GRANVILLE, Dec. 19.—The members of
this society held their annual
meeting in the hall, Granville, on
Saturday, the 17th, at 3 p. m. Presi-
dent Scott in the chair. The minutes of pre-
vious annual meeting and interesting
reports of board of directors were read
and approved. The accounts of past
year were certified by audit committee.
The President then said that before
proceeding to the election of officers
for the coming year, he had two
matters of importance to bring before
the meeting. The first was the
report of the committee on the
proposed amalgamation of the
Aberdeen Agricultural Society with
the Granville Agricultural Society.
The committee had been instructed
to report on the subject, and they
had the honor to do so. They
found that the amalgamation was
desirable, and they recommended
that it should be carried out.
The meeting then proceeded to the
election of officers for the coming
year. The following were elected:
President, Mr. J. H. Scott; Vice-
President, Mr. J. H. Scott; Sec-
retary, Mr. J. H. Scott; Treasurer,
Mr. J. H. Scott; and a number of
other officers. The meeting then
proceeded to the election of a
committee to prepare a report on
the state of the society. The
meeting then adjourned until
next year.
