FIFTY-SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

OF THE

St. George's Society

OF THE

CITY OF TORONTO,

FOR THE YEAR 1890.

THE year for which the Committee were elected having now expired, it becomes their duty in accordance with the Constitution of the Society, to present this their Annual Report of the work of the Society for the year 1890. Also the Treasurer's Statement of Receipts and Expenditures; with the Auditor's Report thereon, and certified statement of the Investments of the Society.

RELIEF.

There have been 962 Applicants relieved during the year; during the Summer season the English emigrants that arrived were not as numerous, and were generally of a more thrifty class than previous years; and some very pleasing cases have occurred of the assistance given being returned to the Society. The cost of the relief given has amounted to \$628.33, which has been distributed in the usual way, viz., for bread, meat, passages, &c., in accordance with the special need of the applicant. Services of various kinds were also rendered, which

are frequently of more value than the monetary or other relief given. Orders have been given for graves in the burial Plot in St. James' Cemetery for fifteen adults and three children.

FINANCIAL.

The Treasurer's Annual Statement duly audited will be presented herewith. The financial position continues to be good. As on former occasions the accounts are well paid up to the beginning of the year.

MEMBERSHIP.

The number of members elected during the year has probably exceeded any other year in the history of the Society. There have been 32 Life Members, and 115 Ordinary Members elected, some of whom have not yet paid their subscriptions.

Mr. Rowsell was one of the founders of the Society, for twenty years its Treasurer, and to his death a warm friend and supporter of the Society. And the last of its original founders. Life Members 336. Three having so far as is known died during the year : Mr. W. Chapman, a very highly respected gentleman ; Mr. J. E. Day, a Past President, and for some time an earnest worker in the Society ; Mr. Jno. Eagles, long known as the keeper of the principal hotel in Weston.

Ordinary Members, 445 ; and as far as is known six have died during the year, viz., Mr. Jno. Cottle, a very respectable corn dealer ; Mr. A. Chantler, a young man just commencing life, and only elected a member during the year ; Mr. Jno. Kent, a gentleman of excellent standing in the community as a useful and energetic man ; Mr. A. Marling, a gentleman of high standing in the Educational Department of the Province, and very much respected by the community at large ; Mr. Jacobs, a comparatively new member of the Society, and Mr. J. W. Young, a gentleman of the highest standing in the commercial community, and a very prominent member of the Society.

ANNIVERSARIES, ENTERTAINMENTS, &c.

Following the established usage for many years, the first Anniversary Service was held in St. James' Cathedral on Sunday afternoon, April 20th. The Rev. H. Symonds preached an appropriate Sermon. The Sons of England again turned out in full force, and the Church was filled to overflowing.

The second Service was held in the Bond Street Congregational Church. The Rev. G. H. Sandwell preached a very good Sermon.

The Musical portion of the Services were under the direction of Mr. W. E. Haslem, and Mr. J. G. Lawson, and were very efficient.

The Churches, as on previous occasions, were very courteous and kindly given.

DINNER.

The Dinner was again held at the Walker House. As is customary the President took the Chair, with the Vice-Presidents in the Vice Chairs. One hundred and seventeen gentlemen sat down to the dinner, which was well served.

Some of the speeches were eloquent and interesting, and the songs were pleasing.

EXCURSION.

The Excursion was to Victoria Park, and the prospect of its being successful was good, but unfortunately the weather turned out bad, raining for a considerable portion of the day, so that the attendance was small, and the receipts correspondingly the same.

CONCERT.

The Concert was again given in the Pavilion in the Horticultural Gardens, and was one of the most successful ever given by the Society.

As on former occasions, it was on the evening of Thanksgiving Day, November 6th. Mr. Schuch was again engaged to conduct it, and in every way it was most satisfactory.

The net results were \$303.32.

CHRISTMAS DISTRIBUTION.

The Christmas Distribution this year was more extensive than ever before, most generous Contributions were received. It was made in a Store, No. 42 Scott Street, very kindly loaned by Jno. Fisken, Esq., and it was well adapted for the purpose. The Collections made by the Committee and Stewards amounted to \$984, and the Expenditure to \$951.62.

1,035 families, consisting of 5,561 individuals, received a good supply of provisions.

7,215 lbs. of Beef were purchased, and donations of meat to a very large extent were received.

1,420 loaves of bread, 1,000 lbs. of sugar, and the same number of quarter lbs. of tea were distributed.

erection of a suitable building on the lot. After 1,000 shares of ten dollars each had been subscribed for, Provisional Directors were elected from the subscribers, and when the Charter was obtained they assumed the position of Directors. They have made three calls upon the Shareholders, and it is fully expected that they will be in a position to commence the building on the first opening of Spring. As will be seen by the Treasurer's Report the lot has been fully paid for, and the Society holds the deed.

In conclusion, taking what may be termed a summary view of the Society's operations during the year, the general relief given has been of an ordinary character.

In the different efforts for the replenishment of the funds of the Society, it has been a remarkably successful year, in most instances ; the number of new members elected has seldom, if ever, been exceeded ; the collection at St. James' Cathedral, and the overplus from the dinner were very satisfactory ; the results of the Concert has only on a few occasions been exceeded. The collections for Christmas distribution were fully up to former years, while the donations of meat probably exceeded any previous year.

In only two sources of revenue have the receipts of the year fallen short. First, the general donations have been but few and small, probably owing to the building operations ; and secondly, the receipts from the Excursion owing to the unfavourable state of the weather.
