

Mr. Theodore Traye picked upwards of 1,900 boxes apples this past season. This is the largest apple ield thus far recorded on the Island.

An attempt has been made to raise a little money for Foreign Missions during the Advent season, in accordance with a circular issued by the Bishop.

Mr. Leonard Tolson went last month to Denver, Colorado, to join his brother, C. W. Tolson, who was bliged to go there last fall on account of his health. Since his arrival there they have had a pretty severe map of cold weather, the glass falling to 22 degrees below zero.
