5% CARLOADS OF LIVE STOCK AT THE UNION STOCK MARKET

Quality of Export Cattle Good—Butchers Only Medium—Hogs 25c Cwt. Higher in Price.

Receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Market were 27 car loads, composed of 1183 cattle, 40 sheep and lambs, 20 hogs and 8 calves.

The quality of the export cattle was fair, while that of the butchers' class was only a medium.

Trade was fairly good, especially for the shipping cattle. All of the leading export dealers were on the market.

Exporters.—Prices for exports ranged from \$4.35 to \$5 per cwt., the bulk going at \$4.50 to \$4.85. Export bulls sold from \$3.25 to \$4, with a few extra choice quality at a little more.

Butchers.—The bulk of the butchers' cattle offered were not of good quality. More choice butchers would have found ready sale.

Prices for butchers' cattle ranged from \$2.75 to \$4.25, medium cattle, the bulk being of this class, sold at \$3.75 to \$4. Common mixed stock, cows, calves and hogs, sold at \$2.50 to \$3.50; inferior at \$1.75 to \$2.25; common cows, \$2.25 to \$2.75 per cwt.

Milk Cows.—About half a dozen milk cows sold from \$35 to \$55 each.

Sheep and Lambs.—Robert Winler had the best bunch of yearling lambs that has been delivered at this market this season.

Prices for sheep and lambs ranged from \$1.50 to \$2.50 per cwt. for the ewes and \$3 per cwt. for the lambs.

Hogs.—Prices on this market have been advanced a few cents since Monday. Choice hogs sold at \$6 per cwt. and lights and fats at \$5.50 per cwt.

Representative Sales.—Wm. LeVack was the highest buyer as usual, having purchased 24 car loads of about 500 fat cattle, composed of butchers' and shipping cattle.

HUGH MUNRO DEAD

Port Arthur, March 13.—(Special)—Hugh Munro, crown timber agent, died this morning, after a long illness, at his residence in Toronto, at the age of 52.

He was born in Scotland and came to Toronto in 1870, and for fifteen years acted as clerk of works. Under his supervision, the old City Hall was built, and he was also in charge of the construction of the new City Hall at this point, and the Port Arthur government buildings. During the erection of the new Port Arthur government buildings, a severe accident occurred which resulted in his death. He was removed from Toronto to take the position of crown timber agent, and died there on March 13th, 1905.
