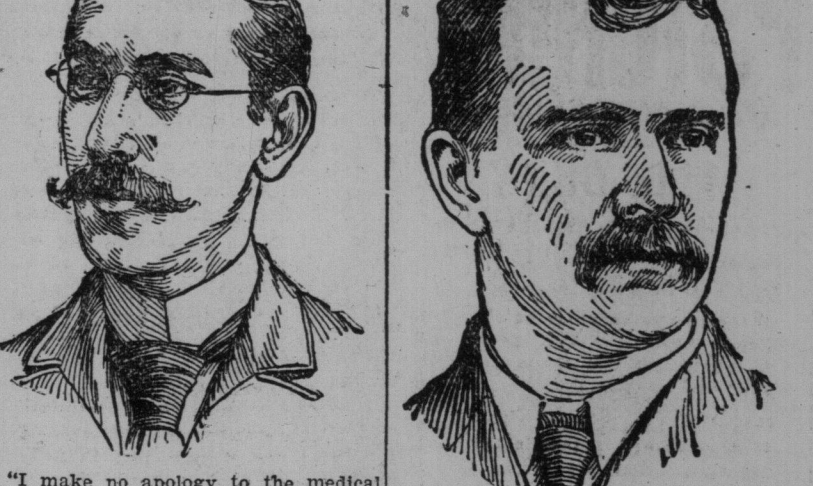

The Annual Meeting of Shareholders was held at the Company's Offices, Toronto, Friday, 19th February, 1904. The President, the Hon. George A. Cox, occupied the chair and the following annual report of the Directors, with accompanying Financial Statement, was read by the Secretary:

The Directors have pleasure in presenting to the Shareholders their report on the business of the year ending 31st December last. The following synopsis of the accounts submitted herewith summarizes the results of the year's transactions:

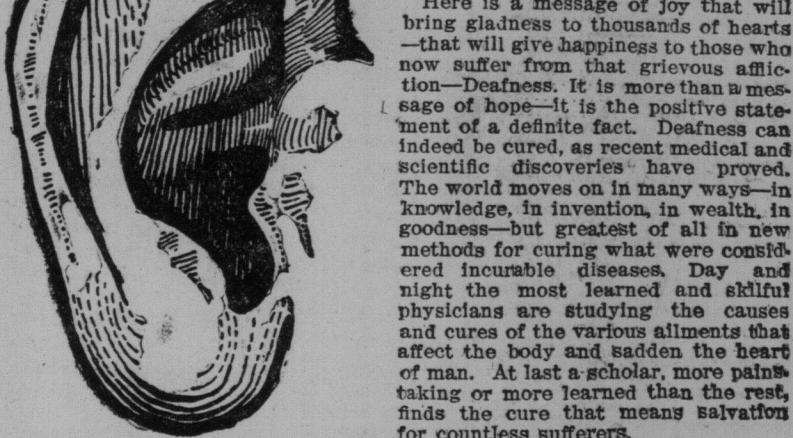
