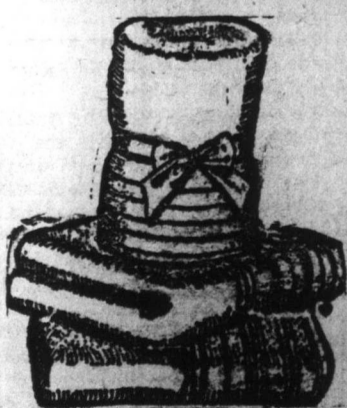

BOLEHEVISM vs. RELIGION OR MATERIALISM vs. SPIRITUALITY.

In my short life I have observed at certain times, waves of emotion pass over the world. Any casual reader of history will also have noticed the great waves of thought and feeling which passed over the world from time to time. Sometimes the wave was the Reformation; another was the slave; during recent years there has been the social wave manifested in such laws as Prohibition, passed in very general upward tendency such as the world has ever experienced. At the present time men are busy thinking of other waves which are sweeping over them and trying them on. They know not where there is the Yellow Peril, by which is meant by some, the crazy rush for gold. Gold, Gold, Gold, Marner, vexed and seized upon the love of yellow metal, hidden away, and yet it was loved and hugged. A miserably miser he was, Silas Marner is repeated and duplicated in hundreds of lives. Men and women indulged and infuriated by the passion for gold. It is a peril, all right; a chance, for when a man gets the gold he had, there's no cure but death, no sense of anything else but get, get.

to reconstruct society or any new basis whatsoever, its effect has been entirely destructive. The Bolshevists have proceeded contrary to all known laws of evolution and development, for they have severed the soul from the body of true life, national life, and discarding the greater; the eternal, the spiritual, they have magnified and glorified materialism—the body, mere matter, the temporal, the earthy. Their programme is merely a particular application of the materialistic conception of life, erected as a dogma, and proclaimed as the fundamental principle of all human society. Of course this is by no means a new thought. Socialism in any form, except what might be called "Christian Socialism," has the same fundamental idea, but between Socialism and Bolshevism there is this difference, namely, the latter advocates and carries out its thought in immediate and bloody revolution. The Socialist talks; the Anarchist kills the "Arch" the King or ruler; the Bolshevist kills all and sundry who do not come within the bounds of his ideal state. It is a law of action, and as such, is unsoftened by its very nature to be the constructive genius of a new order of things, for action without thought is ever destructive. One of the most striking characteristics of Bolshevism is its pronounced hatred of Religion, most particularly of Christianity. The Bolshevist regards even the nominal Christian as being not only different in thought, but as being an enemy to be persecuted and wiped out of existence. His attitude is caused by the fact that the Christian Religion emphasizes the eternal, the spiritual. The Christian believes in the law of evolution, in working and waiting, for the highest good. He speaks of "a land that is fairer than day," which "By faith," he can see afar. The Bolshevist is impatient to realize his ideal kingdom. He wants it now, he must have it now, and he fights, thinking that by bloodshed he brings it about. No act is wrong which helps to the immediate realization of the earthly paradise, where Religion, and capitalist domination is no more, where every man is poor or professional, and is equal. He practically denies the spiritual. Love is a weak-

ness, whether it be love of country; love of men, love of wife or husband, or of children; or in any sense. There are only two conditions and sets of relation in the world. "Rich and Poor." The former is an evil to be exterminated, the latter is to be exalted. He does not believe in justice or truth or in any virtue; as such to him justice is the law of the strongest, jungle law, the right of the big fish to swallow the little fish. The Capitalist used to have that right, now Labour has it. The strife of the classes must be as implacable as the struggle between the beasts of the field. It is a struggle until one of the contestants is destroyed. The Bolshevist must destroy the rich man. Other characteristics are, (a) The Bolshevists' contempt of intellectual callings. To him manual labour holds the privileged position; the Bricklayer, the hod-carrier; the miner, any worker is far better treated than the teacher, the clergy, the lawyer, the doctor. Among the Bolshevists, the worth of a man is estimated solely in terms of the material force that he represents. Only bodily work is true work. Mental work is mental. (b) Another consequence of the materialistic conception of society is the Bolshevist treatment of the family. Since there is no spiritual bond between the sexes, there can be no constant relation. A man is not bound to his wife or children. He may leave them at any time and go to another. Men and women can change their partners at any time, and as often as they wish. Wives and children are nationalized, i.e., they belong to the State, i.e., they belong to everybody. Jungle law again.

THE BOLSHEVIST IDEAL.

In short, the feature most characteristic of Bolshevism is to be found in the practical method it adopts for the realization of its ideal state. The armed conflict of classes, war to the death against all those who possess, except those who are strong enough to resist the oppressor and to plunder others. The consequences are appalling. To believe that the best interests of society are secured by civil war, by the armed conflict of classes, by the poor and illiterate taking up the sword against the rich and the intellectual, is to introduce hellish conditions. Under such a regime, social order and progress are impossible. In Russia, where Bolshevism is probably most pronounced, in every town and village men are killing each other, blood flows very freely in the streets. Those who were diligent in business in normal times, who were the brains and the capital of the country, who were the producers, are now afraid to produce. To be known as having more than is absolutely necessary to keep body and soul together is to meet trouble. If one man owns, or is known to own two cows, or two horses, by the man who owns only one cow or one horse, he is regarded with disfavour and dissatisfaction. To encourage the higher virtues is to create a death trap. Every man for himself. Bolshevism is a war of all against all. It is fatal to production of every kind and prolific of evil. The best policy for the peasant, who is the most-favoured kind or class of creature, is to produce as little as possible, for if he produces anything above immediate and bare need, he is robbed and killed. Consequently Russia has an idle peasantry. The factories are closed down; transportation has ceased, except to move troops. Workers in towns and cities are idle and hungry, and occasionally swoop down upon the villages and rural districts, creating bitterness and a state of warfare between town and country. And so from one end of the world to the other; from one end of society to another; all through the complex mass of the human family, Bolshevism would create murder, bloodshed,

greed, poverty and general decomposition. It is a curse, a blight, a plague. A pack of wolves gathered for hunting in common, and then tearing each other to pieces when no other prey is to be found, furnishes an exact image of a society, where the advantage or the appetite of each member has become the sole law of conduct. That is Bolshevism. A community of human beings cannot exist on these terms.

BOLSHEVISM—ITS NEMESIS.

Society owes it to itself to destroy the destroyer. It would be the height of folly to allow such a pest to stalk any land. I have called it a wave. Bolshevism reaches its "bore" in Russia to-day, but its tidal action is not confined to that unhappy place; ripples may be seen here and there. The general influence is wide spread. It may be a wide reach from Moscow to Winnipeg, but the same evil genius which stormed Moscow in August or September, was storming Winnipeg at the same time, and expressing itself in strikes and riots all over Canada and the States. "While God's in His heaven, all's right with the world," wrote Mrs. Browning. Already where Bolshevism has been most rife, a revival of religion is taking place. Bolshevism seeks to destroy the spiritual, but its hand will surely wither and waste. For a time the law of force and materialism may seem to flourish, (for instance, look at Germany); yet Nemesis will surely follow. Just as the blood of Martyrs is the seed of the church, so the blood of those who die for love of God, and country and truth and man and good, shall not be shed in vain.

"The wheels of God they grind exceeding slow; But they grind exceeding small." It is only in a country where the religious life is enfeebled, that Bol-

British Have New Naval Shell. London, Jan. 28.—The British Navy may soon be given a new and "un-surpassed" weapon in a large calibre shell which will pierce the heaviest armour without shattering, said Sir Robert Hadfield, chairman and managing director of Hadfield's Limited, steel manufacturers recently. He indicated that possession of such a shell during the great war would have been of inestimable value to the British fleet.

"Soldier and Sailor, Too." Field-Marshal Sir Evelyn Wood, who was born at the Vicarage, Cressing, a village near Braintree, in Essex, on February 9, 1838, has the distinction of having seen active service not only in the Army, but also in the Navy. He began his career as a midshipman in H.M.S. Queen, of 116 guns, under his uncle, Captain Frederick Michell, in 1852. About that time Europe had begun to drift into the complications leading to the Crimean War, and in September, 1854, the landing in the Crimea was effected. After the battle of the Alma and the occupation of Balaklava, it was decided to employ a Naval Brigade ashore, under Captain Peel, R.N., who did splendid work, not only in the Crimea but later through the mutiny in India, where he died, and Midshipman Wood had the great good fortune, as he reckoned, to be selected. With it, he went through the hardships and perils of the trenches in that severe winter, and later he was attached to Peel as A.D.C. He also took part in the first unsuccessful attack on the Redan (June 18, 1855), and was wounded in the arm, a bone being splintered by grape-shot. Subsequently the wound gave him much trouble, but he was eager to get to the front again and, moreover, had decided to change his profession for the Army. The fact that he had been mentioned in Lord Raglan's dispatch as having particularly distinguished himself at the assault on the Redan, facilitated matters, and he was gazetted to the 18th Light Dragoons, then in the Crimea. Later, he joined the regiment there, but hostilities were ended, and it was not until he went to India that he really began his great career as a soldier, which ended in his being awarded the baton of Field Marshal.

Sent Up for Trial. Sydney, Jan. 28.—Mike Koval and Mrs. Alice Marnell will stand trial for the murder of James Marnell at the February session of criminal Supreme Court. The two accused were committed for trial by Magistrate Alex. Campbell this morning. No evidence was taken in the charge against Mrs. Marnell, the evidence submitted in the case against Koval being accepted by the court as sufficient for her committal to trial. Both Koval and Mrs. Marnell had nothing to say in their own defence. The concluding session of the preliminary hearing was held in the county council chambers and attracted a large crowd of spectators, who hung round the doors and corridors long before the hearing opened, eager to view the court proceedings or catch a glimpse of the two prisoners.

New French Trawler. The following interesting item taken from a late issue of the Canadian Fisherman:—"The large French trawler 'Simon Duhamel' was launched recently from the yard of Hall, Russell and Co., Aberdeen, Scotland, for Fecamp owners. The trawler is 170 feet between perpendiculars with accommodation for 40 hands. The 'Simon Duhamel' is one of the largest trawlers afloat and is designed for fishing off the Newfoundland coast."
