate from, and unconnected with the envelope system.

THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE of the Missionary Association meets in Session Room, on the last Wednesday of every month at 7 p. m.

STATED MEETINGS of the Managers, are held in their room on the second Monday of every month at 8 p. m. and in the Church on the same evening at 7.30, for the purpose of allocating pews.

THE ANNUAL MEETING of the Congregation is held on the third Wednesday of January.

MEMBERS AND ADHERENTS leaving the Church are requested to give notice to the managers, in order that their sittings may be again allocated.

WHEN members change their residence they should give notice either to the Pastor or the Elder of the district, otherwise they cannot reasonably expect to be visited or have their communion cards delivered.

The Managing Committee have much pleasure in submitting their THIRTY SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT, to the Congregation.

By reference to the Treasurer's statement, it will be seen that the revenue of the Church during the year has slightly fallen off.

The receipts for the year foot up \$5,703.63. This includes however a balance on hand from last year of \$109.78, which leaves the nett revenue at \$5,593.85, as against \$5,615.11 last year, or a decrease of \$21.26. This is a small decrease, still the Committee confess to disappointment as they calculated a considerable increase. The arrears at the close of the books however, which the Treasurer regards as perfectly good, amount to about \$200.

The Managers hope that their successors will be able to present a better report next year.

The Managers who retire this year are, H. D. CAMERON, MALCOLM ISBISTER, ROBERT KILGOUR, JOHN DONALDSON, all of whom are eligible for re-election.

The Committee in conclusion, hope the Congregation will unite with them in asking the blessing of God on the Congregation during the ensuing year.

THE 44th ANNUAL REPORT

Knox Church Sabbath School

—FOR THE—

Year Ending 31st December, 1880.

The Sabbath School Association beg leave to present their Annual Report as follows :—

The average attendance for the year has been 287 made up as follows, viz : 19 female teachers, 14 male teachers, 146 girls, 108 boys ; this shows the gratifying increase of 26 over the year 1879, and 10 over the year 1878 ; but from the large membership of the Congregation, this should still be largely increased. During the past year the following scholars have been admitted to full Communion of the Church, viz :—Annie Kilgour, Mary Thompson, Annie Mitchell, Aggie Park, Wm. Peace, which must be a source of thankfulness to all connected with the government of the School. The Psalmody of the Sabbath School is still in charge of our Precentor Mr. James Johnson, under whose care and attention it still holds a leading position in the School, and we would suggest to the scholars the advisability of perfecting themselves in this very pleasant part of our service. After a short interval, during which time, from some cause the meetings for the study of the lessons were discontinued ; these meetings have been resumed, and are held at the close of the Wednesday evening Prayer meetings, when it is hoped that since the members of the Association have again the privilege of instruction from our talented President the Rev. John James, D. D., they will avail themselves of the benefit they may receive by his experience and better fit themselves for the discharge of their duties.

as teachers. The Library as stated in last Annual Report, has not had any new books added to it during the past year; an appeal was made to the Congregation at the Annual Meeting held in January 1880, to enable the Association to procure a new Library, but without success, when it was decided by the Association to put in as good a state of repair as possible the books they had at their disposal, and await some more convenient time to procure a new Library; after carefully reconsidering their decision in appropriating the sum of two hundred dollars towards the purchase of a new Library, the members of the Association thinking a new School Room was more needed, they by a unanimous vote appropriated the \$200 as the first instalment towards a payment of \$500, which the Association pledges itself to raise in three years towards procuring a building more suitable for Sabbath School purposes. The Treasurer reports the amount collected for the year to be as follows:—

To be appropriated as follows: Missions, \$142 91, New School Room, \$122 61,=\$265 52; by this statement it will

be seen that the amount set apart for the school building, falls short of the amount required for the year by the sum of \$77 39. The Pastor still continues his quarterly sermons to the members of the Sabbath School, and these services are well attended by the Scholars, but we regret to say that very little interest is shown by the parents, judging by their attendance in such small numbers on these pleasant and profitable occasions. In conclusion we have to thank God for what, by his aid, we have been able to accomplish in the past, and earnestly ask for his blessing upon those whose privilege it will be to take part in the duties of the School for the coming year so that they may go forward leaning upon him who alone is able to support and bless them in their work of faith and labor of love.
