THE ADDRESS PASSED.

Thursday's Work in the Assembly. Speeches by the Second and Other Members. The Points of Interest Touched in Discussion. Dr. Alward, in responding to the address in reply, congratulated the "free records" from Albert upon his able and eloquent speech. Mr. Emmons had left little to say. He was particularly pleased with the reference to the speech to the St. John public hospital. During the last year there were in that institution 425 patients, 10 of whom were from counties outside of St. John. It cost about \$10,000 a year to run the hospital. There were other grants amounting to \$3,000. In other words two-thirds the cost of the institution had to be borne by the tax-payers of St. John. He did not know how the government intended to relieve the commissioners, whether or not it was intended to impose a tax on the different municipalities of the province, but all would agree that something should be done. It was a matter of great importance, and a great thing for the province, and particularly for St. John, which stood so high in the estimation of the empire. St. John was pre-destined to take a front rank in the cities of the Dominion, and that was well as it should be. He agreed with Mr. Emmons in his reference to the widening of the franchise, and referred to the significant fact that two ladies were now members of the common council of London, England, one of them being a woman of title. Mr. Blair moved and Mr. McLean seconded that the address be taken up by section.

THE ADDRESS PASSED.

Thursday's Work in the Assembly. Speeches by the Second and Other Members. The Points of Interest Touched in Discussion. Dr. Alward, in responding to the address in reply, congratulated the "free records" from Albert upon his able and eloquent speech. Mr. Emmons had left little to say. He was particularly pleased with the reference to the speech to the St. John public hospital. During the last year there were in that institution 425 patients, 10 of whom were from counties outside of St. John. It cost about \$10,000 a year to run the hospital. There were other grants amounting to \$3,000. In other words two-thirds the cost of the institution had to be borne by the tax-payers of St. John. He did not know how the government intended to relieve the commissioners, whether or not it was intended to impose a tax on the different municipalities of the province, but all would agree that something should be done. It was a matter of great importance, and a great thing for the province, and particularly for St. John, which stood so high in the estimation of the empire. St. John was pre-destined to take a front rank in the cities of the Dominion, and that was well as it should be. He agreed with Mr. Emmons in his reference to the widening of the franchise, and referred to the significant fact that two ladies were now members of the common council of London, England, one of them being a woman of title. Mr. Blair moved and Mr. McLean seconded that the address be taken up by section.
