Strong Men and Women Wept. All Talked at Once and a Veritable Babel Ensnared.

How strange the worship of the Maker is and has been! The idol of the heathen, the human sacrifice of the Druid, the wild kiss of a babe by its Hindu mother and the white, the condensation and help of the Great Unknown was beseeched.

Gradually, however, it was revealed that the blood, the love, the worship, the advances had been made, until to-day the strict religion of self-sacrifice and devotion to others. It takes strange forms, sometimes, and more strange than that of the Mennonites.

A Picturesque Spot.

At an early hour yesterday a visit was made by The World to a Mennonite camp-meeting that is being held opposite Dufferin Park. On approaching one is struck by the beauty and quietude of the spot.

At one of these a girl was kneeling and on being asked if she was kneeling, she replied, "Yes, I am kneeling for my sins."

"Where do you get your food?" she was asked. She said that all food was brought and their homes, except meat, bread and milk.

The Tabernacle Itself.

Entering the square, the tabernacle was next examined. The object of the worshipers had left, but a few were still talking to and encouraging those who, in the meeting, had come to the penitent belief. It is a structure of white, with a rough-made seats, and the ground covered with clean new straw, which fills the place with a sweet smell.

One of the pastors came forward, and on being asked what the object of the meeting was, and some of their doctrines, said: "There are about 200 of us here, from Sarnia, Owen Sound, Markham, Berlin, Michipicott, and many other places, for the purpose of a gospel meeting. Its doctrine is that of justification and regeneration, but in the washing of feet, we are different. We consider the holidays fallen from their old standard of worship."

No Theological Schools.

As for his ministry, he said, "We have no theological colleges, but when a man feels the call to the ministry in Christ's church, he is reported by him to the conference, and if, after three years, he is found to be a true minister, he is admitted. Our conference meets annually, generally at Berlin, and our ministers have no fixed salary."

At One Service.

The service starting at 10 a.m. was well attended. It opened with a testimonial meeting, then, after a hymn, prayer and a Scriptural reading, a young girl took the floor.

"I would be glad to feel the earnestness with which she talked, and for the 20 minutes she spoke little was heard of the boys' running around the tent and the 'Amens' they were uttering, but the text which she so feelingly spoke was: 'The secret of all happiness and joy.'"

"The secret of all happiness and joy," she said, "is in perfect obedience to God. Who deny that the men and women who are here, and who have their hearts full of strong men and women would sit and weep as they listened to the speaker.

Mennonites may work greatly on the emotions, yet when the motion leaves there is not a reaction, leaving the convert worse than he was before, but a simple trust and diligence.

A Strange Scene Enacted.

After the addresses came an invitation to the unsaved, and the scene was a strange one. Some of the seekers crying hysterical, with four or five praying aloud around them, while others were singing, and with a general chorus of 'Amens' everywhere.

The Mennonite Church was first organized in Zurich in 1525, and their name was given because the leader of the movement was Menno Symons. The religion rapidly spread in Switzerland, and, generally speaking, they were driven to Germany, where Angsburg and Strasbourg became their capitals. His persecutions, and their own and more than 3000 of them suffered martyrdom. They found relief in Moravia, where they are greatly increased, until the Thirty Years' War drove them away.
