WHY SOCIALISM GROWS. (Montreal Witness.)

It is significant that Mr. Victor Berger, of Milwaukee, sponsor of the Socialist mayor of that city, Mr. Seidal, will be the first Socialist member of the United States Corgress. The New York World says that 65,000 votes were cast for the Socialist candidate for Governor of New York State, and it notes whereas Mr. Debs received only 87,000 votes for President in 1900, in 1908 420,793 votes were cast for him. It is significant, too, that whereas the Socialists were only the sixth national party in 1896 in order of strength, by 1904 they had become the third. It is doubtless true that demagogues and agitators and the ignorant have too much part in the Socialist eampaign, but what party is lacking in such 'undesirables'? The real strength of the growing Socialist movement is, however, found in the present intolerable economic conditions and brazen financial immorality.
