ERIEC FIGHT WITH FIRE

Big Blaze in the Adamson Manufacturing Company's Factory on Pearl-Street.

DAMAGE ESTIMATED AT \$12,000.

Sixty Persons Are Thrown Out of Employment—Firemen Did Splendid Work.

The four-story brick premises at 33, 35 and 37 Pearl-street, occupied by the Adamson Manufacturing Company, manufacturers of frames, room moulding and bamboo goods, were visited by fire a little before 11 o'clock last night, and considerable damage was occasioned.

Flames in Possession. The fire was discovered by Private Night-watchman George Bell, who sent in a still alarm to the Central Fire Station.

Firemen Took No Chances. The firemen took no chances, however, and placed the water under position ready for use should the fire make its way to the next flat.

Estimate of the Damage. The burned building is owned by the Toronto Mortgage Company, and is valued at \$12,000.


