*The Missionary Committee to the Friends of Primitive Methodist
Missions in Canada West:*

It is our pleasing duty on behalf of the Missionary Com-
mittee to submit to our subscribers and friends a brief report
of the doings of the past year.

On former occasions we have alluded to the origin of the
Primitive Methodist people in Britain; and have refuted the
statements continually repeated, especially by book-makers
who publish histories of "all religions," and articles in the
encyclopædias, that we are a sect founded in "secession"—a
split—a branch riven from some parent stock. And in several
of these publications, here and elsewhere, no notice is given
that such a people exist at all. Dr. Stevens however, in his
celebrated history of Methodism, has done us justice.

In a late census in England the Commissioner gave a very
accurate account, and highly praised our people for their useful
labours in the community, but observed that however the
Primitive Methodists might suit the lower orders of society,
they were not adapted for the refined and intelligent classes.

In all probability this *illustrious officer* of the government
held the opinion that there were two editions of the gospel—

one for the rich and refined; and the other for the poor and illiterate, or as they were once called by a great parliamentary orator, "the swineish multitude!"

As usual in Canada, our census gentlemen lumped us among "other Methodists." A part of the press have observed this, and have commented on it as unfair. However, we have taken no public notice of this matter ourselves, as we know it is not of great importance: as at Quebec, in relation to religious statistical matters, little reliance can be placed on their doings.

Forty years ago, when the writer was a missionary, the influential denominations were very cold and satirical in their allusions to us, a *cant term* was very current in certain quarters—we were described as the "ONE TALENTED CONNEXION" or church! Well, certainly the admission of having one talent was something, as it was not insinuated that the one talent lay hid in a napkin, for it certainly was out at interest, as it has undoubtedly multiplied itself during the last fifty years.

From ten persons converted to God from the world, who formed the first class in 1810—fifty-two years ago—there were in June last 135,392 members—increase last year 3,278—nearly 800 ministers,—schools, chapels, etc., corresponding.

But we drop this line of observation, and review the work in Canada. And what can be said to justify calling public meetings, and getting our young and elderly ladies to persevere with such energy in soliciting contributions.

Well, our Mission commenced in Little York (Toronto) in 1829. The object of the mission was primitive and apostolic—to preach Christ, and to gather our own people into church fellowship that had emigrated hither; not to sap other churches or to detach dissatisfied people from other communities, and build up a feeble structure on a rickety foundation!

Now we admit our success in mission work in Canada has not equalled that of the parent body. Several reasons may be assigned for the difference—one perhaps our lack of faith in

God and confidence in ourselves. Some have doubted of the stability of the enterprise; hence the cry that rang some time since for amalgamation with other churches, as if we had no special mission from God; but those loudest in that cry happily moved towards the gangway and walked the plank, so that we have now an united crew on board, and the vessel steams on much more rapidly than formerly on her voyage of mercy and love to perishing souls.

In relation to our stations in Canada, we have several self-sustaining circuits, and about 30 missions—40 missionaries—200 congregations—2,340 members—1,200 Sabbath scholars. Increase of members for the year, 174.

At the last Conference two new stations were divided off; and in October last a jubilee mission was commenced at Bluevale, in Huron County, where there is great need of the gospel. A class of 30 has been formed; a new chapel is in progress; a number of preaching places have been opened; and at a protracted service a number of persons have been converted to God.

We are in hopes that several missions will soon become circuits, and thus liberate the funds for fresh openings.

We have several new openings ready, and suitable men we could engage, but the funds should be equal to such extension, or embarrassment would follow; at the same time we should ever leave a margin for the exercise of faith, and not view this enterprise as we would a commercial speculation.

Some years ago we could command funds limitedly, but the difficulty was the want of men; now it is the reverse. We have the agents, but lack the funds.

Those friends who take the *Christian Journal* newspaper will be aware that almost weekly there is intelligence given of the missions in relation to particular incidents—happy deaths—church extension—Sabbath schools, and general progress.

There is one aspect of the Society to which we refer in order to *reassure* the patrons and subscribers, and that is the management of the missions.

The Primitive Methodist people have ever shown a keenness of investigation in reference to the agents they employ in order to husband their resources; and get the largest amount of work done for the smallest amount of expense.

Each agent is closely scanned—no sinecure office is allowed—each one must give full proof of his ministry, that it may be proved he is in the apostolic succession, as one that has the *converting gift*, and *enlarges* the church of God.

That this may be rendered certain, a report of each place in members, finances, etc., is discussed at a quarterly meeting of his station.

A schedule is then filled up by himself and the officials, which is forwarded to the General Missionary Committee, to be examined in detail; and

A tabular report, with minutes on each mission, is then made out by the General Secretary, and dispatched to the parent Committee in London, England, to be thoroughly sifted by those business men.

Now this process, or ordeal, to all the subscribers, and to soul-saving missionaries, must, we think, be very satisfactory.

Another aspect is the support the Sabbath Schools are yielding to the funds, which might be greatly increased in our Church, and which would benefit the young by teaching them to give, whilst they urge others to do so. Brampton circuit Sabbath scholars collected last year \$105, and Toronto circuit (three places) \$112 42. Most of the stations have engaged the children with missionary cards, and considerable sums have been raised; but the brethren have not kept a separate account, but included such sums in the total receipts. Now this is becoming a cheering feature in the missionary

enterprise, ranking the youth among its supporters. It has been said, "coming events cast their shadows before;" and surely now that the children in our Zion are so actively engaged, these shadows are extended before us. The propriety of this juvenile movement is now as universally admitted as its success ought to be a matter of gratitude to God.

Beginning with the church, it is increasing and perpetuating the missionary spirit among all classes of the people, and the prosperity which has attended the measure is only a prelude of what another generation may be expected to accomplish—as the droppings that precede the fertilizing shower; or the twilight that ushers in the splendour of the full orb of day.

In the following pages of this report will be seen the honored names of those who, in the *past*, have contributed to one of the holiest charities that ever was inaugurated by the Holy One of Israel, and his servants. We trust those benevolent friends of the Lord Jesus, and of humanity, will not be weary in well doing, but will this year *increase* their liberality, and *many others*, through the agency of the ministers and missionary collectors, will be found to swell the NOBLE ROLL! Such, in the great day of the Lord, will be remembered, as they have remembered him.
