BERNIER WILL GET COOK'S BOXES AT ETNA

He Will Deliver His Verdict on Question of Cook's Success

COOK IS FAR AWAY BUT NOT IN SOUTH AMERICA

His Mind is Still Clear But He is in Very Bad Shape

Calicoon, N. Y., May 9.—Four sledges, built for work in the arctic, were shipped from here to Captain Joseph Bernier of the Canadian marine today by Theo. A. Cook, brother of Dr. Fred A. Cook, the arctic explorer, who lives here on the Cook-Daly farm the family "biplane."

"I wish it understood," said Theo. Cook today, "that whatever may be the outcome of Capt. Bernier's expedition I will stand by him. I regard him as a man who has seen more arctic exploration than any other man alive today, and if he comes back to me and says he cannot believe that Dr. Cook reached the pole, I shall accept that verdict without hesitation. I have no money to employ Captain Bernier, and he would not accept it if I did. He will be under no obligation to me or to Dr. Cook, and can report the facts as he finds them."

Where is the doctor now? he was asked. "He is not, and never has been in South America. He is away from any place where he might be recognized. Though near to a sanitarium he is not an inmate but he is following the advice of a sanitarium physician. He had a letter from him a little while ago and it took three weeks for it to reach me. The last advice was of March 20, but we have had no instructions whereby we can reach the doctor or Mrs. Cook, who is his faithful nurse. His mind is clear, but he is as yet in a condition to face the public before him. From a man who weighed over 200 pounds he has fallen away until he now weighs less than 135. He does not even get the newspapers any more."

Romantic Career of Councillor

Nottingham, Eng., May 9.—A striking example of what may be accomplished by pluck and determination is furnished by the Sheriff of Nottingham (Councillor) Thomas Ward, who on Tuesday was presented by the Guardians with an illuminated address setting forth a record of his life as a guardian and as a councillor of their appreciation of his appointment as sheriff.

Mr. Ward, who is fifty-two years of age, has had a romantic career. He was born of humble parents, his father being a framework knitter, and was sent to Nottingham Workhouse School for some time he worked in a Nottingham coal pit, and when eighteen, owing to a strike at the colliery, he obtained a government free passage to Australia, where he worked in the goldfields. Returning to Nottingham about thirteen months later, in 1877, he secured a position as a porter in a yeast factory, and by his industry and devotion to duty he became salesman, then partner and owner of the business and factory.

MR. ROOSEVELT ADDS WORDS OF PRAISE TO KING EDWARD

Refers to Tacitful Gift Sent From King Edward to Himself

Stockholm, May 9.—Ex-President Roosevelt, who arrived here today, was greatly shocked when he learned of King Edward's death.

Speaking of the late King's tact, Mr. Roosevelt gave an illustration of what he termed the tacit sense of things which the King possessed.

Exchanges Are Splendid Success London, May 7.—With not quite 100 out of the 250 government labor exchanges authorized by parliament six months ago yet opened, employment is already being found for British workmen at the rate of 5000 weekly, according to an official statement just issued by the board of trade.

The showings have come as a decided surprise to the country, the exchanges having been looked on as a failure by the upper classes as socialist innovations and with disfavor by many workmen because they did not absolutely guarantee work and, in many cases, failed to find it. The fact is, however, that large employers are beginning to resort to the exchanges for help, so that good work is not only already being done, but there is a prospect of steady improvement.

143 DIE IN ALPS IN 1909 Fatal Accidents on Increase, According to Viennese Statistics

Vienna, May 7.—Statistics of fatal Alpine accidents published here show an alarmingly rapid increase in the last few years. Three climbers were killed in 1907, but in 1908 the total was 108, and in 1909 no fewer than 143.

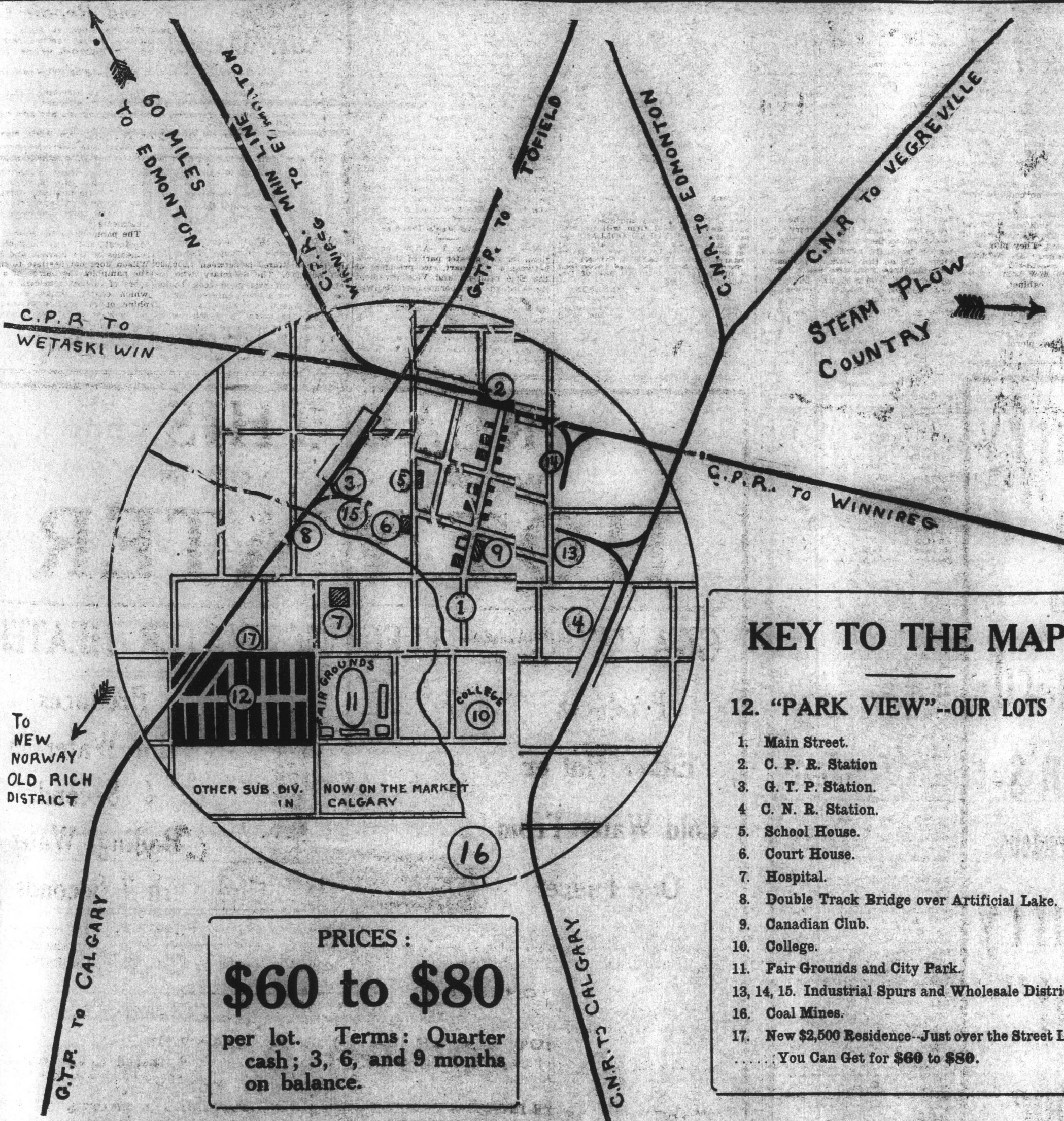

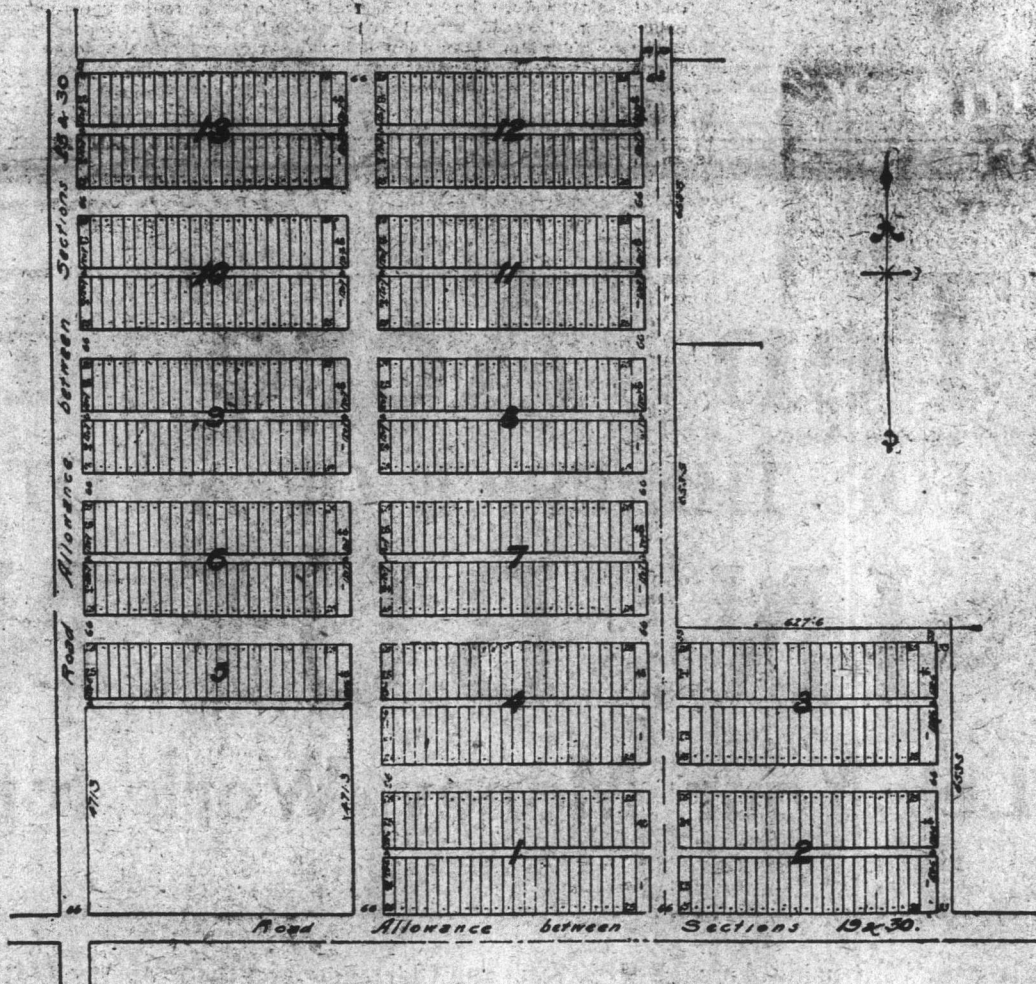

THE TRAGIC DEATH OF JAPANESE OFFICER

Wrote of Progress of the Destruction that Awaited Him

SUBMARINE DESTROYED AND THE CREW KILLED

The Japanese Force Planning Extension of the Navy

Victoria, B.C., May 9.—A dramatic message from the dead, apologizing to the emperor for the loss of submarine No. 6 off Shimidate during the Japanese naval manoeuvres off Kure last month, with all on board, from Commander Sakuma, was found with the bodies after the vessel was raised, according to news brought by the steamer Aymeric today.

Commander Sakuma was in such a state of apoplexy that he breathed with great difficulty as he wrote. The letter, treasured by the Japanese navy department, was found with the bodies of the crew when the submarine was raised. The submarine was of the newest type. She was completed in 1906, was engaged in company with the parent ship, Bekkan Maru, near Hiroshima Bay, carrying out her part in the manoeuvres on April 15, and was submerged 1800 yards east of the parent ship. Two hours passed without much notice being taken of the submarine's failure to rise and then signals were unmaneuvered a boat was lowered and efforts made to locate the submarine. Wireless messages were sent to the admiral and seven destroyers, cruising near Miyalima were ordered to the scene and search was made. It was not until the afternoon of the following day that the submarine was located and on April 17, was re-floated and towed to Kure. Not until the craft was docked was examination made which revealed the bodies and there was also the record left by the commander of what transpired from the time the vessel sank until death stopped his writing.

Apologized for the Loss Much of the message from the dead was not published, but it was stated that Lieut. Sakuma apologized to the emperor for the loss of his vessel and brother officers and crew, of whom he spoke in highest terms as to their heroism and calm wait for death and he requested the emperor to secure their families. The last writing was made at 12:30, an hour and twenty minutes after the boat was submerged, and it conveyed messages of farewell to the minister of the navy and friends, stating that breathing had then become so difficult that further writing was impossible.

Of that part of the commander's tragic record published, much refers to the efforts to raise the vessel. He said one of the crew tried to close the valve of the ventilation pipe, but the chain had broken and he tried to do this with his hand to find it too late. The water began to enter by the rear part of the boat, which fell 25 degrees. The dynamo was submerged and all lights went out, bad gas accumulating almost simultaneously, making breathing most difficult. The crew dove the

current of water from the main tank and further tried to get rid of it by hand pumps. They were drowned as they worked, and chilled.

All Ready for Death The message ended with statements that all were ready for death, realizing that no more could be done and hoped for forgiveness for the loss of the vessel.

Japanese naval authorities stated that the submarine was being listed on a gasoline semi-submerged voyage when a leak was caused and water entered and caused disaster. Three hours passed after the leak before the crew died.

To Enlarge The Navy Tokio newspapers received by the steamer Aymeric stated that conferences are being held by the navy and government officials to draft plans for enlarging the Japanese navy, and a big expansion program will be submitted at the next session of the Diet.

The Yokosuka newspaper received by the steamer stated that the naval increment will be the big burning question. Some point out that Japan has now but six modern battleships and two are on the stocks. Other battleships are more or less obsolete and action is imperative. Many newspapers discuss the matter in an expansive strain.

The Kokumin Shimbun says a large destroyer with 33 knots speed of at least 1500 tons is to be laid down at Nagasaki. Japanese naval authorities having decided on these bigger destroyers as a result of the lessons of Tsushima.

From China news was brought by the Aymeric that the lacquer manufacturers are preparing to appeal for patriotic subscriptions from Chinese in America and elsewhere abroad for resuscitation of the navy, and plans are being prepared for jockyards, colleges and construction schemes.

News was brought by the steamer Aymeric that the lacquer manufacturers of Japan centered at Wallina, in Note, were almost wiped out in a great fire at Wallina on April 16. In all 1908 buildings, including factories, temples, post office and public buildings were destroyed and loss occasioned to the property of over \$2,000,000. The conflagration was due to a small boy playing with matches. Three hundred lacquer manufacturers are engaged there, their exports amounting to half a million dollars yearly.

News was brought by the Aymeric of the official trip of the new steamer Panama Maru, built for the Osaka Steam Navigation line at Tacoma, on April 17, at Nagasaki. A speed of almost fifteen knots was obtained.

Women Threw Dice to Settle Dispute Lansing, Mich., May 9.—Three prominent society women, using a local banker as their arbitrator, settled on Saturday by a turn of the dice the ownership of three valuable diamond rings willed to them by Mrs. L. S. Hudson, a wealthy Lansing woman who recently died.

Three solitary, their combined value being close to \$500, were placed in the hands of J. J. Baird, vice-president of the Capitol National Bank. As the diamonds sparkled on the banker's desk they furnished a brilliant inspiration and he suggested that the women shake dice. Mrs. Buck demurred, but finally agreed and the battle was on. Mrs. Cashman was the first to settle the ivory. A nervous hand grasping the box, shook it and spilled a pair of sixes upon the banker's desk. Mrs. Buck followed with four trays and Mrs. Dowie came across with three aces.

THE GREATEST OF HIS RACE, SAYS REV. MR. KERBY

Eloquent Tribute to Departed Sovereign By Methodist Pastor

At the services in the Central Methodist church Sunday morning and evening, feeling reference was made by Rev. G. W. Kerby to the death of King Edward VII. The pulpit and altar of the church were draped in black and special music was rendered by the choir.

Mr. Kerby said: "Not since that moment, 10 years ago, on the occasion of the death of Victoria the Good, was the civilized world so deeply touched as when the telegraph wires flashed the sad news that King Edward VII had passed away. The whole British Empire was plunged in deepest gloom through the loss of one of the best monarchs and Kings that ever sat on a throne. The nations of the world mourn the loss of one of the greatest diplomats and statesmen the world has ever known. The whole world tribute to the memory of one whose chief aim was to promote brotherhood and good will among men."

"The sovereign of the British Empire," said Mr. Kerby, "is no mere figure head as many would have us believe, but when the constitution approaches a crisis the King is master of the situation, and our late beloved King proved himself such. The power and influence of the British monarchy was never greater than it is at the present time. This is mainly due to the great influence for good of the late Queen, who handed down to her son the great legacy of power and influence of the navy, and plans are being prepared for jockyards, colleges and construction schemes."

"Our late King was not deceived in the slightest degree by the pomp and ceremony of his high office, but was at all times a very human man, and

'Well, it is all over now, and I think I have done my duty. What nobler words were ever handed down in history than these?'"

AUSTRALIA'S PLAN FOR SECURING IMMIGRANTS

Big National Scheme for the Employment of New Settlers.

London, May 9.—A second national scheme for the employment of immigrants from England has been evolved by the Council of Drakard, of Melbourne.

Mr. Drakard has closely studied the problem of the unemployed and proposes by a quid pro quo arrangement to strengthen the Empire, enrich the colonies, conserve the capital involved, increase trade, create wealth, find numerous new avenues of employment, pay interest on the capital, put the deserving poor on the road to prosperity, and cope efficiently with an evil which acutely harasses the taxpayers in this country. Briefly his proposal is as follows:

To take up 50,000 acres of land in western Australia and work it upon a compulsory saving plan. The land would be surveyed and finally cut up into 100 farms of 300 acres each, but the whole would be worked as one homestead for five years, being really a training ground. Ninety single men and ten married men with their wives and children, would be selected. Being without means their passages would be paid; they would be well fed and clothed; given a certain amount weekly but not as wages; the women would be paid for doing the cooking, etc., and, under somewhat stringent regulations, all would work for five years. They would have no voice whatever in the management, nor would they have any means of trafficking with the land, as that would defeat the settlement and development object in view.

At the end of the five years each man provided he has proved himself a willing worker and adaptable, would be given an improved farm of 300 acres worth about £200 and also cash not exceeding £50.

The amount necessary to carry out this scheme is from \$50,000 to \$75,000, upon which it is proposed to pay 4 per cent. interest. The whole of the response for the five years, putting them on a liberal scale, including machinery, etc., would amount to £28,000.

Mr. Drakard estimates that during the five years a total of 50,000 acres would be cropped with wheat.

GRAND DUCHESS A NUN

Widow of Sergius Becomes Mother Superior of New Order

St. Petersburg, May 7.—The Grand Duchess Elizabeth Fedorovna, widow of the Grand Duke Sergius, and sister of the czar, this week took up her duties as mother superior of the new sisterhood of Mary and Martha.

This is the first time in Russia that the Sisters of Mercy have been recognized by the orthodox church. Their relation to the convent nuns is similar to that of the pastoral clergy to the black clergy of the monasteries. Some members of the great Russian families including the young Princess Galitzin, have joined the new sisterhood, whose vows are not at first lifelong. A novice takes vows for a year. At the end of this period, if she so desires, she can remain for three years, and at the end of that time can renew her vows for six years or more. Thus it is only after a decade of service that a woman may decide to dedicate her life to the sisterhood, which is chiefly nursing, reading to the poor and teaching domestic handicrafts.

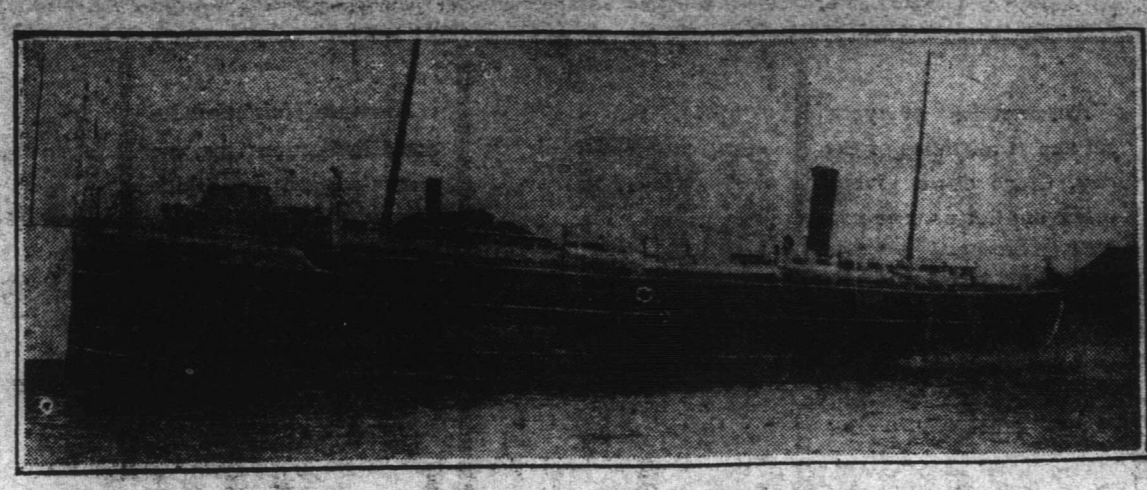
