In the Year 1885 there will be four Eclipses—two of the Sun and two of the Moon.

- First*—An annular Eclipse of the Sun, March 16; visible partially over the United States generally; as an annular from latitude 36 deg., Pacific coast, in a north-easterly direction to Hudson's Bay, in latitude 71 deg.  
*Second*—A partial Eclipse of the Moon, March 30; invisible in the United States.  
*Third*—A total Eclipse of the Sun, September 3; invisible in the United States; visible in the southern part of South America and part of Australia.  
*Fourth*—A partial Eclipse of the Moon, September 24; visible generally in the United States. Time at Washington, D. C.: Begins 1 h. 6 m. morn.; middle 2 h. 40 m. morn.; ends 4 h. 14 m. morn.

**EMBER DAYS.**—Feb. 25, 27, 28. May 27, 29, 30. Sept. 16, 18, 19. Dec. 16, 18, 19.

CITY, OR DROP LETTERS FOR CITY DELIVERY.—1 cent per  $\frac{1}{2}$  ounce.

The above rates must in every case be prepaid by postage stamp. When posted wholly unpaid they cannot be forwarded, but will be sent to the Dead Letter Office.

### NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS ADDRESSED TO PLACES IN CANADA, NEWFOUNDLAND, GREAT BRITAIN (BY CANADIAN STEAMERS,) OR THE U. S.

Printed and published in Canada, and posted from the office of publication, or News Agency, to actual Subscribers or News Agents (including exchanges) are subject to a rate of one cent per pound gross weight, which must be prepaid by Publisher at the time of posting. Such periodicals must be issued not less frequently than once per month. Newspapers for England will be sent to subscribers at the same rate.

TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS ADDRESSED TO PLACES IN CANADA, NEWFOUNDLAND AND UNITED STATES.

On all Newspapers and Periodicals other than those from the office of publication, including all Newspapers and Periodicals published less frequently than once a month, the postage rate is one cent per 4 ounces in weight, which must be prepaid by postage stamp. To United Kingdom, 2 cts. per 4 ounces.

Newspapers and Periodicals weighing less than one ounce may be posted singly; if prepaid by postage stamp, one half cent each.

Newspapers from Office of Publication posted for City Delivery are not delivered by Letter Carriers unless prepaid 1 cent each by stamp.
