Ottawa, Sept. 27—The announcement that Earl Grey has postponed the date of his departure from Ottawa to the 12th inst. in view of the political situation now existing at Ottawa, was made by the Governor General himself tonight at a farewell banquet held at the Hotel Windsor.

The banquet was held in the restaurant of the House of Commons, and was presided over by Judge McTavish, president of the clubs, and attended by 300 club members and members of the various committees.

His health of Grey was proposed by Sir Charles Fitzpatrick. Earl Grey in responding after personal references and after bearing testimony to the affection with which he would regard Canada, announced his intention of disregarding the unwritten convention which forbids former governors general from revisiting Canada.

Eulogies Canadian Clubs. He gave a warm eulogy of Canada, and eulogized the Canadian clubs, the church of the nation's religious institutions. Speaking in warm terms of the Empire, he referred with admiration to the energetic action during his term of office in taking over the management of Halifax and Esquimaux.

It was pointed out that Italian interests in Tripoli had not been threatened and expressed the hope that Italy would desist from her contemplated measures. Assurances were given that the Turkish government would continue to be friendly towards the Italian government.
