



THIRD SESSION, 1899.

FIRST DAY.

County Council Chambers, Napanee, December 5th, 1899.

Council met at 2 p.m. pursuant to adjournment.

Warden in the chair. Members all present.

The minutes of the last day's sitting of the Council were read and on motion were confirmed.

The communication from W. J. Shannon, asking to be appointed an auditor, was read and on motion was ordered to lay on the table.

A communication from the Provincial Secretary referry accross Napanee river was read and filed.

, A communication from W. R. Aylsworth, County Clerk, County Hastings, re repairs to Sucker Creek bridge, was read, also accounts presented by Mr. Allen Oliver for temporary repairs amounting to \$5.28. On motion referred to Roads and Bridges committee to report.

A communication from Chas. Stevens, printer, Napanee Star, asking for \$300 on account of printing contract was read.

Moved by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Keech, that \$250 be paid Mr. Stevens on account. Carried.

The Grand Jury Presentment, Fall Assizes, was read and filed.

The requisition from the Napanee Board of Education for a grant of \$3,000 was read and on motion was referred to the Finance committee to report.

A communication from the County Clerk of the County York, re Good Roads Convention, was read.

Moved by Mr. Keech, seconded by Mr. Oliver, that it be referred to the Roads and Bridges committee to report. Cd.

A communication from the County Clerk of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, enclosing memorials to the Government reamendments of the Assessment Act and reamendment regulation No. 53, Education Department, was read.

Moved by Mr. Symington, seconded by Mr. Oliver, that the former memorial be referred to the Finance Committee, and the latter to the Education and Printing Committee to report. Carried.

A communication from the County Clerk, County Victoria, re establishment of a Court of Arbitration to consider labor disputes, was read.

Moved by Mr. Amey, seconded by Mr. Milling, that it lay on the table until Thursday morning. Carried.

Moved in amendment by Mr. Keech, seconded by Mr. Martin, that it be signed by the Warden and County Clerk and forwarded to the Clerk of the County of Victoria. Lost.

A communication from the Prisoners' Aid Association was read, and on motion filed.

A communication from I. H. Brisco, resigning his appointment to the vacancy in the Ontario Agricultural College, was read and filed.

Moved by Mr. Keech, seconded by Mr. Oliver, that the Warden's appointment of Tillotson Asselstine and W. H. Milling to vacancies in the Ontario Agricultural College be ratified. Carried.

The Warden and Clerk's report re orders given was read.

Moved by Mr. Keech, seconded by Mr. Amey, that it he referred to the County Property Committee to report. Carried.

Mr. Martin gave notice of the introduction to-morrow of a By-law to assume certain roads as County roads.

On motion Council adjourned until to-morrow, 10 a.m.

Moved by Mr. Riley, seconded by Mr. Oliver, that rule 38 be suspended in order that the By-law might be read the sec-

By motion the committee rose and reported the blanks in the By-law filled in.

Warden resumed the chair.

Moved by Mr Keech, seconded by Mr. Riley, that the report of the committee be adopted. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Riley, that whereas the Municipal Council of the Township of Portland have now pending before the Ontario Legislature a bill entitled "An act to amend the charter of the Napanee River Improvement Company," said act to be known as the Township of Pertland

Whereas the object of this bill is to secure a removal of a certain dam owned and controlled by the Napanee River Improvement Company, located upon Lot 19 in the 6th concession of the Township of Portland, and,

Whereas the removal of said dam will provide an outlet for the preper drainage of several thousand arres of land lying in the Township of Portland, in the County of Frontenac and in the adjoining Township of Camden, in the County of Lennox and Addington, and,

Whereas the proper drainage of said lands will add largely to the revenues of the Municipalities in which they are located and greatly benefit the Government and Township roads passing through the lands, and,

Whereas the Municipal Councils of Camden, and Portland,

and Hinchinbrooke have already petitioned the Ontario Legislature to enact said legislation, and,

Whereas the petitions have been circulated amongst the ratepayers of said townships and largely signed, praying Legislature to enact said legislation,

Be it therefore resolved that in the opinion of this Council the prayers of said petitions should be granted and that this Council memorialize the Legislature to pass said legislation and that the Warden and Clerk be instructed to have signed and forwarded a copy of this resolution to the Attorney General. Lost.

Mr. John R. Scott and Mr. J. H. West were heard on the subject.

Moved in amendment by Mr. Symington, seconded by Mr. Oliver, that the resolution lay on the table until the January session, and that in the meantime the Clerk forward a copy of the same to the Secretary of the Napanee River Improvement Company. Lost.

County Property Committee.

To the Warden and Councillors:

Gentlemen,—We your County Property committee beg leave to report and recommend as follows:

- 1.—We recommend payment of Napanee Gas Co. up to December 1st, 1899, Court House and Registry Office \$9.60; J. J. Perry's account, 55.59; Boyle & Son's account, Judge's Chambers, \$1.50; Boyle & Son's account, locks for jail, \$27.75; N. E. Light and Water Co., lamps, etc., \$2.10; Thos. Meagher, account, lime jail, \$2.10; M. S. Madole, account, rubber cloth, jail, \$3.40.

Gentlemen,—As directed by this Council at its December session, I visited Sucker Creek bridge and met Mr. Wm. R. Aylsworth, the representative from the County of Hastings, at the bridge on December 20th last. We examined the timbers of the bridge thoroughly, and found them in a fairly good state of preservation, and in our opinion perfectly safe for public travel for two or three years, with the exception of the covering which is worn very much in the centre. We decided to recommend our respective Councils to have the centre ten feet covered with pine or hemrespective Councils to have the centre ten feet covered with pine or hemlock plank on top of the old covering, which is cedar and sound.

I also went to Mink's bridge and had the eastern span strengthened by

a truss which will make it safe for travel by the public until it .n be replaced by a new structure next summer.
