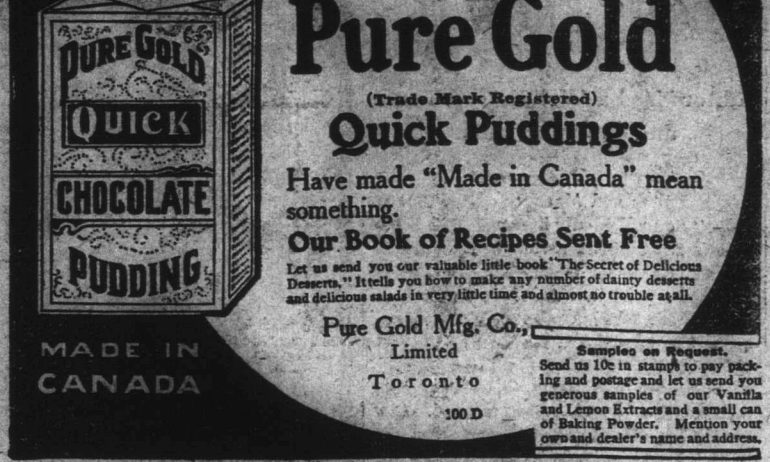

Upon such security it has already made the bond deal, and has worked the Alberta government for the most wonderful railway proposition since the beginning of the present era.

Never on earth did a discounted note for such an amount go so far. It was stretched already out of all sort of recognition. Then when the first laugh had just about died down, some direct or sudden suggests that they extend the note still further and build a road down to Calgary with it. Cannot you see the humor of the situation now? And while we are all in the merry mood, some one up and suggests that they announce that all work on the road be discontinued.
