Ottawa, Jan. 4.—The railway commission will make shortly an order bringing into effect the new car service rules that have been agreed upon after consultation with the railway interests and with shippers all over the Dominion.

When the new car service rules go into effect the railway companies will be required to notify shippers of the arrival of their cars that the latter have been ordered.

Later on it will be for the commission to consider whether they will make the railways liable for damages to shippers when the latter suffer financial loss thru delay in the supply of cars.

Michigan Central Said to Be After Traction Companies.

Detroit, Mich., Jan. 4.—A rumor today from Wall Street, is that the Michigan Central part of the Vanderbilt system wants to buy the Detroit Traction Railway, which controls all the street car lines in Detroit and all but two of the interurban lines to and from the Jackson line and the Toledo line, parallel to the Michigan Central and are strong competitors.

The Michigan Central met the competition of the Toledo line two months ago by a cut in fare equal to 10 per cent. The New York Central proper has already purchased several traction companies in New York State.

STREET RAILWAY APPEALS TO BROBE ELECTION FRAUDS FROM THAT PENALTY AWARD CABINET CONSIDERING IT

Object to Judge Snyder's Decision— Election Petitions Dismissed.
